

A MESSAGE FROM *Our Pastor*

My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Our Gospel this Sunday gives us a glimpse of the journey of faith that God calls us to, one that involves total TRUST in his CARE. Our journey with Jesus is a response to his invitation: **"Let us cross to the other side."** Along the way, we will encounter many challenges and obstacles, just as Jesus had to deal with persecutions during his life on earth. How do we respond to challenging situations? Do we focus on the external storms or on the all-powerful, all-loving Presence of Christ within us? Today, let Jesus speak to storms in our lives: **"Be still!"**



In times of trials, Jesus reveals to us who He truly is. He is not just a "teacher", as some would say, but the Divine Son of God, creator of the world. He is not only a God of justice, power and might, but at the same time a God of love and compassion. God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in distress (Psalm 46). Yet in the midst of our troubles, God seems to be asleep, or absent. We cry out: "Don't you care that we are perishing?" At times, we may be overwhelmed as our boat seems to be on the verge of sinking. Everything seems to be falling apart, and the "other side" is no longer in sight. We forget why we are on this journey, and forget who is with us on the boat.

Our Lord Jesus asks that we TRUST in Him. "Jesus I trust in You". Let us remember to turn to God, and to **give thanks to him, for his love is everlasting** (Psalm 107), even when he seems to be asleep. Our security in life needs to be rooted in Christ and who he is. Our consolation is that Jesus CARES for us, and that he has the ability to quiet the storms in our lives. Jesus asks us today: **"Why are you afraid? Do you not yet have FAITH?"** Can't you see that I AM with you? Jesus wants to teach us to trust through the storm, rather than to stop the storm itself. We can attain this deep trust if we hold onto the PRESENCE of Christ with us. As long as we remain in the boat with Jesus, we are safe and everything will be alright! Our loving God will never let us sink or perish!

How can we trust in Jesus amidst the storms in our life? What attitude should we have when we bring to him our needs and concerns? How can we deepen our prayer life and stay close to the Presence of Christ within us?


Hoy, deja que Jesús hable a las tormentas en nuestras vidas: **"¡Cállate!"**

Sin embargo, en medio de nuestros problemas, Dios parece estar dormido o ausente. Gritamos: "¿No te importa que estemos pereciendo?" A veces, podemos sentirnos abrumados porque nuestro barco parece estar a punto de hundirse. Todo parece desmoronarse y el "otro lado" ya no está a la vista. Olvidamos por qué estamos en este viaje y olvidamos quién está con nosotros en el barco.

Gospel Meditation For Your Day

“As we look at our lives and world events, do we ever find ourselves wondering if God is sleeping? After all, maybe God’s patient, unconditional love has run its course and He is finally fed up with humanity’s reluctance to accept the truth about who we are. God really can’t be that patient! All throughout human history, many have prayed to God for intervention or for particular needs. Because their prayers were not answered in the way they wanted or anticipated, they felt that God may have abandoned them. Were they right? It seems that we are continuing, at a rapid rate, down a path of destruction. Do you not care, God, that we may be perishing? When the boats of our lives are rocking and the seas tumultuous, we want to know that we have God’s attention. Even more so, we want God’s intervention.

Maybe the storms and the waves are necessary. If we listen, they can teach us valuable lessons. Without them, we would never learn that we have the strength to endure, understand the uselessness of fear and worry, or develop the ability to really trust. If God immediately rushed in and simply calmed things down before they got difficult, what good would that really be? We would miss opportunities to learn how to drink more deeply of life, treasure its complexity, irony, and beauty and fully engage ourselves in surrendering to the love of our Creator. It is easy to walk on the surface of life without immersing ourselves in its messiness. Life has to burn its way through us in order to bring us to a place of secure trust. It’s unfortunate that some prefer a shallower journey.

That’s the balancing act that comes with faith. It is not God’s job to prevent us from encountering the torrential rains and winds of life. Many believe that if faith is done the right way, that God will provide for smooth sailing. That’s not how it works. God permits us to ride out the difficult stuff knowing that the storm will eventually be

calmed. Do we not have faith that God will do this? True faith trusts in the steadfastness of God’s love when the seas are calm and when they are choppy. God’s unconditional loving presence shines through all of it and endures forever. Knowing this allows us to put our boats out into uncharted waters without hesitation. 





The Sacred Heart is the source of all the graces that can make our ministry fruitful, no matter the challenges we face.

Saint Aloysius Gonzaga



(March 9, 1568 – June 21, 1591)

The Lord can make saints anywhere. Florence was the “mother of piety” for Aloysius Gonzaga despite his exposure to a “society of fraud, dagger, poison, and lust.” As a son of a princely family, he grew up in royal courts and army camps. His father wanted Aloysius to be a military hero.

At age 7 Aloysius experienced a profound spiritual quickening. His prayers included the Office of Mary, the psalms, and other devotions. At age 9 he came to Florence to be educated; by age 11 he was teaching catechism to poor children, fasting three days a week, and practicing great austerities. When he was 13, he traveled with his parents to Spain, and was a page in the court of Philip II. The more Aloysius saw of court life, the more disillusioned he became, seeking relief in learning about the saints.

A book about the experience of Jesuit missionaries in India suggested to him the idea of entering the Society of Jesus, and in Spain his decision became final. Now began a four-year contest with his father. Eminent churchmen and laypeople were pressed into service to persuade Aloysius to remain in his “normal” vocation. Finally he prevailed, was allowed to renounce his right to succession, and was received into the Jesuit novitiate.

Like other seminarians, Aloysius was faced with a new kind of penance—that of accepting different ideas about the exact nature of penance. He was obliged to eat more, and to take recreation with the other students. He was forbidden to pray except at stated times. He spent four years in the study of philosophy and had Saint Robert Bellarmine as his spiritual adviser.

In 1591, a plague struck Rome. The Jesuits opened a hospital of their own. Because he nursed patients, washing them and making their beds, Aloysius caught the disease. A fever persisted after his recovery and he was so weak he could scarcely rise from bed. Yet he maintained his great discipline of prayer. He died three months later, within the octave of Corpus Christi, at the age of 23.

Faith Formation Updates



Jesus Calms the Storm

Rain showers, thunderstorms and even hurricanes are typical of the Florida climate. So it can be said about life too. It is part of being human to experience some of life’s storms. Remember it takes both the sun and rain to make a rainbow.

Read with your children Mark 4:35-41.

On the way to Mass ask your child what they do when they have a simple problem. For example, they can’t reach something, or they are hungry. Explain that just as they ask you or another person for help because they know you care and can help with some things, they can ask God to help with anything. Talk about things that make you afraid and how you ask God to help. On the way home from Mass share with your children how you have called on Jesus to calm you when you are afraid.

Storm in a Bottle Activity

Scripture: A wild storm came up. Waves crashed over the boat. It was about to sink. Jesus was in the back, sleeping on a cushion. The disciples woke him up. They said, “Teacher! Don’t you care if we drown?” Mark 4:37-38

Supplies: water bottles, water, oil, blue food coloring, glitter, tape

- Fill bottle with water, leaving about an inch from the top.
- Add blue food coloring and glitter
- Add a few drops of vegetable oil.
- Tape the bottle closed.
- Add sea stickers, if desired
