

My dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,


The freedom to choose is one of the greatest gifts God has given us. In this week's readings, we observe the theme of making choices. In our First Reading, Joshua addressed all the tribes of Israel: *"Decide today whom you will serve."* Similarly, in our Gospel, Jesus revealed that he is "the living bread that came down from heaven", and "unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you". Jesus went on to say in John 6: **"Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day"**. For many of his disciples then and now, *"this saying is hard; who can accept it?"*

After Jesus spoke these words, many who had followed him murmured and walked away. Rather than stopping them, Jesus asked his remaining disciples: **"Do you also want to leave?"** Jesus presents them with a choice. He does not sugarcoat or water down his teachings in order to satisfy their expectations, but presents the Truth for them to decide. Jesus knew that some would not believe, not only then, but throughout the history of the Church. Today, even many Catholics do not believe in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist.

Jesus said, **"no one can come to me unless it is granted him by the Father."** Let us give thanks to God for the theological virtue of Faith. Let us also reflect on what it means to be an intentional disciple. Are we convinced that Christ is the way, the life, and the truth, even when our intellects cannot comprehend his mysteries? In times of doubt, may we repeat the words of Peter: *"Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life."*

*How can we be more intentional about our discipleship with Jesus?
How can we be faithful to the teachings of Jesus and his Bride, the Church, even when we find it difficult to accept?*

Mis queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo,


La libertad de elegir es uno de los mayores dones que Dios nos ha dado. En las lecturas de esta semana, observamos el tema de la toma de decisiones. En nuestra primera lectura, Josué se dirigió a todas las tribus de Israel: *"Decide hoy a quién servirás"*. De manera similar, en nuestro Evangelio, Jesús reveló que él es "el pan vivo que descendió del cielo", y que "a menos que coman la carne del Hijo del Hombre y beban su sangre, no tienen vida dentro de ustedes". Jesús continuó diciendo en Juan 6: **"El que come mi carne y bebe mi sangre tiene vida eterna, y yo lo resucitaré en el último día"**. Para muchos de sus discípulos entonces y ahora, "esta palabra es dura; ¿quién puede aceptarlo?"

Después de que Jesús dijo estas palabras, muchos de los que lo habían seguido murmuraron y se alejaron. En lugar de detenerlos, Jesús preguntó a sus discípulos restantes: **"¿También ustedes quieren irse?"** Jesús les presenta una opción. No endulza ni diluye sus enseñanzas para satisfacer sus expectativas, sino que les presenta la Verdad para que ellos decidan. Jesús sabía que algunos no creerían, no solo entonces, sino a lo largo de la historia de la Iglesia. Hoy en día, incluso muchos católicos no creen en la presencia real de Jesús en la Eucaristía.

Jesús dijo: **"Nadie puede venir a mí si no se lo concede el Padre"**. Demos gracias a Dios por la virtud teológica de la fe. Reflexionemos también sobre lo que significa ser un discípulo intencional. ¿Estamos convencidos de que Cristo es el camino, la vida y la verdad, incluso cuando nuestro intelecto no puede comprender sus misterios? En tiempos de duda, podemos repetir las palabras de Pedro: *"Maestro, ¿a quién iremos? Tu tienes las palabras de la vida eterna."*

¿Cómo podemos ser más intencionales acerca de nuestro discipulado con Jesús? ¿Cómo podemos ser fieles a las enseñanzas de Jesús y su Esposa, la Iglesia, incluso cuando nos cuesta aceptarlas?

How do you offer a Mass for someone?

At Mass, we typically hear, "This Mass is being offered for the intentions of [someone]." What does this mean, and how do we offer a Mass for a friend or family member?

The Mass is the most powerful of all prayers, and so it is a very effective way to pray for loved ones. Praying for loved ones with the Mass is an ancient tradition. While you can personally offer your prayers at Mass for a special intention, requesting a priest say a Mass for your intention can be even more powerful because your intention will often be read aloud or published in the parish bulletin. The priest and many in the congregation will now be offering their prayers, through the Mass, for your special intention.

Requesting a Mass for your special intention is easier than you might think. It's often as simple as calling the parish office and putting in a request. There are also many religious orders and shrines with online Mass intention request forms you can submit. It is customary to give a very small monetary gift when you request a Mass

for a special intention. This money helps support the parish facilities or missions.

You can offer a Mass for family members, friends, or any special intention, but Masses offered for the dead are particularly powerful. In fact, many souls have actually appeared to loved ones to ask for Mass to be said for them so that they will be released from Purgatory. Since the souls in Purgatory are no longer able to pray for themselves, they rely on the prayers and good works of those still on Earth to help them along in their journey to paradise.

Saint Bartholomew (Apostle)



(c. 1st century)

In the New Testament, Bartholomew is mentioned only in the lists of the apostles. Some scholars identify him with Nathanael, a man of Cana in Galilee who was summoned to Jesus by Philip. Jesus paid him a great compliment: "Here is a true Israelite. There is no duplicity in him" (John 1:47b). When Nathanael asked how Jesus knew him, Jesus said, "I saw you under the fig tree" (John 1:48b). Whatever amazing revelation this involved, it brought Nathanael to exclaim, "Rabbi, you are the Son of God; you are the King of Israel" (John 1:49b). But Jesus countered with, "Do you believe because I told you that I saw you under the fig tree? You will see greater things than this" (John 1:50b).

Nathanael did see greater things. He was one of those to whom Jesus appeared on the shore of the Sea of Tiberias after his resurrection (see John 21:1-14). They had been fishing all night without success. In the morning, they saw someone standing on the shore though no one knew it was Jesus. He told them to cast their net again, and they made so great a catch that they could not haul the net in. Then John cried out to Peter, "It is the Lord."

When they brought the boat to shore, they found a fire burning, with some fish laid on it and some bread. Jesus asked them to bring some of the fish they had caught, and invited them to come and eat their meal. John relates that although they knew it was Jesus, none of the apostles presumed to inquire who he was. This, John notes, was the third time Jesus appeared to the apostles.

Bartholomew or Nathanael? We are confronted again with the fact that we know almost nothing about most of the apostles. Yet the unknown ones were also foundation stones, the 12 pillars of the new Israel whose 12 tribes now encompass the whole earth. Their personalities were secondary—without thereby being demeaned—to their great office of bearing tradition from their firsthand experience, speaking in the name of Jesus, putting the Word Made Flesh into human words for the enlightenment of the world. Their holiness was not an introverted contemplation of their status before God. It was a gift that they had to share with others. The Good News was that all are called to the holiness of being Christ's members, by the gracious gift of God.

The simple fact is that humanity is totally meaningless unless God is its total concern. Then humanity, made holy with God's own holiness, becomes the most precious creation of God.




