

## Gospel Meditation For Your Day

“We may walk many roads when we search for God, and He leads us all the while. The men we honor today were not Jews. The Messiah wasn’t coming for *them*, not in the minds of Jesus’ contemporaries. These men were astrologers. They were adept at reading portents in the sky, a practice condemned in the Mosaic covenant. Still, to the best of their knowledge and awareness, they were seeking the truth. This truth led them to journey from their own homeland to honor a king they’d never met, one they couldn’t be sure truly existed. “*We saw his star at its rising and have come to do him homage.*” Who do you know seeks God so tenaciously?

“Magi from the east arrived in Jerusalem,” the Gospel tells us. Who are the seekers in your own life? Maybe it’s your cautiously curious co-worker, the neighbor who unexpectedly found peace on a yoga retreat, or your desperately angry child who has chosen, for now, to go their own way. Perhaps they’re not overtly headed for Jesus now, not yet. But they may well be seekers of truth in ways we didn’t expect. Our invitation is to listen, inquire, and give directions when appropriate.

The magi and modern-day seekers can inspire us as well. When is the last time you sought God’s truth so tenaciously?

As believers, it can perhaps be easy to become desensitized to the Christmas season and to the miraculous reality we recently celebrated. Mass may have been lovely, but so was the succulent roast beef, the crisp smell of evergreen, and the warm glow of family. Consider asking yourself, “God, do I know you as well as I should? Would I journey as far as the magi to meet You, if I could? Do I journey to meet You daily in prayer? What do those answers say about me, and about our relationship?” Perhaps we, like the magi, can once again be “overjoyed” at seeing the Light of the World. ©LPI





## Our Parish, Our Future...

**FOCUS: "Stewardship; Time & Talent - Part 2"**



### Talents Are Gifts Freely Given To Each of Us by God

Talents are explained in the Bible in Matthew 25. This parable tells us that we are all given certain talents, or gifts. A unique set of abilities which God expects us to use: "...each according to his ability". When properly applied, talents multiply and grow. Their effect is felt whenever we exercise them. Take the gift of a singing voice. When shared, it can bring joy and happiness to all who hear it. But like a singing voice, an unused talent will deteriorate and eventually disappear. Only the raw memory of the original gift will remain; a sad echo reminding us of what could have been.

As in the parable, God has blessed each of us and we know in our hearts what those gifts are. What is keeping us from sharing those gifts? Is it fear, perhaps that if we share them, we will lose them? Or fear that someone might be critical of our offering? Jesus' disciples are urged to use their abilities and gifts to serve God—without reservation and without fear of taking risks.

Like in the parable, He will ask for an accounting, and reward those who shared the talents He gave. How could you share your talents with the rest of us? What good can you make come from that which God has freely given only to you?

*"His master said to him, 'Well done, good and faithful servant. You have been faithful over a little; I will set you over much. Enter into the joy of your master.'* **Matthew 25:21**

**ENFOQUE: "Mayordomía, Tiempo, Talento - Parte 2"**

### Los Talentos Son Regalos Divinos Dados A Nosotros Por Dios

Estos talentos se explican en la Biblia en Mateo 25. Esta parábola nos dice que todos hemos sido dados ciertos talentos. Unas habilidades únicas cuales Dios cuenta con nosotros para que las usemos: "...cada persona de acuerdo a sus habilidades." Cuando debidamente se aplican, los talentos se multiplican y crecen. El efecto se siente donde quiera que se hagan. Por ejemplo, miren el regalo divino de una bella voz al cantar. Cuando esta voz se comparte, nos da alegría a todos cuando la escuchamos. Como esta voz, si un talento no se usa se deteriorará y eventualmente desaparecerá, sólo una triste sombra quedará de lo que pudo ser.

Como esta parábola, Dios nos ha bendecido a cada uno de nosotros y sabemos en nuestros corazones cuáles son estos regalos. ¿Qué nos está parando de compartir estos regalos? ¿Es miedo?, Tal vez si los compartimos pensamos que los perderíamos. ¿O es miedo a que alguien nos critique el regalo que ofrecemos? Los discípulos de Jesús nos urgen a que usemos nuestras habilidades y regalos divinos para servir a Dios—sin ninguna reservación y sin ningún miedo de tomar riesgos.

Así como en la parábola, Él nos preguntará por lo que hemos hecho y nos dará una recompensa a los que compartimos los talentos que Dios nos dio. ¿Cómo usted puede compartir sus talentos con el resto del mundo? ¿Qué bien puede hacer de lo que Dios libremente le ha dado a usted solamente?

*"Su señor le dijo, 'Bien, buen siervo y fiel; sobre poco has sido fiel, sobre mucho te pondré: entra en el gozo de tu señor.'* **Mateo 25:21**



## St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Confirmation



(August 28, 1774– January 4, 1821)

**M**other Seton is one of the keystones of the American Catholic Church. She founded the first American religious community for women, the Sisters of Charity. She opened the first American parish school and established the first American Catholic orphanage. All this she did in the span of 46 years while raising her five children.

Elizabeth Ann Bayley Seton was born on August 28, 1774, just two years before the American Declaration of Independence. The early deaths of her mother in 1777 and her baby sister in 1778 gave Elizabeth a feel for eternity and the temporariness of the pilgrim life on earth. Far from being brooding and sullen, she faced each new “holocaust,” as she put it, with hopeful cheerfulness.

At 19, Elizabeth married a handsome, wealthy businessman, William Magee Seton. But by age 30, Elizabeth was widowed and penniless, with five small children to support.

While in Italy with her dying husband, Elizabeth witnessed Catholicity in action through family friends. Three basic points led her to become a Catholic: belief in the Real Presence, devotion to the Blessed Mother and conviction that the Catholic Church led back to the apostles and to Christ.

She suffered great trials of sickness, misunderstanding, the death of loved ones, and the heartache of a wayward son. She died January 4, 1821, and became the first American-born citizen to be beatified (1963) and then canonized (1975).




*Eucharistic Miracles: The Real Presence of Christ*

### BUENOS AIRES, ARGENTINA - 1996

A consecrated host began bleeding. After a comprehensive study on the Eucharist, it was found that the bleeding tissue was part of a heart, the myocardium, the left ventricle, the muscle that gives life to the whole heart and body. The Archbishop who commissioned the research was none other than the now Pope Francis!

### CHIRATTAKONAM, INDIA - MAY, 2001

During a Novena to St. Jude Thaddeus, the priest exposed the Holy Eucharist in a monstrance. After a few moments three dots appeared. Later, a face crowned with a crown of thorns developed. The Eucharist remains in the Church to this day, and is adored by the faithful.

### BETANIA, VENEZUELA - DECEMBER, 1991

A bleeding host continues to produce fresh blood. The host has been analyzed by 500 commissions of the World Health Organization. The studies showed that the blood came from inside the host, is AB positive, and from a living heart. The miraculous host can be viewed year-round.

### SOKOLKA, POLAND - OCTOBER, 2008

What seemed to be clotted blood appeared on a consecrated host. Using advanced equipment, two scientists observed that it was not clotted blood, but cardiac tissue, which was joined to the consecrated host in an inseparable manner. There is no scientific explanation for this. Both scientists independently reached the same conclusion, the sample examined was human cardiac muscle tissue and it was still alive.
