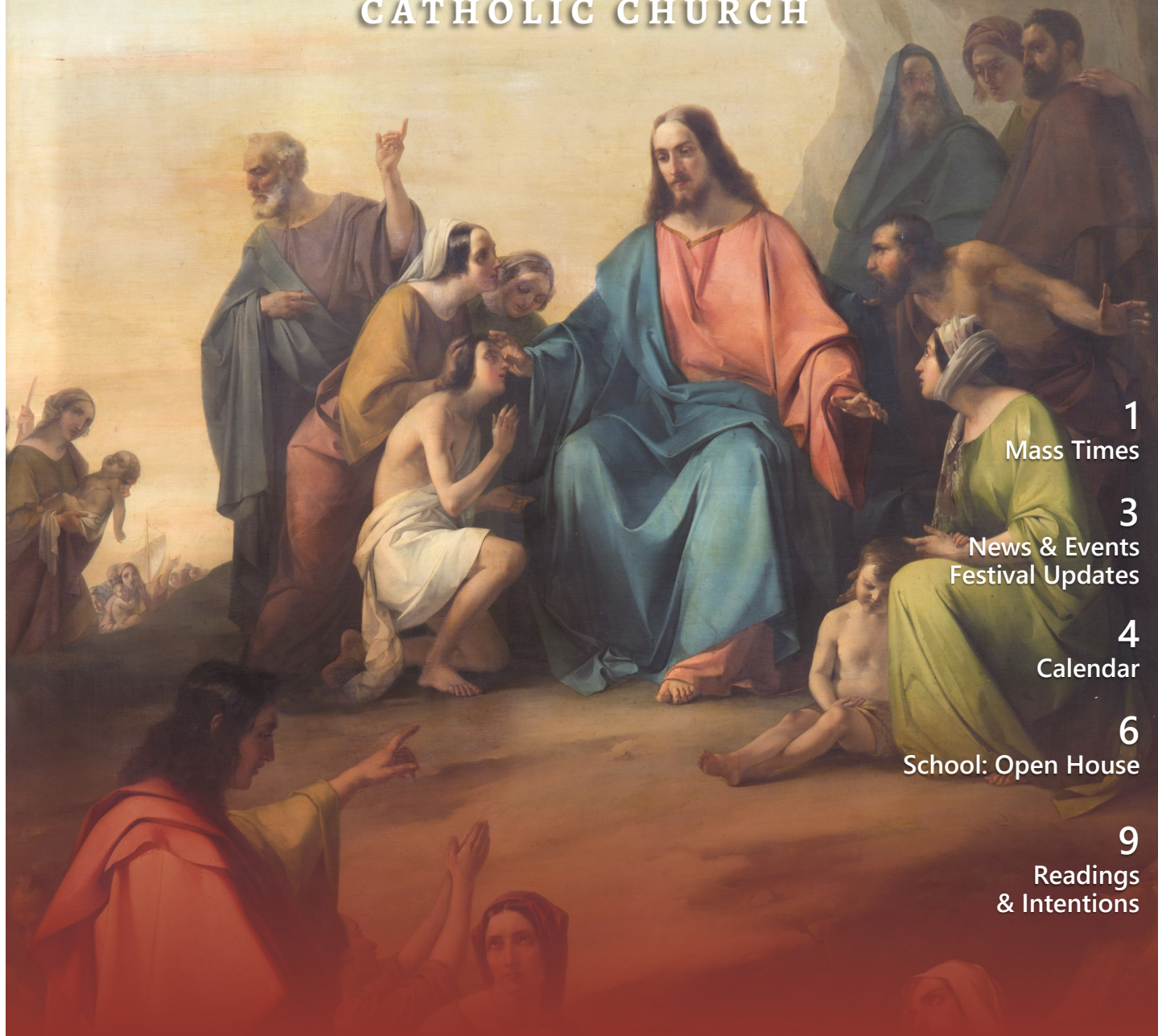

A MESSAGE FROM *Our Pastor*

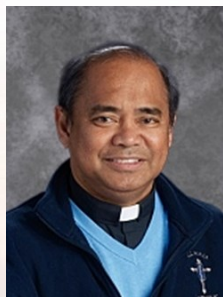

Dear Brothers and Sisters In Christ,

Understanding God's Love by loving our Neighbor.

This short yet enormously powerful message in today's gospel surely sums up the line of questioning the law-ymers of Israel were looking for. What is the greatest of the 613 commandments in the Old Testament Law?

Mt 22:34-40



After laying out the truth about Herodian's malice and hypocrisy, from last week's confrontation on giving back to God what belongs to God, Jesus introduces a teachable moment on what the law and prophets talk about - love of God and neighbor. This is the moment when Jesus reestablishes the powerful teachings on the presence and the power of God, discovered in living out the one true love integrated in all our mind, heart, body, and soul. This teaching summarizes God's total love for us, everyone and everything.

Although much has been written about love, this pattern transcends all emotional, physical, and psychological bearings of it. Like in any form of relationship, which has "high and low" points, this does not give up easily because love is the core value of faith and hope. Love deepens any inner experience of joy and true harmony for everyone, including the least of all in creation. There is a maturity that happens from loving a person, not because it can transform the inner sanctuary of a person, but because it reincarnates an external manifestation into pure goodness and generosity. "Mature love for God and for others has to be measured by what we are giving and not by what we are getting." J. Robinson

Queridos Hermanos y Hermanas en Cristo,

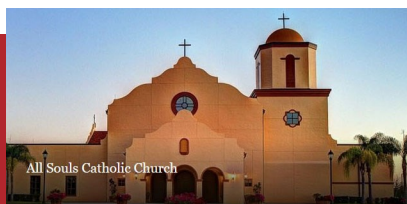

Mateo 22:34-40

Después de exponer la verdad sobre la malicia e hipocresía del herodiano, que surgió en el evangelio de la semana pasada e involucró un enfrentamiento acerca de darle a Dios lo que le pertenece, Jesús presenta un momento de enseñanza sobre los temas que tratan los profetas y la ley – el amor de Dios y del prójimo. Este es el momento en el cual Jesús reestablece estas poderosas enseñanzas acerca de la presencia y el poder de Dios, descubiertos en vivir el único y verdadero amor integrado en nuestra mente, corazón, cuerpo y alma. Esta enseñanza resume el amor de total de Dios por nosotros, todos y todo.

Gospel Meditation For Your Day

"For some reason, it is easier to genuflect in reverence to the presence of Christ in the tabernacle of a church, than to genuflect in reverence to the same presence of Christ in another person's soul. We wrongly believe that God divides himself, placing himself in one place in preference to another. It doesn't work that way. Love of God and love of neighbor are intimately and inseparably connected because the essence and spark of God's very presence is in all creation. God's presence is just as real in the one who is good, as in the one who is bad, and the one who is just, and the one who is unjust.

Our brains get in the way of truly contemplating the awesomeness of this truth. We like to separate things into boxes, the sheep from the goats and the deserving from the undeserving. But, with God there are no distinctions such as this. Our human classifications, subdivisions, and definitions hold no power or have any weight in God's eyes. Sadly, we relate to God and to each other as if they do.

We cannot be deaf to the world's pain. It is not about having, hoarding, accumulating, acquiring, securing, storing, protecting, owning, claiming, or any of the other human terms we use to distinguish mine from yours. We put so much power in these words and that power, even though we may not always realize it, can cause those words and the distinctions they carry to wound and hurt others. We have the whole order of things wrong, but we are so set on preserving this order that we are absolutely afraid to do it any other way. We go through hoops trying to convince ourselves why the perils of the person seeking a new place to call home are not our perils that we turn our back and justify closing our doors. It makes perfect sense to us. Yet, it makes no sense in terms of our faith. It doesn't square with any of the words found in Sa-

cred Scripture or in any time-tested teaching of the church.

We have it all reversed. We know that we do because when Jesus speaks about such things and the words of the Old Testament prophets ring out again, we start to feel uncomfortable and anxious. What we do, directly or by omission, to one of the least of these little ones we do to God. It is quite possible that some of what we are doing personally, economically, politically, globally, and even religiously is doing more harm than good. Let's ponder that a bit. ©LPi

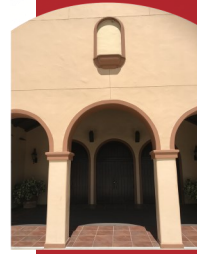
We Serve... SVDP Food Drive—Thank You!!!

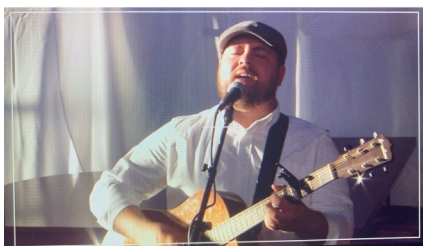

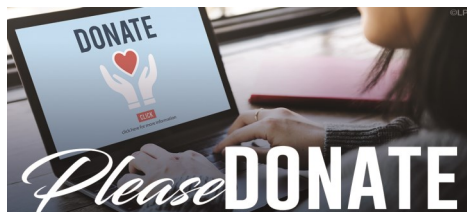

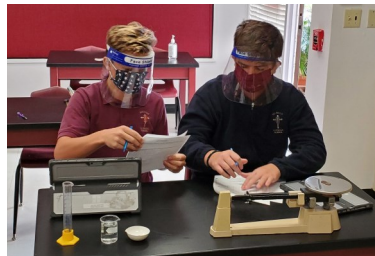

St. Peter of Alcantara



(1499 - October 18, 1562)

Peter was a contemporary of well-known 16th-century Spanish saints, including Ignatius of Loyola and John of the Cross. He served as confessor to Saint Teresa of Avila. Church

reform was a major issue in Peter's day, and he directed most of his energies toward that end. His death came one year before the Council of Trent ended.

Born into a noble family—his father was the governor of Alcantara in Spain—Peter studied law at Salamanca University, and at 16 he joined the so-called Observant Franciscans, also known as the discalced friars. While he practiced many penances, he also demonstrated abilities which were soon recognized. He was named the superior of a new house even before his ordination as a priest, was elected provincial at the age of 39, and he was a very successful preacher. Still, he was not above washing dishes and cutting wood for the friars. He did not seek attention; indeed, he preferred solitude.

Peter's penitential side was evident when it came to food and clothing. It is said that he slept only 90 minutes each night. While others talked about Church reform, Peter's reform began with himself. His patience was so great that a proverb arose: "To bear such an insult one must have the patience of Peter of Alcantara."

In 1554, Peter received permission to form a group of Franciscans who followed the Rule of St. Francis with even greater rigor. These friars were known as Alcantarines. Some of the Spanish friars who came to North and South America in the 16th, 17th, and 18th centuries were members of this group. At the end of the 19th century, the Alcantarines were joined with other Observant friars to form the Order of Friars Minor.

As spiritual director to Saint Teresa, Peter encouraged her in promoting the Carmelite reform. His preaching brought many people to religious life, especially to the Secular Franciscan Order, the friars, and the Poor Clares.

Peter of Alcantara was canonized in 1669. His Liturgical Feast Day is September 22.

FAMILY + FAITH: WHERE SHOULD YOU BE? KEEP ON TRACK!

Parents should have viewed the Parents Session on YouTube by now. If you haven't, set aside about 90 minutes this weekend to view the video and have time for discussion or journaling.

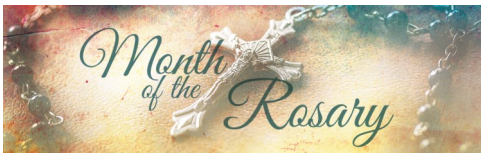


CONFESSIONS AT THE HISTORIC CHAPEL
