Here is what we would like to do:

- invite those who have not yet returned to “active service” to do so now
- ask for new volunteers in all of the above ministries
- let us know that you would like to help by calling the Office before June 19th
- join us for a series of informational gatherings the week of June 26
- be ready to start as soon as possible or once school starts up again in September

The only ministry that has an “age requirement” is that those wishing to be *Altar Servers* should be at least entering the 5th Grade in September but there is no “you are too old” limit. (*We could even start an “Over the Hill” group of Adults trained for certain events or Masses!*) The whole idea is that we want to get away from the notion that tells us “*but that's not the way we used to do things.*” One other “requirement” is that *Volunteers for Lutheran Care* would have to be available on Wednesday afternoons from about 1:30PM to 3:00PM. Please pray over your decision and give us a call as soon as you can. You are really needed.

Since writing the above for last week's bulletin, I realized that there were several other ministries that could use your help, too, so please consider volunteering:


- to write the petitions for the Prayer of the Faithful*

SOMETHING TO THINK ABOUT...

“Jesus said to his disciples: ‘I have much more to tell you, but you cannot bear it now. But when he comes, the Spirit of truth, he will guide you to all truth. He will speak not on his own, but he will speak what he hears, and will declare to you the things that are coming.’”

We use our telephones to get directions. GPS is an essential item for so many. They provide security and ease to allow us to function. Each requires that we provide input. Did you ever observe a Seeing Eye dog? Arriving at a corner, he pauses and waits until a light changes, or traffic stops. His disabled person shows total dependence and moves forward, as he is led.

Jesus reminds us of the role of the Holy Spirit, whose coming we celebrated last week. That Spirit is to guide us, but requires that we pause, listen patiently, and then follow His prompts. Paul tells us that we are, ‘led by the Spirit...’ Do you pause and listen? Try it.

A LOOK AHEAD: READINGS FOR JUNE 19, 2022

First Reading: Genesis 14:18-20

Melchizedek, a priest of God, prayed that Abram would be blessed by God. He also praised God for delivering Abram's foes into his hands.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 11:23-26

Paul describes Jesus' actions during the last supper. Jesus broke bread and said it was his body given for us, asking that we do the same in remembrance of him. He then passed the cup and called it his blood. Jesus then asked us to break bread in this manner to remember his death until he returns.

Gospel: Luke 9:11b-17

Jesus spoke to a large crowd when his disciples asked that he dismiss the people to give them a chance to find food and lodging. Jesus asked the disciples to give the crowd something to eat, but they had only five loaves of bread and two fish. Jesus then blessed and distributed the food, which fed about 5,000 people. Twelve baskets were then collected from what was left over.
