

- Mk 4:31-32

My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The **kingdom of God** is one of the key themes of the teachings of our Lord Jesus Christ. At the beginning of his ministry, Jesus proclaimed that “the kingdom of God is near” (Mt 3:2). In the Lord’s Prayer, the disciples are taught to ask for the coming of God’s kingdom (Mt 6:10). When asked when the kingdom would come, Jesus replied, “**The kingdom of God cannot be observed...For behold, the kingdom of God is among you**” (Lk 17:21). *What, then, is the kingdom of God?*



In his letter to the Romans, Paul describes the kingdom of God as one of **righteousness, peace, and joy in the holy Spirit** (Rom 14:17). How do we enter into this kingdom? Our Responsorial Psalm invites us to always give thanks to the Lord for his kindness and faithfulness (Ps 92). THANKSGIVING leads us to greater TRUST in God’s Providence and into that deep JOY in knowing that we are loved by God. Despite what we do not see, *our good God is in control*. As Paul writes in the Second Reading, “we walk by **faith** and not by sight”. Let us be confident that God will provide for all our needs, especially for our spiritual life and growth in Christ.

In our Gospel, Jesus makes use of two similar parables to unpack the kingdom of God. In the first parable, Jesus teaches us the importance of sowing the seeds of God’s kingdom. In our Christian discipleship and ministry, we tend to focus on our own capabilities in implementing God’s plans, expecting immediate results. However, **it is God who causes the growth** from seedling to harvest (see 1 Cor 3:6-7). Let us practice humility in our ministries, trusting that God will bring about the fulfillment of his plans.

In the second parable, Jesus likens the kingdom of God to a mustard seed that grows into the largest of plants “**once it is sown**”. Again, we are reminded of the importance of laying down the foundations with humility, trusting that GOD is at work bringing about growth and maturation. Our task is to simply sow the seeds.

How can we sow the seeds of the kingdom in our families, workplaces, and communities? How can we give thanks to God for all that he has done in our lives?

Mis queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo,

El **reino de Dios** es uno de los temas clave de las enseñanzas de nuestro Señor Jesucristo. Al comienzo de su ministerio, Jesús proclamó que “el reino de Dios está cerca” (Mt 3, 2). En el Padrenuestro, se enseña a los discípulos a pedir la venida del reino de Dios (Mt 6:10). Cuando se le preguntó cuándo vendría el reino, Jesús respondió: “**El reino de Dios no se puede observar ... Porque he aquí, el reino de Dios está entre nosotros**” (Lc 17:21). *Entonces, ¿qué es el reino de Dios?*


En su carta a los Romanos, Pablo describe el reino de Dios como uno de **justicia, paz y gozo en el Espíritu Santo** (Romanos 14:17). ¿Cómo entramos en este reino? Nuestro Salmo Responsorial nos invita a dar siempre gracias al Señor por su bondad y fidelidad (Sal 92). LA ACCIÓN DE GRACIAS nos lleva a una mayor CONFIANZA en la Providencia de Dios y a ese profundo GOZO de saber que somos amados por Dios. A pesar de lo que no vemos, nuestro buen Dios tiene el control. Como escribe Pablo en la segunda lectura, “por **fe** caminamos y no por vista”. Confíemos en que Dios proveerá para todas nuestras necesidades, especialmente para nuestra vida espiritual y crecimiento en Cristo.

En nuestro Evangelio, Jesús hace uso de dos parábolas similares para desglosar el reino de Dios. En la primera parábola, Jesús nos enseña la importancia de sembrar las semillas del reino de Dios. En nuestro discipulado y ministerio cristiano, tendemos a enfocarnos en nuestras propias capacidades para implementar los planes de Dios, esperando resultados inmediatos. Sin embargo, es **Dios quien hace que el crecimiento** desde la plántula hasta la cosecha (ver 1 Cor 3: 6-7). Practiquemos la humildad en nuestros ministerios, confiando en que Dios hará realidad sus planes.

En la segunda parábola, Jesús compara el reino de Dios con una semilla de mostaza que se convierte en la planta más grande “**una vez sembrada**”. Una vez más, se nos recuerda la importancia de sentar las bases con humildad, confiando en que DIOS está obrando para lograr el crecimiento y la maduración. Nuestra tarea es simplemente sembrar las semillas.

¿Cómo podemos sembrar las semillas del reino en nuestras familias, lugares de trabajo y comunidades? ¿Cómo podemos dar gracias a Dios por todo lo que ha hecho en nuestras vidas?

Gospel Meditation For Your Day

“A favorite motto of St. Teresa of Calcutta was, “do small things with great love.” This is how it works in the kingdom of God. God can do tremendous things with the smallest gesture, especially when it is done in love. We can clearly see that our world is suffering greatly. People are struggling to find peace, navigate through conflicts, earn a sustainable living, find security and enough food to eat, and work through political tensions and conflicts. In the light of the magnitude of the difficulties that exist around us and even within us, we can find ourselves floundering to discover practical, effective solutions. How can something so large be helped by someone as small and seemingly insignificant as me? While whole systems and structures may be out of the league of our personal influence, are we really that helpless in the midst of all of the turmoil, sadness, and suffering?

If we believe that God is with us and that God is still working to bring about the glory of God’s kingdom, then the answer is no. We are never helpless or without hope. Armed with a strong life of prayer, we can always flee to God and ask for inspiration, wisdom, and especially love. We are all blessed with unique gifts and talents and it often seems that considering all that the world lacks, love and charity remain at the top of the list. Life can easily become a battleground of hostility. Because life is challenging and difficult, anger is not far away. We see it on people’s faces and hear it in their voices. There is a measure of frustration that permeates all avenues of life. It is even felt in the air. As people of faith, we know that what we see here is not the end but only a part of something far greater to come. We know that God’s kingdom is where we are ultimately meant to be, and the Gospel is the way to get there. If love and charity can prevail in us, then God

will be able to do what God does best. God will use us to scatter the seeds of his kingdom. Through our small gestures, those seeds can receive the nurturing attention that is necessary for them to bear great fruit. We cannot fall victim to the strife that is around us. We have to keep ourselves refreshed and focused so that even in small ways, we can become part of the solution, not the problem. Love and charity, which come from God, can help to heal the ills of the world. May we bring these simple gifts to the everyday simple tasks of our lives! Watch how big the plant grows! ©LPi



Step Up for students

Saint Marguerite d'Youville



(October 15, 1701 – December 23, 1771)

We learn compassion from allowing our lives to be influenced by compassionate people, by seeing life from their perspectives, and reconsidering our own values.

Born in Varennes, Canada, Marie Marguerite Dufrost de La-Jemmerais had to interrupt her schooling at the age of 12 to help her widowed mother. Eight years later she married François d'Youville; they had six children, four of whom died young. Despite the fact that her husband gambled, sold liquor illegally to Native Americans, and treated her indifferently, she cared for him compassionately until his death in 1730.

Even though she was caring for two small children and running a store to help pay off her husband's debts, Marguerite still helped the poor. Once her children were grown, she and several companions rescued a Quebec hospital that was in danger of failing. She called her community the Institute of the Sisters of Charity of Montreal; the people called them the "Grey Nuns" because of the color of their habits. In time, a proverb arose among the poor people of Montreal, "Go to the Grey Nuns; they never refuse to serve." In time, five other religious communities traced their roots to the Grey Nuns.

The General Hospital in Montreal became known as the Hôtel Dieu (House of God) and set a standard for medical care and Christian compassion. When the hospital was destroyed by fire in 1766, Mère Marguerite knelt in the ashes, led the Te Deum—a hymn to God's providence in all circumstances—and began the rebuilding process. She fought the attempts of government officials to restrain her charity, and established the first foundling home in North America.

Pope Saint John XXIII, who beatified Mère Marguerite in 1959, called her the "Mother of Universal Charity." She was canonized in 1990 and her liturgical feast is celebrated on October 16.
