Jesus told him, "Go your way; your faith has saved you."

- Mk 10:46-52

My dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,


In last Sunday's Gospel, we heard about James and John requesting from Jesus, "We want you to do whatever we ask of you." Jesus' response reflects that of a servant-king, "What do you want me to do for you?" The brothers wished for places of honor and authority, but Jesus tells them, "You do not know what you are asking". This Sunday, we hear Jesus asking Bartimaeus the same question, "What do you want me to do for you?" This time, the blind man humbly replied, "Master, I want to see."

What do you ask of Jesus when you pray? Our Gospel from last and this Sunday not only teach us about discipleship but also prayer. Recall how often Jesus refers to the humility of children as a measure of greatness in the kingdom of God. As we get older, our perceived needs become more sophisticated and self-centered; hence we do not always see the fruits of our prayer "immediately", as with Bartimaeus. The other aspect of prayer is trust. The more we trust in God, the more he can do great things for us.

Although Bartimaeus was blind, he could still hear and speak. In fact, we know that when a person lacks one of the senses, the other senses become more sensitive. Lacking sight, he had to face many obstacles daily. Mark tells us that he was begging by the roadside. Like Bartimaeus, we may not be able to directly witness Jesus' saving actions, but we can listen and respond through the witness of others. When Bartimaeus heard that Jesus was passing by, he gathered all his courage and cried out to Jesus for mercy, realizing that this may be his only opportunity. Today, we have many ways to encounter Jesus, especially in the Eucharist. How often are we cognizant of his presence and mercy?

Reflection Questions: If you were part of this scene, which character would you be? Would you be in the crowd that rebukes the blind man for having faith in Jesus? Would you be one of the disciples who echoes Jesus to others: "Take courage; get up, Jesus is calling you"? Or would you be the blind man who suffered greatly and placed all his hope in Jesus? Which do you desire more: physical vision, or spiritual insight?

Mis Queridos Hermanos y Hermanas en Cristo,


En el Evangelio del domingo pasado, escuchamos que Santiago y Juan le pidieron a Jesús: "Queremos que haga lo que te pidamos". La respuesta de Jesús refleja la de un rey-siervo: "¿Qué quieres que haga por ti?" Los hermanos deseaban lugares de honor y autoridad, pero Jesús les dice: "No sabéis lo que pedís". Este domingo, escuchamos a Jesús hacerle a Bartimeo la misma pregunta: "¿Qué quieres que haga por ti?" Esta vez, el ciego respondió humildemente: "Maestro, quiero ver".

¿Qué le pides a Jesús cuando oras? Nuestro Evangelio del pasado y de este domingo no solo nos enseña sobre el discipulado, sino también sobre la oración. Recuerde cuán a menudo Jesús se refiere a la humildad de los niños como una medida de grandeza en el reino de Dios. A medida que envejecemos, nuestras necesidades percibidas se vuelven más sofisticadas y egocéntricas; de ahí que no siempre veamos los frutos de nuestra oración "inmediatamente", como con Bartimeo. El otro aspecto de la oración es la confianza. Cuanto más confiamos en Dios, más puede hacer grandes cosas por nosotros.

Aunque Bartimeo era ciego, aún podía oír y hablar. De hecho, sabemos que cuando una persona carece de uno de los sentidos, los otros sentidos se vuelven más sensibles. Al carecer de vista, tuvo que enfrentarse a muchos obstáculos a diario. Mark nos dice que estaba pidiendo limosna junto al camino. Como Bartimeo, es posible que no podamos presenciar directamente las acciones salvadoras de Jesús, pero podemos escuchar y responder a través del testimonio de los demás. Cuando Bartimeo escuchó que Jesús pasaba, reunió todo su valor y clamó a Jesús por misericordia, dándose cuenta de que esta podría ser su única oportunidad. Hoy tenemos muchas formas de encontrarnos con Jesús, especialmente en la Eucaristía. ¿Con qué frecuencia somos conscientes de su presencia y misericordia?

Preguntas de reflexión: Si fueras parte de esta escena, ¿qué personaje serías? ¿Estarías en la multitud que reprende al ciego por tener fe en Jesús? ¿Serías uno de los discípulos que se hace eco de Jesús a los demás: "¡Anímate; levántate, Jesús te está llamando!"? ¿O serías el ciego que sufrió mucho y puso toda su esperanza en Jesús? ¿Qué deseas más: la visión física o la percepción espiritual?

Blessed Bartholomew of Vicenza

Dominicans honor one of their own today, Blessed Bartholomew of Vicenza. This was a man who used his skills as a preacher to challenge the heresies of his day.



(c. 1200 – 1271)

Bartholomew was born in Vicenza around 1200. At 20, he entered the Dominicans. Following his ordination, he served in various leadership positions. As a young priest, he founded a military order whose purpose was to keep civil peace in towns throughout Italy.

In 1248, Bartholomew was appointed a bishop. For most men, such an appointment is an honor and a tribute to their holiness and their demonstrated leadership skills. But for Bartholomew, it was a form of exile that had been urged by an antipapal group that was only too happy to see him leave for Cyprus. Not many years later, however, Bartholomew was transferred back to Vicenza. Despite the antipapal feelings that were still evident, he worked diligently—especially through his preaching—to rebuild his diocese and strengthen the people’s loyalty to Rome.

During his years as bishop in Cyprus, Bartholomew befriended King Louis IX of France, who is said to have given the holy bishop a relic of Christ’s Crown of Thorns.

Bartholomew died in 1271, and was beatified in 1793.

Despite oppositions and obstacles, Bartholomew remained faithful to his ministry to God’s People. We face daily challenges to our faithfulness and duties as well. Perhaps Bartholomew could


