He summoned the crowd again and said to them, "Hear me, all of you, and understand. Nothing that enters one from the outside can defile that person; but the things that come out from within are what defile." - Mk 7:14-15

My dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Over the past several Sundays, we heard Jesus revealing himself to be the *"bread of life."* This week, we focus on the theme of God's Word, the source of life and sustenance on our earthly pilgrimage. In last week's Gospel, Jesus said: *"The words I have spoken to you are Spirit and life."* As a result of his sayings, many disciples left and returned to their former way of life. They heard the Word of God but did not believe. Others remained and were convinced that Jesus had the *"words of eternal life."* Since that time, the Lord continues to nourish his people through both Word and Sacrament. At the celebration of Mass, we hear God speak to us in the Liturgy of the Word and receive his Body and Blood in the Liturgy of the Eucharist. The liturgy is an *"action of God"* that unites us to Jesus Christ through the Holy Spirit (cf. *Sacramentum Caritatis*, 37).

In our First Reading, Moses instructed the people to **hear** and **observe** the commandments of God. *"Observe them carefully,"* without adding or subtracting from it. Yet, what do we tend to do with the Word of God after hearing it? We add, subtract, multiply, and divide! This is how some of the Pharisees approached Jesus. Instead of observing God's commandments, they observed everyone else.

Unable to denounce Jesus, they condemned his disciples: *"Why do your disciples not follow the tradition of the elders?"* Jesus had to point out their hypocrisy: *"You disregard God's commandment but cling to human tradition."*


This week, we are reminded that the Word of God is not an instrument to measure the actions of others, but a mirror to reflect on ourselves. When we examine our hearts, do we recognize any of these transgressions?

*Evil thoughts, unchastity, theft, murder, adultery, greed, malice, deceit, licentiousness, envy, blasphemy, arrogance, folly.*

May the Lord not have to say, *"These people honor me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me."* Jesus, forgive our pride, arrogance, and foolishness many times over. Let us be truly wise by observing your commandments, and help us to always follow your holy will, which is Love and Mercy.

How can we be faithful to God's commandments? How can we recognize God's presence in ourselves and others, and allow the Holy Spirit to move us into action?

Mis queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo,

Durante los últimos domingos, escuchamos a Jesús revelándose a sí mismo como el *"pan de vida"*. Esta semana, nos enfocamos en el tema de la Palabra de Dios, fuente de vida y sustento en nuestro peregrinaje terrenal. En el Evangelio de la semana pasada, Jesús dijo: *"Las palabras que les he hablado son Espíritu y son vida"*. Como resultado de sus dichos, muchos discípulos se fueron y volvieron a su forma de vida anterior. Escucharon la Palabra de Dios pero no creyeron. Otros se quedaron y estaban convencidos de que Jesús tenía las *"palabras de vida eterna"*. Desde ese momento, el Señor continúa alimentando a su pueblo a través de la Palabra y el Sacramento. En la celebración de la Misa, escuchamos a Dios hablarnos en la Liturgia de la Palabra y recibimos su Cuerpo y Sangre en la Liturgia de la Eucaristía. La liturgia es una *"acción de Dios"* que nos une a Jesucristo a través del Espíritu Santo (cf. *Sacramentum caritatis*, 37).

En nuestra primera lectura, Moisés instruyó al pueblo a escuchar y observen los mandamientos de Dios. *"Obsérvelos atentamente"*, sin sumar ni restar. Sin embargo, ¿qué tendemos a hacer con la Palabra de Dios después de escucharla? ¿Sumamos, restamos, multiplicamos y dividimos! Así se acercaron algunos fariseos a Jesús. En lugar de observar los mandamientos de Dios, observaron a todos los demás.

Incapaces de denunciar a Jesús, condenaron a sus discípulos: *"¿Por qué tus discípulos no siguen la tradición de los ancianos?"* Jesús tuvo que señalar su hipocresía: *"Usted ignora el mandamiento de Dios, pero se aferra a la tradición humana"*.

Esta semana, se nos recuerda que la Palabra de Dios no es un instrumento para medir las acciones de los demás, sino un espejo para reflejar en nosotros mismos. Cuando examinamos nuestro corazón, ¿reconocemos alguna de estas transgresiones?

*Malos pensamientos, falta de castidad, hurto, asesinato, adulterio, codicia, malicia, engaño, libertinaje, envidia, blasfemia, arrogancia, necedad.*

Que el Señor no tenga que decir: *"Este pueblo me honra con los labios, pero su corazón está lejos de mí"*. Jesús, perdona muchas veces nuestro orgullo, arrogancia y necedad. Seamos verdaderamente sabios observando tus mandamientos y ayúdanos a seguir siempre tu santa voluntad, que es Amor y Misericordia.

¿Cómo podemos ser fieles a los mandamientos de Dios? ¿Cómo podemos reconocer la presencia de Dios en nosotros mismos y en los demás, y permitir que el Espíritu Santo nos mueva a la acción?

## Did You know There Are Flowers Named After Our Lady?

Perhaps you or someone you know cultivates a "Mary Garden."

During medieval times, Catholics often honored the Blessed Mother through planting a Mary Garden at their homes or on parish grounds. These medieval gardens would often include shrubs, herbs, and flowers that represented the Blessed Mother and events from her life. Many plants had Marian names in honor of her life and glorious virtues.

For example, columbines were once called "Our Lady's Shoes" because a legend said that, on her way to visit her cousin Elizabeth after the Annunciation, these flowers sprang up along Mary's path. Bluebells were once known as "Our Lady's Thimbles" in honor of Mary's role as a mother and homemaker. Violets were called "Our Lady's Modesty," because a story said that violets blossomed when the Blessed Mother told the Angel Gabriel, "Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord. Be it done to me according to thy word." Hostas used to be called "Assumption Lilies." In late summer, a tall, thin stalk emerges from this plant's

leaves and unfolds into a beautiful and intricate flower. This natural occurrence reminds us of Our Lady's Assumption into Heaven, which we celebrate around the same time this flower blooms, August 15.

While many of these plants have new names, some continue to bear their Marian titles. For instance, marigolds get their name from the phrase "Mary's Gold," in honor of Our Blessed Mother.

Creating a Marian garden is a centuries-old tradition in the Church. You, too, can participate in this special practice to honor Our Lady.

## Sts. Joseph of Arimathea and Nicodemus

The actions of these two influential Jewish leaders give insight into the charismatic power of Jesus and his teachings—and the risks that could be involved in following him.



(c. 1st century)

Joseph was a respected, wealthy civic leader who had become a disciple of Jesus. Following the death of Jesus, Joseph obtained Jesus' body from Pilate, wrapped it in fine linen and buried it. For these reasons, Joseph is considered the patron saint of funeral directors and pallbearers. More important is the courage Joseph showed in asking Pilate for Jesus' body. Jesus was a condemned criminal who had been publicly executed. According to some legends, Joseph was punished and imprisoned for such a bold act.

Nicodemus was a Pharisee and, like Joseph, an important first-century Jew. We know from John's Gospel that Nicodemus went to Jesus at night—secretly—to better understand his teachings about the kingdom. Later, he spoke up for Jesus at the time of his arrest and assisted in Jesus' burial. We know little else about Nicodemus.

## Has Mary Ever Appeared in the United States?

There was a Marian apparition... in Wisconsin? It's true! Discover the story below. When young Belgian immigrant Adele Brise arrived in Wisconsin with her family, she may have expected adventure, but not to witness the first approved Marian apparition in the United States.

In October 1859, while carrying grain to a mill, 28-year-old Adele experienced her first vision near the area now called New Franken. Adele saw a woman bathed in a bright light and dressed in white, a yellow sash, and a crown of stars. Unsure and frightened, Adele prayed until the vision disappeared. The following Sunday, the lady appeared again on Adele's way to Mass. Adele immediately consulted with her priest, who advised that she should ask the woman, "In the Name of God, who are you and what do you wish of me?"

Adele saw the apparition a third time on her way home from Mass the same day, and followed the priest's instructions. Mary told her: "I am the Queen of Heaven, who prays for the conversion of sinners, and I wish you to do the same." Our Lady then gave Adele the mission to "gather the children in this wild country and teach them what they should know for salvation."

Twelve years after Adele first encountered the Blessed Mother, a great drought beset the Midwest. This drought caused the Peshtigo Fire, the worst recorded fire in U.S. history. As the fire approached Robinsonville, local families that Adele had served came together at the chapel grounds with their children and livestock to pray the Rosary, beseeching Our Lady to ask Jesus to save them. They prayed through the night—and while the fire destroyed the surrounding land, the chapel area and all who had gathered there remained untouched.

This became the first of many miraculous occurrences through Our Lady of Good Help's intercession. In 1942, a new church was constructed at the site. Devotion to Our Lady of Good Help flourished. In 2010, after much time and discernment by expert Mariologists, the Church formally pronounced Mary's appearances to Adele as "worthy of belief." The church constructed at the site was later designated as the **National Shrine of Our Lady of Good Help**, making it the first and only shrine with a Church-approved Marian apparition site in the USA.


