

However, the truthful response of Jesus to His adversaries directs more of His trust and confidence with the Lord than anything else. We render to God what belongs to God or vice versa.

Politics and Religion may have their differences; however, these two elements of society will always be part of our day to day existence. Just as how Literature, Art, Economics, Law, and Science evolves around our existence. The Sovereignty of the Lord embraces Love for all mankind and its creation. Each has its role in the harmony and in the melody of Faith, Hope, and Service to both God and Man.



Gospel Meditation For Your Day

“Nobody enjoys paying taxes. Despite our displeasure in being forced to do so, we also realize that the monies generated from taxes allows governments to provide essential services for its people. Corruption really gets our goat, however. When we witness malfeasance, overspending, irresponsibility, and dishonesty in governmental spending, the grave injustices make an already unpleasant and arduous task even more difficult. The inappropriate distribution and use of hard-earned monies can leave a person quite angry and disconnected. It’s bad enough the government wants something from me, now God does, too?

God is not concerned necessarily with our money, although its proper use does factor into our faith life. As the payment of secular taxes speaks of our allegiance to the government, our return to God speaks of our allegiance to God. All of creation, even the entire universe, is fashioned in the image and likeness of God. What speaks to God and has meaning and relevance to him? All of creation and indeed our very selves! God delights in us and when we present ourselves back to him, he delights even more! As the payment of secular taxes is designed to secure the equitable distribution of goods and services to all people, so is our return of ourselves to God in gratitude meant to advance God’s kingdom here on earth.

When our exclusive and sincere allegiance is given to God, God can use us to set things right and straight again. The wounds of sin distort our relationship and disorder our world. By giving ourselves and all of creation back to God in gratitude, we acknowledge the proper Creator and Author of life for who He is and devote our labors exclusively to God’s king-

dom and the justice, peace, or order God envisions. In giving back to God all that belongs to God, we set the axis of our lives correctly and put our priorities in proper order. All of our relationships, especially with God, our brothers and sisters, and all of creation are perceived more clearly as they really are. 50/50 RAFFLE






All Souls Catholic School Life On Mars!?

St. John Capistrano



(June 24, 1386 - October 23, 1456)

It has been said the Christian saints are the world's greatest optimists. Not blind to the existence and consequences of evil, they base their confidence on

the power of Christ's redemption. The power of conversion through Christ extends not only to sinful people but also to calamitous events.

Imagine being born in the 14th century. One-third of the population and nearly 40 percent of the clergy were wiped out by the bubonic plague. The Western Schism split the Church with two or three claimants to the Holy See at one time. England and France were at war. The city-states of Italy were constantly in conflict. No wonder that gloom dominated the spirit of the culture and the times.

John Capistrano was born in 1386. His education was thorough. His talents and success were great. When he was 26 he was made governor of Perugia. Imprisoned after a battle against the Malatestas, he resolved to change his way of life completely. At the age of 30 he entered the Franciscan novitiate and was ordained a priest four years later.

John's preaching attracted great throngs at a time of religious apathy and confusion. He and 12 Franciscan brethren were received in the countries of central Europe as angels of God. They were instrumental in reviving a dying faith and devotion.

The Franciscan Order itself was in turmoil over the interpretation and observance of the Rule of St. Francis. Through John's tireless efforts and his expertise in law, the heretical Fraticelli were suppressed and the "Spirituals" were freed from interference in their stricter observance.

John of Capistrano helped bring about a brief reunion with the Greek and Armenian Churches.

When the Turks captured Constantinople in 1453, John was commissioned to preach a crusade for the defense of Europe. Gaining little response in Bavaria and Austria, he decided to concentrate his efforts in Hungary. He led the army to Belgrade. Under the great General John Hunyadi, they gained an overwhelming victory, and the siege of Belgrade was lifted. Worn out by his superhuman efforts, Capistrano was an easy prey to an infection after the battle. He died on October 23, 1456.

include children in Grades 1 to 5. This past week children learned that the Catholic Church teaches that God has created each of us unique and special. According to Genesis 1:27 "God created man in his image; in the divine image he created him' male and female he created them." During the Circle of Grace Lesson children were taught that in that goodness, we are meant to respect ourselves and everyone else as persons created and loved by God. It was discussed how we take care of precious people and items such as the Eucharist (as well as each other). Children learned what a pyk is used for. Do you know what this item is used for? It was fun watching children demonstrate their personal circle of grace using hand motions. Children also shared what they allow in their circle of grace as well as what is not allowed in that sacred space. As part of the Tuesday evening sessions, children are assigned **Jesus Training Exercises** at various levels: Jr. Disciple, Disciple and Apostle. All JTEs are designed to enforce what was taught during the session at various faith/skill levels. JTEs are printed off by parents every week to be completed at home then submitted by the specified due date. Upcoming lessons include Liturgy of the Word, Liturgy of the Eucharist and The Saints. A special thank you to all those families who prayerfully discerned enrolling their children in Faith Formation during these challenging times. For those that are not participating, we miss you and hope you will join us.

FAMILY + FAITH

is up and running as a work at your own pace, home study program for anyone with children in 1st through 12th grades. The first of every month YouTube videos and lessons are available online for parents and older children (6th to 12th grades) to learn about various Catholic topics. Then parents work at home with smaller children to complete weekly lessons. All work is submitted by the 28th of every month. There is also a family session available on YouTube that provides conversation prompts for families to share in an engaging faith discussion.
