

Dear Brothers and Sisters In Christ,


Matthew 21 inaugurates a series of controversies between Jesus and the authorities of His time. However, there is a general theme that God requires in this Gospel story and Jesus prefers, “deeds rather than empty words.”

This story of the parable of the two sons clearly lays out St Matthew’s point of view, that the rejection of the teachings of Jesus by the Pharisees and Sadducees is a reality that still exists even now in our present culture. Our behavior, and the gift of freedom, do not always embrace the essence of the Good News of salvation that Jesus is offering. We may have the freedom to choose and to reject, however, lip service or an idle promise is no match to a contrite heart, willing to do the will of God. “Here I am Lord I have come to do your will.”

No matter what our orientation is, we all have the right and obligation to say and do good deeds. By doing so, we can change and renew, the direction of our lives. We all must be accountable to what we have done. During our liturgical services, at our penitential rite, we utter the words that express our sorrow, values and beliefs as we say, I confess to almighty God...”, however, at the end of the Mass we are also challenged to change our hearts. Putting our words into action as we are commissioned to do our ministerial work. “*Go in Peace to Love and Serve the Lord and one another.*”

There may be a trail of broken promises in each one of us. Every married couple understands the increasing difficulty of fulfilling the word “Yes”. However, the test of living our “Creed” (I believe in God) coupled with His Grace should strengthen our resolve to FOLLOW JESUS, through the ups and downs of our day to day living.

Queridos Hermanos y Hermanas en Cristo,



Gospel Meditation For Your Day

“**W**hat prompts you to make the decisions you make? When confronted with a decision, whether one that is more trivial and mundane or one that is more significant and profound, we rely on guidance. That guidance can be the result of impulse and passion or the fruit of the interior voice of conscience. Decisions made on impulse and passion can be misguided and erroneous. Decisions based on conscience, or the moral voice within, will reflect the depth and maturity of our soul work. A more contemplative soul will make more contemplative decisions. A less developed conscience will make decisions based on the individual’s level of development.

Conversion and a change of heart are at the core of Jesus’ message precisely because of this reality. We are works in progress. For the person on fire with the Holy Spirit and centered on God, life reflects an ever-deepening awareness and heightened sense of God’s presence and a greater willingness to do God’s will. What is happening internally is validated by what is witnessed externally. The hypocrite is the one who says yes when they really mean no. From the start, they had no desire to do the virtuous act but wanted to outwardly appear as if they did.

Where are you on the road of integrity? Honesty is all that is required. God is good with that. It is okay to struggle with our decisions and wrestle with ourselves. Consciences on the path to maturity and greater depth are not always going to know what action is immediately best. We may, at first, say no to what we know is right and, after prayerful reflection and

thought, come around doing it. Conversion happens when our no changes to yes, regardless of how sinful or out of sync we may be at the time. God is anxious to welcome us to Himself. But we cannot embrace Him unless we want to. Learning to orient our gift of free will to what is of divine origin, right, and best is a discipline we must always tweak and perfect. ©LPi



Why We Dedicate The Month of October to The Holy Rosary



It all started in 1571, when the Catholic League entered into battle against the Ottoman Empire to defend Europe from invasion by the Ottoman Turks. The Turks were on a warpath to overthrow all of Europe, killing millions of people and forcing Islamic conversion on survivors. They had conquered the Middle East and Mediterranean islands of Cyprus and Crete. Italy was next.

As the impending battle loomed, Pope Pius V called on various religious communities throughout Europe to join him in praying the Rosary, including public recitations, to defeat the Islamic threat. **Heading into battle, every man in the Catholic League's forces carried a Rosary.** Their fleet was vastly outnumbered at half the size of that of the Turks.

Miraculously, the Catholic League returned victorious after a daylong battle known as the **Battle of Lepanto** that took place off the coast of Greece. In thanksgiving for Mary's intercession and protection, Pope Pius V declared the day — **October 7** — as a **Feast Day for Our Lady of the Rosary**. To celebrate, a Rosary procession was held in Saint Peter's Square. After the feast day was established, **the entire month of October was dedicated to the rosary in 1884 by Pope Leo XIII.**

Although the commitment to the rosary was formalized in 1571, it was an established prayer long before then. The Rosary was first given to **Saint Dominic** by the Virgin Mary during an apparition in 1214 in Prouilhe of southern France. She presented it as a source of strength and grace to persevere in his efforts to convert Albigensian heretics. Saint Dominic went on to found the Order of Preachers, or the **Dominicans**.



The Rosary is Christocentric setting forth the entire life of Jesus Christ, the passion, death, resurrection and glory. Of course, the Rosary honors and contemplates Mary too, and rightly so, for the same reason that the Liturgical Year does likewise: *Because of the mission she received from God, her life is most closely linked with the mysteries of Jesus Christ, and there is no one who has followed in the footsteps of the Incarnate Word more closely and with more merit than Holy Mother Mary.*

A Peek At The High-Tech Classroom Of This Fall


Have you wondered what it's like in the technology enabled classrooms of this Fall, where children can attend in-person or online? Many parents are finding the classroom has become a part of their family room or office room, as their children do school lessons from home. Some children are simply given their assignments once a day, and then left to carry them out as best they can. Other children are lucky enough to attend a school such as All Souls, where they are personally attended to, whether in the classroom or online.

All Souls is using advanced technology to immerse children in their classroom experiences. The new "Swivel" cameras in the classrooms automatically follow teachers as they move about the classroom, allowing children online to feel a part of the activities. In turn, the children at home can speak with and interact with the teacher and/or the other children in the classroom.

Assignments are viewable by all through the means of a large, interactive screen that has taken the place of the chalkboard of old. These screens function just like touch-screen computers, bringing all classroom resources to a child's fingertips. Children and teachers alike, can select assignments, access class subjects, open audio books, launch multiple reference resources, and even connect with other classrooms in the school. And, to top it off... it's full of colorfully fun graphics and looks really cool!

But, at heart, All Souls is about the people and children, not just technology. It's the personal attention and care that the children receive that matters the most. Everyone, from the "Resource Teachers", Guidance Counselor, Office Staff and Principal, to the many dedicated teachers, are all focused on one thing... helping ALL Souls children to successfully navigate recent changes, while providing them with an excellent education. life of the man from a small farm in Gascony, France, who had become a priest with little more ambition than to have a comfortable life.

The Countess de Gondi—whose servant he had helped—persuaded her husband to endow and support a group of able and zealous missionaries who would work among poor tenant farmers and country people in general. Vincent was too humble to accept leadership at first, but after working for some time in Paris among imprisoned galley slaves, he returned to be the leader of what is now known as the Congregation of the Mission, or the Vincentians. These priests, with vows of poverty, chastity, obedience, and stability, were to devote themselves entirely to the people in smaller towns and villages.

Later, Vincent established confraternities of charity for the spiritual and physical relief of the poor and sick of each parish. From these, with the help of Saint Louise de Marillac, came the Daughters of Charity, “whose convent is the sickroom, whose chapel is the parish church, whose cloister is the streets of the city.” He organized the rich women of Paris to collect funds for his missionary projects, founded several hospitals, collected relief funds for the victims of war, and ransomed over 1,200 galley slaves from North Africa. He was zealous in conducting retreats for clergy at a time when there was great laxity, abuse, and ignorance among them. He was a pioneer in clerical training and was instrumental in establishing seminaries.

Most remarkably, Vincent was by temperament a very irascible person—even his friends admitted it. He said that except for the grace of God he would have been “hard and repulsive, rough and cross.” But he became a tender and affectionate man, very sensitive to the needs of others.

Pope Leo XIII made him the patron of all charitable societies. Outstanding among these, of course, is the Society of St. Vincent de Paul, founded in 1833 by his admirer Blessed Frédéric Ozanam.


