

My dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,


Amazing Grace! How sweet the sound that saved a wretch like me. I once was lost, but now am found; was blind but now I see. These are words to one of the most recognizable songs in the English-speaking world. Written in 1772 by John Newton, a former slave trader, **Amazing Grace** came out of a spiritual conversion after his experience caught in a violent storm at sea. On the verge of sinking, Newton cried out to God and miraculously, the ship and its passengers were saved. Even after this experience, Newton did not immediately convert. In 1754, when he became severely sick on a sea voyage, Newton experienced another conversion, gave up his former ways and devoted his life to God. Later on, he fought for the abolishment of the slave trade. The hymn expresses Newton's deep gratitude for God's saving grace despite his troubled past.

In our own life's journey, we are called to recognize God's presence and continually renew our faith in his salvation. In our First Reading, the prophet Isaiah proclaimed: *"Here is your God...he comes to save you. Then will the eyes of the blind be opened, the ears of the deaf be cleared."* Similarly, in our Second Reading, St. James tells us that God has chosen those who are *"poor in the world"* to make them *"rich in faith and heirs of the kingdom"*. This is the **Good News**: God has come to save us, not because we are worthy, but because of his mercy. He elevates us to become heirs to his kingdom and raises us to eternal life. In response to God's goodness, let us sing the words of Psalm 146: *Praise the Lord, my soul!*

Our Lord Jesus Christ showed mercy and compassion on his people as he traveled throughout Galilee. We, too, are called to show mercy to others, without partiality or distinction. Through God's grace and our acts of kindness, others will come to know Jesus and his saving power. Just as the deaf man in our Gospel was brought to Jesus by the people, we are called to bring those in need to the Lord for healing and conversion. **Ephphatha! Be opened!** May our senses be opened to the amazing grace of God.

How can we show mercy to those in need? How can we put an end to distinctions between our brothers and sisters based on external circumstances?

Mis queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo,


¡Gracia Asombrosa! Qué dulce el sonido que salvó a un desgraciado como yo. Una vez estuve perdido, pero ahora soy encontrado; Era ciego, pero ahora veo. Estas son las palabras de una de las canciones más reconocidas en el mundo de habla inglesa. Escrito en 1772 por John Newton, un antiguo comerciante de esclavos, **Amazing Grace** salió de una conversión espiritual después de su experiencia atrapada en una violenta tormenta en el mar. A punto de hundirse, Newton clamó a Dios y milagrosamente, el barco y sus pasajeros se salvaron. Incluso después de esta experiencia, Newton no se convirtió inmediatamente. En 1754, cuando se enfermó gravemente durante un viaje por mar, Newton experimentó otra conversión, abandonó sus costumbres anteriores y dedicó su vida a Dios. Posteriormente luchó por la abolición de la trata de esclavos. El himno expresa la profunda gratitud de Newton por la gracia salvadora de Dios a pesar de su turbulento pasado.

En el camino de nuestra propia vida, estamos llamados a reconocer la presencia de Dios y renovar continuamente nuestra fe en su salvación. En nuestra primera lectura, el profeta Isaías proclamó: *"Aquí está tu Dios ... que viene a salvarte. Entonces se abrirán los ojos de los ciegos, se aclararán los oídos de los sordos"*. Del mismo modo, en nuestra segunda lectura, Santiago nos dice que Dios ha elegido a los que son *"pobres en el mundo"* para hacerlos *"ricos en fe y herederos del reino"*. Esta es la **Buena Noticia**: Dios ha venido a salvarnos, no porque seamos dignos, sino por su misericordia. Nos eleva para ser herederos de su reino y nos eleva a la vida eterna. En respuesta a la bondad de Dios, cantemos las palabras del Salmo 146: *¡Alabado sea el Señor, alma mía!*

Nuestro Señor Jesucristo mostró misericordia y compasión por su pueblo mientras viajaba por Galilea. Nosotros también estamos llamados a mostrar misericordia a los demás, sin parcialidad ni distinción. Mediante la gracia de Dios y nuestros actos de bondad, otros llegarán a conocer a Jesús y su poder salvador. Así como la gente trajo al sordo de nuestro Evangelio a Jesús, nosotros estamos llamados a llevar a los necesitados al Señor para que los curen y se conviertan. **¡Ephphatha! ¡Ábrete!** Que nuestros sentidos se abran a la asombrosa gracia de Dios.

¿Cómo podemos mostrar misericordia a los necesitados? ¿Cómo podemos poner fin a las distinciones entre nuestros hermanos y hermanas basadas en circunstancias externas?



Catholic Volunteers In Florida *Transforming Lives Through Faith and Service*

“How do we involve lay people in service to the communities in need Florida through the Church?”

Saint Peter Claver

A native of Spain, young Jesuit Peter Claver left his homeland forever in 1610 to be a missionary in the colonies of the New World. He sailed into Cartagena, a rich port city washed by the Caribbean. He was ordained there in 1615.



(June 26, 1581 - September 8, 1654)

Peter Claver's predecessor, Jesuit Father Alfonso de Sandoval, had devoted himself to the service of the slaves for 40 years before Claver arrived to continue his work, declaring himself "the slave of the Negroes forever."

As soon as a slave ship entered the port, Peter Claver moved into its infested hold to minister to the ill-treated and exhausted passengers. After the slaves were herded out of the ship like chained animals and shut up in nearby yards to be gazed at by the crowds, Claver plunged in among them with medicines, food, bread, brandy, lemons, and tobacco. With the help of interpreters he gave basic instructions and assured his brothers and sisters of their human dignity and God's love. During the 40 years of his ministry, Claver instructed and baptized an estimated 300,000 slaves.

Fr. Claver's apostolate extended beyond his care for slaves. He became a moral force, indeed, the apostle of Cartagena. He preached in the city square, gave missions to sailors and traders as well as country missions, during which he avoided, when possible, the hospitality of the planters and owners and lodged in the slave quarters instead.

After four years of sickness, which forced the saint to remain inactive and largely neglected, Claver died on September 8, 1654. The city magistrates, who had previously frowned at his solicitude for the black outcasts, ordered that he should be buried at public expense and with great pomp.

Peter Claver was canonized in 1888, and Pope Leo XIII declared him the worldwide patron of missionary work among black slaves.

Our Lady of Czestochowa (miraculous painting)


Our Lady of Czestochowa, or the Black Madonna of Poland, is a very famous painting of the Blessed Virgin holding the Child Jesus. Under this title, Mary is the Patron and Protector of Poland.



The painting of the Madonna has a long history. Legend has it that it was painted by Saint Luke on a piece of a cedar tabletop built by Saint Joseph. Some even say it is part of the table used at the Last Supper. Saint Helen found this painting when she went to Jerusalem in search of the true cross. She gave the painting to her son, Constantine. When the city of Constantinople was invaded by the Saracens, the people prayed to Mary and the city was saved. This began the great devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary attached to this painting.

In 1655 Swedes invaded Poland. The people prayed to Mary, and Poland was again saved from the invaders through the intercession of Mary. Our Lady of Czestochowa was thus crowned as the Queen of Poland, and this icon became the symbol of national unity.

The Church honors Mary, the Mother of God, in various ways. Mary can intercede for us, as is evidenced by the many healings and miracles that have been attributed to prayers to Our Lady of Czestochowa over the years.

Canonized by St. Pope John Paul II in Rome on Oct. 18, 1987, **St. Lorenzo Ruiz** was martyred during the persecution of Christians in Japan during the 17th century while on a missionary expedition. A layman with a wife and three children, he lived out his faith as an active member of his parish community. In addition to being a patron for laypersons and married people, he is known for being a saint of the poor because he was a poor sacristan from Binondo, Manila. He is also a patron saint for artists because he was skilled in calligraphy when he was employed by the Dominican Fathers. His feast day is Sept. 28.

Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI canonized **St. Pedro Calungsod** on World Mission Sunday in 2012. The saint was martyred April 2, 1672 when he was 17 — one week before Palm Sunday. He began serving God when he was 13 as a missionary for the Jesuits. With Jesuit Father Diego Luis de San Vitores, he traveled to Guam to catechize the native Chamorros. They were attacked and killed when the village chief learned his baby daughter was baptized. It is believed St. Pedro could have escaped the attackers but did not want to leave Father Diego alone. His feast day is April 2.

Update and Follow Up DMI Survey Coming




