Dear Brothers and Sisters In Christ,





Gospel Meditation For Your Day

Using the best seeds doesn't always guarantee the best plants. An older Italian gentleman straight from Italy gave me these amazing tomato seeds that he claimed produced the best tomatoes ever grown. Without doubt, the fruit he shared with me was a testament to that fact. These tomatoes were amazing! I couldn't wait until the next growing season to plant these seeds and harvest my own tomatoes. The whole experiment ended up a failure. I did everything the gentleman said, but my fruit didn't even come close. What happened? At first I was perplexed, then some years later the light dawned. The problem wasn't the seeds, it was the soil!

You cannot sow seeds in any old place and in a haphazard way and expect them to be at their best. It doesn't work that way. Planting the seeds is the easiest part. Preparing the soil is the challenge. Tilling, mulching, enriching, and building up the nutrients are all required for good fruit. Then after the seeds are planted, more care is required in order to maintain that healthy, nutrient rich environment for those seeds to sprout, grow, and flourish. God happily sows the seeds of his Word. What do we do with them?

If we expect to be a passive bystander and have good fruit magically grow, we are mistaken. Bearing the good fruit of God's Word requires preparation and work. We have to cultivate the soil of our lives so that those seeds can find a proper home. This one thing alone takes a great deal of patience, time, and effort. What kind of preparation have we put into our lives so that we can be a recipient of God's seed? It takes a great deal of soul-searching and ego-checking to properly prepare. God is the ever faithful and persistent sower. If the seeds do not bear fruit the first time, God will come back time and

time again, giving it another try.

If we have created a suitable bed for sowing, then once the seed is sown, we must properly maintain them. What is our maintenance plan for the seeds of God's Word? We need not only a source for water but a watering schedule. We need to weed, aerate the soil, nurture the young plants, protect them, and provide proper nutrients. What does our spiritual maintenance plan look like? If we have done all things well, imagine what the seeds of God's Word could produce in us! ©LPI

Seminole County Requires Masks



Wear Your Mask To Church, as of 7/1/20

Seminole County officials have enacted a mask mandate that requires people to wear masks while in public to slow the spread of the coronavirus.

The order says people working, living, visiting or doing

business in Seminole County will be required to **wear a face covering consistent with CDC guidelines while at all businesses, places of assembly and other places open to the public.**

When in a place of assembly, business or other places open to the public in Seminole County, individuals are required to **maintain social distancing.** Members of the same household do not have to keep six (6) feet of distance between one another.

If social distancing can be accomplished by maintaining at least six (6) feet distance between individuals at an outdoor business, place of assembly, or public place in Seminole County, a mask is not required. If individuals of different households are within six (6) feet of each other, masks must be worn.

Seminole County Medical Director Dr. Todd Husty said while cases are on the rise, the hospitals are not overwhelmed and they want to make sure it stays that way by taking action.

Exemptions

Persons under the age of 2 years; • Persons for whom a Face Covering would cause impairment due to an existing health condition or disability; • Persons working in a business or profession who are not interacting with the public and who are able to maintain social distancing from co-workers; • Persons working in, or patrons of, a business or profession where use of a Face Covering would prevent them from performing the duties or receiving the services of the business or profession; • Persons exercising, while maintaining social distancing; • Persons eating or drinking; • Public safety, fire, and other life safety and health care personnel, as their personal protective equipment requirements will be governed by their respective agencies; and • Persons communicating with someone who is hearing-impaired and must see the mouth of someone wearing a Face Covering in order to communicate





St. Kateri Tekakwitha



(1656 - April 17, 1680)

The blood of martyrs is the seed of saints. Nine years after the Jesuits Isaac Jogues and Jean de Lelande were tomahawked by Iroquois warriors, a baby girl was born near the place of their martyrdom, Auriesville, New York.

Her mother was a Christian Algonquin, taken captive by the Iroquois and given as wife to the chief of the Mohawk clan, the boldest and fiercest of the Five Nations. When she was four, Tekakwitha lost her parents and little brother in a smallpox epidemic that left her disfigured and half blind. She was adopted by an uncle, who succeeded her father as chief. He hated the coming of the Blackrobes—Jesuit missionaries—but could do nothing to them because a peace treaty with the French required their presence in villages with Christian captives. She was moved by the words of three Blackrobes who lodged with her uncle, but fear of him kept her from seeking instruction. Tekakwitha refused to marry a Mohawk brave, and at 19 finally got the courage to take the step of converting. She was baptized with the name Kateri—Catherine—on Easter Sunday.

Now she would be treated as a slave. Because she would not work on Sunday, Kateri received no food that day. Her life in grace grew rapidly. She told a missionary that she often meditated on the great dignity of being baptized. She was powerfully moved by God's love for human beings and saw the dignity of each of her people.

She was always in danger, for her conversion and holy life created great opposition. On the advice of a priest, Kateri stole away one night and began a 200-mile walking journey to a Christian Indian village at Sault St. Louis, near Montreal.

For three years she grew in holiness under the direction of a priest and an older Iroquois woman, giving herself totally to God in long hours of prayer, in charity, and in strenuous penance. At 23, Kateri took a vow of virginity, an unprecedented act for an Indian woman whose future depended on being married. She found a place in the woods where she could pray an hour a day—and was accused of meeting a man there!

Her dedication to virginity was instinctive: Kateri did not know about religious life for women until she visited Montreal. Inspired by this, she and two friends wanted to start a community, but the local priest dissuaded her. She humbly accepted an "ordinary" life. She practiced extremely severe fasting as penance for the conversion of her nation. Kateri Tekakwitha died the afternoon before Holy Thursday. Witnesses said that her emaciated face changed color and became like that of a healthy child. The lines of suffering, even the pockmarks, disappeared and the touch of a smile came upon her lips. She was beatified in 1980 and canonized in 2012.

Faith Formation Updates



SACRAMENT PREPARATION

Sacraments are outward signs of God's grace given to us through Jesus Christ.

SACRAMENT PREPARATION & READINESS

At least ONE year of formal Faith Formation (whether in a parish program or Catholic School) is expected prior to introducing sacraments. Please be aware that while children are enrolled in a parish program (or Catholic School) immediate preparation for the Sacraments of Reconciliation, First Eucharist (Communion) and Confirmation are separate and in addition to classes. It should not be assumed that program enrollment means sacrament preparation is being conducted within individual classes. IMMEDIATE SACRAMENT PREPARATION IS NOT CONDUCTED IN FAITH FORMATION but rather is given to an entire program on its own. Because parents are the primary catechist they have the right and responsibility to prepare their child(ren) to receive and celebrate the sacraments.



SPECIAL NOTE:

Unbaptized children over the age of seven would be welcomed into the Catholic Church through the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (Children) where the Sacraments of Baptism, First Eucharist and Confirmation are celebrated during the Easter Vigil Mass. 
