

# A MESSAGE FROM *Our Pastor*

My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

On this Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, also known as Corpus Christi, we are reminded that the Eucharist is not just a symbol or theological concept, but a living person, Our Lord Jesus Christ. In our readings this Sunday, the Church points us to the importance of **covenants** and **sacraments** as the means to establish and nourish the family of God.



A **covenant** is a solemn promise of future action, expressed in words or symbolic action, binding people together beyond a mere contractual agreement. Unlike a contract, where goods and services are exchanged, in a covenant, persons are exchanged. Marriage is a prime example; the husband and wife exchange the gift of themselves to one another. In the marriage ceremony, a new family is created. Likewise, in the institution of the Eucharist, Christ offers us the gift of himself, his Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity; we also offer ourselves to him as we become ONE FAMILY in Christ.

A **sacrament** is a sacred, efficacious, and visible sign instituted by Christ to give us grace (cf. CCC 1084). In the Sacrament of the Eucharist, Christ makes use of the elements of bread and wine to offer his Body and Blood in order to nourish our relationship with him and one another. Let us receive the Lord at Holy Communion with reverence and devotion. In his Real Presence, let us also be reminded of our family bond with one another.

*How can we renew our covenant with Christ? How can we offer ourselves in exchange for the gift of Jesus himself?* Jesus, thank you for the gift of your Holy Body and Blood. May our community at All Souls be a living witness to the unity of Christ's Body. Amen.

Mis queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo,


En esta Solemnidad del Santísimo Cuerpo y Sangre de Cristo, también conocido como Corpus Christi, se nos recuerda que la Eucaristía no es solo un símbolo o concepto teológico, sino una persona viva, Nuestro Señor Jesucristo. En nuestras lecturas de este domingo, la Iglesia nos señala la importancia de los **pactos** y los **sacramentos** como medio para establecer y nutrir la familia de Dios.

Un **pacto** es una promesa solemne de acción futura, expresada en palabras o acción simbólica, que une a las personas más allá de un mero acuerdo contractual. A diferencia de un contrato, donde se intercambian bienes y servicios, en un pacto se intercambian personas. El matrimonio es un excelente ejemplo; el marido y la mujer intercambian el don de sí mismos el uno al otro. En la ceremonia de matrimonio, se crea una nueva familia. Asimismo, en la institución de la Eucaristía, Cristo nos ofrece el don de sí mismo, su Cuerpo, Sangre, Alma y Divinidad; también nos ofrecemos a él al convertirnos en UNA FAMILIA en Cristo.

Un **sacramento** es un signo sagrado, eficaz y visible instituido por Cristo para darnos la gracia (cf. CIC 1084). En el sacramento de la Eucaristía, Cristo utiliza los elementos del pan y el vino para ofrecer su Cuerpo y su Sangre a fin de nutrir nuestra relación con él y con los demás. Recibimos al Señor en la Sagrada Comunión con reverencia y devoción. En su Presencia Real, recordemos también nuestro vínculo familiar entre nosotros.

## Gospel Meditation For Your Day

“As our world faces so much turmoil and change, it is now more important than ever to remember who God is, who we are and where we are going. It is easy to get distracted and lose focus, especially when we are being pulled in so many directions. We can not only lose sight of God but one another. Maintaining our well developed and mature relationships with God and one another is essential to continuing to live, healthy, happy, and focused lives. In a message to young people, Pope Benedict XVI said, “the happiness you are seeking, the happiness you have a right to enjoy has a name and a face: it is Jesus of Nazareth, hidden in the Eucharist.” What is true for those who are younger is even truer for those who are older. Regardless of how the particulars of life change over time, human beings are still hard-wired to seek the fullness of life and happiness. How we embark on this journey and what we choose along the way will indicate whether we meet success.

There is so much brokenness and pain in our world. Many people are lost, feeling lonely, anxious, marginalized, victimized, isolated, oppressed, and abused. Every time we receive the Body of Christ, we have an opportunity to become what we eat. The power and presence of Christ in the Eucharist becomes present in us and effects change in ourselves and in the lives of those we meet. We are given the grace to become temples of justice and peace, carrying God’s sacred Presence within us wherever we go. Our faith community is ignited with the fire of God’s love and stands out as a beacon of hope in a world that is lost. This is the only way we can discover peace-filled resolutions to violence and create innovative solutions to what is fueling its need in the first place. True happiness, for the young and old alike, becomes an obtainable goal.

St. John Maria Vianney says it so well. “There is nothing so great as the Eucharist. If God had something more precious, he would have given it to us.” Only the Eucharist has the ability to

connect, sustain, strengthen, and properly orient us, not only on the road of this life but the road to life eternal. Knowing this, when life gets challenging, unsettling, and difficult, we can rely on and cling to this gift we have in the Real Presence of Christ. This actual encounter with God celebrates God’s unconditional love for us and grounds us to the truth of who we are in a way nothing else is able to do. Because through the Eucharist we really do become the Body of Christ, we are also bonded together in a most perfect way to one another as that Body. Nourished, united, and strengthened by the Eucharist, let us individually and collectively, bring this wonderful gift to all we meet, especially the poor with whom we have a special connection. ©LPI

## The Feast of Corpus Christi



The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, historically known by its Latin name, Corpus Christi, celebrates the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist—Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. It is traditionally celebrated on the Thursday following the Solemnity of the Holy Trinity. The feast dates to the Middle Ages and originated with a visionary nun and a Eucharistic miracle.

In 1263 a German priest, Fr. Peter of Prague, made a pilgrimage to Rome. He stopped in Bolsena, Italy, to celebrate Mass at the Church of St. Christina. At the time he was having doubts about Jesus being truly present in the Blessed Sacrament. He was affected by the growing debate among certain theologians who, for the first time in the history of the Church, began introducing doubts about the Body and Blood of Christ being actually present in the consecrated bread and wine. In response to his doubt, when he recited the prayer of consecration as he celebrated the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, blood started seeping from the consecrated host and onto the altar and corporal.

Fr. Peter reported this miracle to Pope Urban IV, who at the time was nearby in Orvieto. The pope sent delegates to investigate and ordered that host and blood-stained corporal be brought to Orvieto. The relics were then placed in the Cathedral of Orvieto, where they remain today.

This Eucharistic Miracle confirmed the visions given to St. Juliana of Mont Cornillon in Belgium (1193-1258). St. Juliana was a nun and mystic who had a series of visions in which she was instructed by Our Lord to work to establish a liturgical feast for the Holy Eucharist, to which she had a great devotion.

After many years of trying, she finally convinced the bishop, the future Pope Urban IV, to create this special feast in honor of the Blessed Sacrament, where none had existed before. Soon after her death, Pope Urban instituted Corpus Christi for the Universal Church and celebrated it for the first time in Orvieto in 1264, a year after the Eucharistic Miracle in Bolsena.

Inspired by the miracle, Pope Urban commissioned a Dominican friar, St. Thomas Aquinas, to compose the Mass and Office for the feast of Corpus Christi. Aquinas' hymns in honor of the Holy Eucharist, *Pange Lingua*, *Tantum Ergo*, *Panis Angelicus*, and *O Salutaris Hostia* are the beloved hymns the Church sings on the feast of Corpus Christi as well as throughout the year during Exposition and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.

## The Fruits of the Holy Spirit



The gifts and fruits of the Holy Spirit play a significant role in Catholics' lives. All Souls encourages the faithful to take some time to reflect upon the fruits of the Holy Spirit in their own lives, and to share their reflections within their families.

### The 12 Fruits of the Holy Spirit

- 1) Charity:** The Holy Spirit has infused us with the capacity for love. For the love of God and of our neighbor, without the desire of reward for our selfless devotion.
- 2) Joy:** When the Holy Spirit enters us, we come to recognize that true happiness comes not from money or possessions. But, by knowing and following Jesus, we will someday be with him, now and forever in Heaven.
- 3) Peace:** There is a tranquility within our soul that comes from our reliance on God. Through prayer and worship we experience an inner peace, and work to spread this peace throughout the world.
- 4) Patience:** By treating others with thoughtfulness and tolerance, we are capable of demonstrating our ability to resist temptation, and the need for God's mercy and forgiveness. Love is patient.
- 5) Benignity:** Otherwise known as kindness, is the willingness to do more for others than they do for you. In other words, the virtue of treating others the way one would like to be treated themselves.
- 6) Goodness:** To renounce evil and embrace that which is good, as we repent for our sins, and strive to do God's will.
- 7) Longanimity:** To quietly endure the provocation and attacks of others, through perseverance and patience. This is our ability to stay faithful over the course of our lives.
- 8) Mildness:** People inherently have a tendency to be rough, angry and vengeful. The Holy Spirit has given us the moral virtue to be gentle and mild in behavior. From this blessing we draw our ability to show forgiveness, and to be gracious towards others.
- 9) Faith:** Through Divine grace, we are faithful by living our lives in accordance with God's will, and by committing to the teachings of Jesus Christ, the Holy Scriptures, and the Catholic Church.
- 10) Modesty:** Internally this means being humble of ourselves and pure of thoughts. By acknowledging that our successes, achievements, talents, and merits, are all truly gifts from God. Externally this means dressing appropriately, to speak without gloating or boasting, and to not act in a manner unbecoming of a follower of Christ.
- 11) Continnence:** Is to exercise self-control and moderation. By overcoming and resisting temptations of questionable appetites, we are doing God's will. This does not mean to deny oneself of what is needed, but to limit one's wants, to what is an appropriate behavior or level of indulgence.
- 12) Chastity:** Chastity means giving ourselves to Christ completely whether as a priest, religious or layman. All vocations are called to be chaste in their way of living. Chastity also means indulging our physical desires within the right context such as being sexually pure before marriage and by remaining faithful to one's spouse.

## Blessed Franz Jägerstätter



(May 20, 1907 – August 9, 1943)

Called to fight for his country as a Nazi soldier, Franz eventually refused, and this husband and father of three daughters—Rosalie, Marie and Aloisia—was executed because of it.

Born in St. Radegund in Upper Austria, Franz lost his father during World War I and was adopted after Heinrich Jaegerstaetter married Rosalia Huber. As a young man, he loved to ride his motorcycle and was the natural leader of a gang whose members were arrested in 1934 for brawling. For three years he worked in the mines in another city and then returned to St. Radegund, where he became a farmer, married Franziska and lived his faith with quiet but intense conviction.

In 1938, he publicly opposed the German Anschluss--annexation--of Austria. The next year, he was drafted into the Austrian army, trained for seven months and then received a deferment. In 1940, Franz was called up again but allowed to return home at the request of the town's mayor. He was in active service between October 1940 and April 1941, but was again deferred. His pastor, other priests, and the bishop of Linz urged him not to refuse to serve if drafted.

In February 1943, Franz was called up again and reported to army officials in Enns, Austria. When he refused to take the oath of loyalty to Hitler, he was imprisoned in Linz. Later he volunteered to serve in the medical corps but was not assigned there.

During Holy Week Franz wrote to his wife: "Easter is coming and, if it should be God's will that we can never again in this world celebrate Easter together in our intimate family circle, we can still look ahead in the happy confidence that, when the eternal Easter morning dawns, no one in our family circle shall be missing—so we can then be permitted to rejoice together forever." He was transferred in May to a prison in Berlin. (Cont. p.8)

Challenged by his attorney that other Catholics were serving in the army, Franz responded, "I can only act on my own conscience. I do not judge anyone. I can only judge myself." He continued, "I have considered my family. I have prayed and put myself and my family in God's hands. I know that, if I do what I think God wants me to do, he will take care of my family."

On August 8, 1943, Franz wrote to Fransizka: "Dear wife and mother, I thank you once more from my heart for everything that you have done for me in my lifetime, for all the sacrifices that you have borne for me. I beg you to forgive me if I have hurt or offended you, just as I have forgiven everything...My heartfelt greetings for my dear children. I will surely beg the dear God, if I am permitted to enter heaven soon, that he will set aside a little place in heaven for all of you."

Franz was beheaded and cremated the following day. In 1946, his ashes were reburied in St. Radegund near a memorial inscribed with his name and the names of almost 60 village men who died during their military service. He was beatified in Linz on October 26, 2007. His "spiritual testament" is now in Rome's St. Bartholomew Church as part of a shrine to 20th-century martyrs for their faith.
