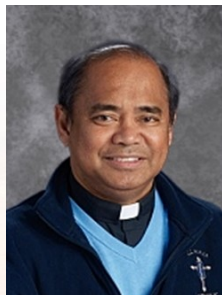
My dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The Ascension marks the conclusion of Christ's earthly mission, but the story of Easter does not end here. As Jesus was taken up into heaven, the apostles continued gazing at the Resurrected Lord, still in confusion and doubt. The angels of the Lord said to them, "Men of Galilee, why are you standing there looking at the sky?" In other words, why are you still daydreaming; you have much work to do before the Master returns!

In our Gospel reading this Sunday, Jesus gives us the **Great Commission**: "Go out into the whole world and proclaim the gospel to every creature. Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved". This is not just a mandate to the apostles, or to the leaders in the Church today, but is a universal and apostolic call to every disciple. We are called to make known the message of salvation to the whole world. Through our prayers and works, joys and sufferings — through the loving unity of the Church and authentic witness of individual Christians — we are all called to proclaim the Gospel of Christ to persons of every background, gender and nationality.

Jesus does not ask us to do this alone. He and the Father, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, will be with us until the end of time. Christ now resides in heaven at the right hand of the Father, together with his angels and saints, but he is also on earth in the Church, his Body, through the power of the Holy Spirit. As the apostles faithfully went forth to preach the Gospel, let us also live out the mission of the Church to evangelize in our daily lives. **How can we share the Good News of Christ to those around us today? What sacrifices can we make to bear witness to the transformative power of Christ in our lives?**

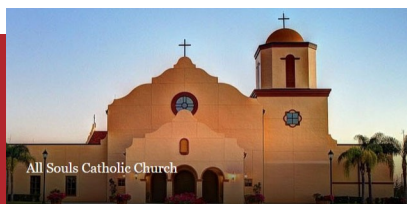
Mis queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo,

La Ascensión marca la conclusión de la misión terrestre de Cristo, pero la historia de Pascua no termina aquí. Gospel Meditation For Your Day

"God remains where love remains. When a believer realizes without doubt that God is love, it is a powerful moment. Being able to place our resurrection trust in this fundamental truth allows us to experience God's presence in all of our experiences: the good and the bad, positive and negative, life enriching and destructive events we encounter. It is no wonder that St. Paul so accurately tells us that it is love that endures all things and lasts. How can God not endure or ever fade away? Because he is God, Jesus also guarded and protected his disciples as the endearing shepherd who always had their best interest at heart.

If we become too immersed in the world, we lose touch with these deeper realities. We can become so preoccupied with preserving what we have created or think that we need, forgetting that it is not building our city that really matters, but God's. Jesus clearly did not belong to the world and, by virtue of his resurrection, he tries to get us to understand that we do not either. The truth brings us to other worldly, more divine places and takes our eyes off of the concerns that often captivate our fears and storm our senses.

Life can easily erode our faith. Think of your life over the last couple of weeks. What challenged your faith and distracted your divine glance? Even being overly stimulated with technology and social media can erode our sense of confidence and cause us to forget who we really are. We need to distance ourselves from the world in order to experience the joy that Christ offers. The world will never like the word of God. It is too challenging and too perplexing. The world mistakenly believes that it can survive on its own. It is a mistaken judgment that may cost people a lot in the end. It is all so very simple: God remains when we love one another. If in all the

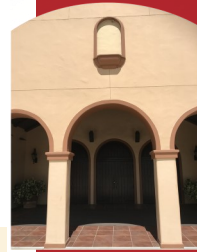

Walking In Another Person's Shoes

Sometimes we serve in an unexpected, one-on-one situation. Recently, as I was approaching All Souls Church for Sunday Mass, a hunched-over figure walking along the sidewalk caught my attention. He walked slowly, with a cane and a meager, black plastic trash bag slung over one shoulder. His slow shuffle, ragged clothes and shoes suddenly brought to mind some of the stories and images from the Bible of the poor and downtrodden. Reflexively, I stopped to speak with him, vaguely hoping others would do the same since we were in full view of the church entrance. Moments later, a nice convertible pulled up on the grass next to us. A well-dressed man got out and greeted the poor man warmly. He offered the poor man a ride home in the front seat, as his wife moved to the back seat to make room. I learned that Tom and Mary were their names and that they had just come from attending Mass at All Souls. Tom treated the other man like a brother, inquiring his shoe size, to see if his own shoes would fit the old man. Tom helped the ragged stranger into his car, gave him his expensive leather loafers, and pulled onto SR 46 to drive him to his destination. Opportunities like this are all around us to

follow in Christ's footsteps, if we stop long enough to walk in another person's shoes.

What Is The Holy League And What Does It Do?

A Catholic men's fraternity of prayer - formation - service. The Holy League strives to call men back to the state of grace and to transform the culture through prayer and inspired action.

Who Is Called?

All men, of all ages, can put on their battle armor (grace), pick their spiritual weapons (Eucharist, Rosary) and stand united and strong against the forces of evil devouring the faith of their loved ones!

When and Why Did It Form?

Pope St. Pius V formed the original Holy League in response to the dire situation in which Christian Europe found itself in 1571. Christianity was greatly divided and diminished at that time, and the enemies of the Church felt this was their time to "deal the last blow" to Christianity. This was when small bands of Catholic men and remnant armies from various nations came together under the spiritual leadership of the saintly pontiff and the military leadership of Don John of Austria. Pope St. Pius V dubbed them the "Holy League." On October 7, 1571, at the Battle of Lepanto, although greatly outnumbered, the Christian fleet won a crushing victory over the Ottoman Turks, saving Christendom and western civilization. Pope St. Pius V knew this was not possible, if not for the intercession of Our Lady through the Rosary.

Time Is Running Out!

Saint Bernardine of Siena



(September 8, 1380 – May 20, 1444)

Most of the saints suffer great personal opposition, even persecution. Bernardine, by contrast, seems more like a human dynamo who simply took on the needs of the world. He was the greatest preacher of his time, journeying across Italy, calming strife-torn cities, attacking the paganism he found rampant, attracting crowds of 30,000, following Saint Francis of Assisi's admonition to preach about "vice and virtue, punishment and glory."

Compared with Saint Paul by the pope, Bernardine had a keen intuition of the needs of the time, along with solid holiness and boundless energy and joy. He accomplished all this despite having a very weak and hoarse voice, miraculously improved later because of his devotion to Mary. When he was 20, the plague was at its height in his hometown of Siena. Sometimes as many as 20 people died in one day at the hospital. Bernardine offered to run the hospital and, with the help of other young men, nursed patients there for four months. He escaped the plague, but was so exhausted that a fever confined him for several months. He spent another year caring for a beloved aunt whose parents had died when he was a child, and at her death began to fast and pray to know God's will for him. At 22, he entered the Franciscan Order and was ordained two years later. For almost 12 years he lived in solitude and prayer, but his gifts ultimately caused him to be sent to preach. He always traveled on foot, sometimes speaking for hours in one place, then doing the same in another town.

Especially known for his devotion to the Holy Name of Jesus, Bernardine devised a symbol—IHS, the first three letters of the name of Jesus in Greek—in Gothic letters on a blazing sun. This was to displace the superstitious symbols of the day, as well as the insignia of factions: for example, Guelphs and Ghibellines. The devotion spread, and the symbol began to appear in churches, homes and public buildings. Opposition arose from those who thought it a dangerous innovation. Three attempts were made to have the pope take action against him, but Bernardine's holiness, orthodoxy, and intelligence were evidence of his faithfulness.

General of the Friars of the Strict Observance, a branch of the Franciscan Order, Bernardine strongly emphasized scholarship and further study of theology and canon law. When he started there were 300 friars in the community; when he died there were 4,000. He returned to preaching the last two years of his life, dying while traveling.

Worldwide Rosary to Pray for an End to the Pandemic

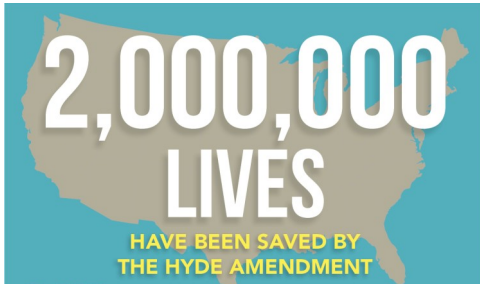

church is once again able to make votive candles available before Mass. The candles can be purchased for \$3 ea., at the Welcome Desk (self-service) in the Narthex. Place cash or check(s) in the envelopes provided, and drop your payment in the blue collection box. (Change will not be available.) Candle racks are located inside the church, in front of the statues of Our Blessed Mother, St. Joseph, and St. Theresa.

Important Note: Only candles purchased at the church can be used because they are specifically designed for the holders. Other candles may pose a fire hazard and safety risk, so they will be removed.



Harvest Time International Community Center

Free Crisis Assistance Program:

Now open to families and individuals with incomes below 200% of poverty guidelines. Receive a HTI Gift Card that can be used to shop in our Community Hope Center for various products needs such as: food, clothing, shoes, health and beauty, paper goods, diapers-baby and adult, pet food, garden, and general merchandise of all kinds, as it is available.

The cards can be used until the assigned amount on card is depleted. Amounts assigned to cards will be in proportion to number of members in household.

Ongoing Income Subsidy Program:

If families do not qualify for Free Crisis Assistance, and are low-income households, they can shop in the Community Hope Center on a continual basis, experiencing 50-90 % discounts off of retail prices. The Community Hope Center provides savings to subsidize household income, and ease the burden of not having enough money to support family needs.

Families in financial crisis caused by sickness, divorce, death of family member, or employment changes also qualify. College Students on low fixed financial support can qualify as well.

Note: For those who do not need this type of assistance, they can use the flyer to give to people they come into contact with that do need this assistance... it can be used as a ministry tool to help meet their unmet needs, while ministering God's love to them and praying with them about their greatest need - Jesus!!!
