
This week we celebrate *catechists* on Catechetical Sunday, which takes place on the third Sunday in September. Catechists are those who teach the Catholic faith and share the Church's teachings with others. As a parish and Church community, we acknowledge and thank the dedication of those who serve as catechists. We also give thanks to parents and guardians, since they are the first catechists in their families.

Catechetical Sunday is an opportunity for **all Catholics** to rededicate themselves to the mission of handing on the faith and being a witness to the Gospel as a community of faith, by word and by the way we live. Parents and guardians are also catechists; they are the first and primary teachers of the faith for their children. For Jesus, children are of great importance in the kingdom of God: *"Let the children come to me; do not prevent them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these. Amen, I say to you, whoever does not accept the kingdom of God like a child will not enter it"* (Mk 10:14-15). In our Gospel this Sunday, Jesus said: *"Whoever receives one child such as this in my name, receives me"* (Mk 9:37). When we serve the least among us, we serve Jesus himself.

Our Lord also teaches that those who would be first in God's kingdom must *"be the last of all and the servant of all."* Let us not be afraid to be the least and the servant of all, for that is the key to true greatness. And let us not be afraid to be like little children, for that is the way to enter the kingdom of God.

How can we receive the children of God in our lives, especially in the Church's mission of catechesis? How can we be a witness to the Gospel and share our faith with others in the spirit of service and humility?

Mis queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo,



Cuando servimos a los más pequeños entre nosotros, servimos al mismo Jesús.

Nuestro Señor también enseña que aquellos que serían los primeros en el reino de Dios deben *"ser los últimos de todos y los siervos de todos"*. No tengamos miedo de ser los más pequeños y los servidores de todos, porque esa es la clave de la verdadera grandeza. Y no tengamos miedo de ser como niños, porque esa es la manera de entrar en el reino de Dios.

¿Cómo podemos recibir a los hijos de Dios en nuestra vida, especialmente en la misión de catequesis de la Iglesia? ¿Cómo podemos ser testigos del Evangelio y compartir nuestra fe con los demás con espíritu de servicio y humildad?

Saint Matthew

Matthew was a Jew who worked for the occupying Roman forces, collecting taxes from other Jews. The Romans were not scrupulous about what the “tax farmers” got for themselves. Hence the latter, known as “publicans,” were generally hated as traitors by their fellow Jews. The Pharisees lumped them with “sinners” (see Matthew 9:11-13). So it was shocking to them to hear Jesus call such a man to be one of his intimate followers.

Matthew got Jesus in further trouble by having a sort of going-away party at his house. The Gospel tells us that many tax collectors and “those known as sinners” came to the dinner. The Pharisees were still more badly shocked. What business did the supposedly great teacher have associating with such immoral people? Jesus’ answer was, “Those who are well do not need a physician, but the sick do. Go and learn the meaning of the words, ‘I desire mercy, not sacrifice.’ I did not come to call the righteous but sinners” (Matthew 9:12b-13). Jesus is not setting aside ritual and worship; he is saying that loving others is even more important.

No other particular incidents about Matthew are found in the New Testament. From such an unlikely situation, Jesus chose one of the foundations of the Church, a man others, judging from his job, thought was not holy enough for the position. But Matthew was honest enough to admit that he was one of the sinners Jesus came to call. He was open enough to recognize truth when he saw him. “And he got up and followed him” (Matthew 9:9b).

A Lion, Ox, Eagle, Angel?

What do a lion, ox, eagle, and angel have in common? They’re all symbols of the Gospel writers! The four Evangelists are often portrayed alongside a particular creature. What are these creatures, and what do they symbolize?

Matthew’s symbol is a man because he begins his Gospel with Christ’s human genealogy, focusing on Christ the Man.

Mark is represented by a lion because his Gospel starts off with a roar. Right away in the first chapter, we are confronted with the fiery words of St. John the Baptist, the “voice of one crying in the wilderness.”

Luke is accompanied by an ox, an animal of sacrifice. This is because the first event he recounts is the apparition of the Angel Gabriel to Zechariah, the father of St. John the Baptist. Zechariah, a priest, is offering sacrifice to God in the temple when St. Gabriel appears to announce the impending birth of St. John.

An eagle is the companion of St. John, because in his Gospel, St. John “soars” above earthly events to contemplate the Divinity of Christ. His narrative begins with these sublime words: “In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.”

Catechetical Sunday is a wonderful opportunity to reflect on the role that each person plays, by virtue of Baptism, in handing on the faith and being a witness to the Gospel. This year, the Church celebrates Catechetical Sunday on September 19, 2021, and the theme is: “*Say the Word and My Soul Shall be Healed.*” Those who the parish community has designated to serve as catechists will be called forth to be commissioned for their ministry. Passing of Father Andrzej “Andrew” Pietraszko

We are saddened to announce the death of alum Father Andrzej “Andrew” Pietraszko (2002) on August 27, 2021. Fr. Pietraszko was ordained a priest in 2003 for the Archdiocese of Miami. While he had served at parishes and as a high school chaplain, in the past three years he has been ministering to the sick at Baptist Hospital as their Chaplain.

After his ordination on May 10, 2003, he was assigned as parochial vicar at St. Bernadette in Hollywood (2003-04). Subsequent assignments included parochial vicar at St. Louis, Pinecrest (2004-05 and 2005-08); St. Katharine Drexel, Weston (2005); St. Brendan, Miami (2008-09); St. Mary Star of the Sea, Key West (2009); and in residence at St. Mary Magdalen, Sunny Isles Beach (2009-10) and St. Kieran, Miami (2010-11).
