

Dear Brothers and Sisters In Christ,

Compassion and Forgiveness=LOVE

Last week we read a surprising message that demands love in the midst of hardship and sacrifice. This moral duty can be traced back to the Old Testament prompting the Prophet Ezekiel to watch, warn, and win Israel over sin and death. We are called to love, because God is Love, and we should owe nothing but love itself. Even gentiles and non-believers ought to be treated with love.


How generous can we be in forgiving people? Jesus was quick enough to answer Peter that there is no end in forgiveness in God's Kingdom. Peter knew that Jesus will never ever change His mind in restoring the kingdom through the forgiveness of sin. This instruction of Jesus to Peter will lead the church to its renewal.

The fraternal correction we heard last week, and the parable of the unforgiving debtor this weekend stresses the foundation of love. Not seven times, and not treating a gentile in judgment and condemnation, but in love for our neighbor.

The inability to match the master's forgiveness, and the hardness of heart from last week's gospel, is no different from the temptations that we and the children are challenged with today. Indifference, Hatred, Anger, Bitterness, and Prejudice put together is no match for Compassion and Forgiveness, that love can bring.

Finally, a person who does not forgive may never have experienced the forgiveness of God. Let us open ourselves to God who is Kind and Merciful. Let us yearn for the glory that can be ours, ready to open up and serve the Lord in our own humble way. Teach the children to love, and they will live in kindness

La incapacidad de igualar el perdón del maestro, y la dureza de corazón en el Evangelio de la semana pasada, no son diferentes de las tentaciones que nos desafían hoy en día a nosotros y los niños. La indiferencia, el odio, la ira, la amargura y los prejuicios todos juntos no igualan la Compasión y el Perdón que el amor puede traer.

Finalmente, una persona que no perdona quizás nunca conocerá el perdón de Dios. Permitamos abrirnos a Dios, quien es Bueno y Misericordioso. Anhelemos la gloria que puede ser nuestra, listos para abrirnos y servir al Señor en forma humilde. Enseñemos a los niños a amar, y vivirán en bondad.

Gospel Meditation For Your Day

“**W**hat right do we have to limit the amount and degree of forgiveness we show to others when we are so desperately in need of it ourselves? In not wanting someone who hurt us to downplay or forget the gravity of their wrong, we cling to anger, resentment, and wrath as a way of maintaining control. It is a way to acknowledge and express our deep hurt. We fail to realize that in doing so we hold ourselves hostage to these destructive feelings and actually become mired in the bondage of sin. All we gain is further alienation from ourselves, others, and especially God. We are no longer free but tethered to all of this unresolved negativity. Don't we really want to let it go? The fact is that we need to.

A good self-reflective posture will quickly show us that when the shoe is on the other foot and we are the ones in need of forgiveness, we desire it above anything else. This is especially true with our relationship with God. It is hypocritical to want one thing for ourselves and something else for another. Yet, many act in precisely this way.

Perhaps we think that in offering forgiveness, even for the most grievous of wrongs, somehow excuses the person of their wrong and makes it almost acceptable. This is what makes revenge, retaliation, and punishment so attractive. We see forgiveness as being an eraser that easily wipes away the offense without consequence. Or, we may believe that in offering forgiveness I must somehow forget the wrong and open myself as a victim of even greater possible hurts in the future. In fact, forgiving my sister or brother of their wrongful actions or attitudes involves none of this. It does not erase anything or position me vulnerably as a doormat to be walked on.

Forgiveness is an act of freedom that restores honest dialogue, shares true, and heartfelt feelings and acknowledges the consequences of an action. It admits that the wrong has caused a hurt that must be healed and squarely positions responsibility on the offender. The act of forgiveness recognizes our sinfulness and brokenness. It also admits that the most saintly among us is capable of doing very grave and deep harm to another person. It sees that we all can be

victims of our passions and works in progress that deserve unlimited chances to get it right. With forgiveness, I release myself from the bonds of negativity and pursue a path of restoration, wholeness, and healing. I do not forget the wrong nor do I dismiss it. Sometimes, we have to stay far away from the one who hurt us. But we can still heal internally and be free.

For the one who wants to be forgiven and the one who needs offer forgiveness, the journey can be an adventure in learning what brought us to this place and what is needed to move forward. This is exactly how God treats us. Why would we not want to do the same for others? ©LPi


Helping Others Weather Life's Storms

In late August, the news was filled with the stories of people and places devastated by Cat 4 Hurricane Laura that struck southwestern Louisiana. One of the areas most affected was the community of Lake Charles, and in particular the parish of *Immaculate Heart of Mary*. The people of Lake Charles were simultaneously impacted by a fire at a chemical plant that spewed caustic smoke, making the air dangerous to breathe. Subsequently, hundreds of thousands were left without either power or water, and many lost their homes and all they owned. Only recently has power begun to be restored.

This is where All Souls Parish comes into the picture. The ministries of St. Vincent de Paul, the Knights of Columbus and the CCW (Council of Catholic Women), teamed up to provide much needed support to the people of Immaculate Heart of Mary Parish. Donations of items such as gift cards, paper products, flashlights, batteries, etc. were collected for an initial run to deliver them directly to the Louisiana parish, but more will be needed in the coming days.

These are the times in which we are called to help our brothers and sisters in Christ, and All Souls is responding to the call. *“We are so humbly grateful to the parishioners of this parish who give so lovingly. We are in awe, and feel blessed by their generosity.”*




All Souls 2020 Festival Survey Responses

All Souls Catholic School Keeping Everyone Safe and Healthy!

Classes are back in session and all eyes are on what our schools are doing to help keep students and teachers healthy. All Souls School is at the forefront of that effort, implementing safeguards that extend above and beyond the new norm. Here are a few examples... Before students come on campus, their **temperatures are taken while still in the car drop-off line**. Each day starts with morning prayer and the pledge of allegiance led by the principal, all of which is **livestreamed** to each classroom. Students sit behind clear plastic **"sneeze-guards"**, while also wearing **facemasks**, and when they're in small groups, they wear **face shields**. All this "masking" might make you wonder if the kids can take it all day? All Souls has that covered too (pardon the pun). Children are given regular **"de-masking breaks"** outdoors, where they can be **socially distanced** while running or stretching. Back in the classroom, All Souls offers a "one teacher/one classroom" approach to **virtual instruction**. This means that kids attending class from home can interact with those kids that are in-classroom, and vice versa. This innovative development allows all the kids to remain connected to each other and their teacher, helping to bridge the gap caused by social isolation. Lastly, every Wednesday, the entire school attends Mass virtually as it is livestreamed from the church. All Souls keeps the faith and what's most important to us all firmly in sight every day!

St. John Chrysostom



(c. 349 - September 14, 407)

The ambiguity and intrigue surrounding John, the great preacher (his name means "golden-mouthed") from Antioch, are characteristic of the life of any great man

in a capital city. Brought to Constantinople after a dozen years of priestly service in Syria, John found himself the reluctant victim of an imperial ruse to make him bishop in the greatest city of the empire. Ascetic, unimposing but dignified, and troubled by stomach ailments from his desert days as a monk, John became a bishop under the cloud of imperial politics.

If his body was weak, his tongue was powerful. The content of his sermons, his exegesis of Scripture, were never without a point. Sometimes the point stung the high and mighty. Some sermons lasted up to two hours.

His lifestyle at the imperial court was not appreciated by many courtiers. He offered a modest table to episcopal sycophants hanging around for imperial and ecclesiastical favors. John deplored the court protocol that accorded him precedence before the highest state officials. He would not be a kept man.

His zeal led him to decisive action. Bishops who bribed their way into office were deposed. Many of his sermons called for concrete steps to share wealth with the poor. The rich did not appreciate hearing from John that private property existed because of Adam's fall from grace any more than married men liked to hear that they were bound to marital fidelity just as much as their wives were. When it came to justice and charity, John acknowledged no double standards.

Aloof, energetic, outspoken, especially when he became excited in the pulpit, John was a sure target for criticism and personal trouble. He was accused of gorging himself secretly on rich wines and fine foods. His faithfulness as spiritual director to the rich widow, Olympia, provoked much gossip attempting to prove him a hypocrite where wealth and chastity were concerned. His actions taken against unworthy bishops in Asia Minor were viewed by other ecclesiastics as a greedy, uncanonical extension of his authority.

Theophilus, archbishop of Alexandria, and Empress Eudoxia were determined to discredit John. Theophilus feared the growth in importance of the Bishop of Constantinople and took occasion to charge John with fostering heresy. Theophilus and other angered bishops were supported by Eudoxia. The empress resented his sermons contrasting gospel values with the excesses of imperial court life. Whether intended or not, sermons mentioning the lurid Jezebel and impious Herodias were associated with the empress, who finally did manage to have John exiled. He died in exile in 407.


