

He said to them,  
“Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing.”  
- Lk 1:21

*With Christ as our center, we will embrace ALL SOULS as we worship, welcome, educate  
and serve in an environment of love and compassion.*

My Dear Brothers and Sisters In Christ,

*The Word of the Lord is spirit and life! Thanks be the God!*

Our readings on this Third Sunday in Ordinary Time invite us to reflect deeply on the role of God's Word in our lives. In an effort to rebuild the nation after their exile, Ezra the priest had to begin with fortifying the spiritual foundations of the people of Israel. The people realized that the suffering they went through was a result of ignoring God's laws. The hearing and obeying of God's Word had to be first priority. Thus, at an assembly from dawn until noon, Ezra read and interpreted the book of the Law to the people. They listened attentively and engaged in what we would today call the "Liturgy of the Word".


Though they initially wept, Ezra and Nehemiah commanded the people to rejoice and be glad! That tells us that even when we are filled with sorrow for not keeping God's laws, our sadness must not exceed our thanksgiving in the Lord, for he is forgiving and merciful. However, that does not mean we are to keep breaking his laws. God gave us his laws to lead us to happiness and eternal life. When we choose to go a different path than what God intends, we bring about the consequences to ourselves. **"Your word is a lamp for my feet, a light on my path" (Ps 119: 105).** When we try to live life without God's word, we are walking in darkness. If we fall, it is because we have not turned on the light!

In our Gospel reading, Jesus proclaimed to the people his identity and mission as the *Christos*, the Anointed One. We, too, have been ANOINTED at our Baptism; let us not forget that we also share in the identity and mission of Christ each day. Jesus went on to proclaim: **"Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing."** This should remind us that "the word of God is living and active" (Heb 4:12) each time we hear it! God's word continues to be fulfilled in us TODAY if only we would listen as thirstily as the people did in Ezra's time.

Finally, St. Paul teaches us, in the Second Reading, that we are a community of disciples, the **Body of Christ**. We cannot live a life of faith alone; we need one another. We need to share our faith, even if it is to simply pray together. We need God's word to guide our path, and we also need one another to make it through this life of trials and difficulties, in preparation for the fullness of ETERNAL JOY in the Communion of Saints.

**Reflection questions:** *How can we make the hearing of God's Word a part of our daily routines? How can we better prepare for the hearing of God's Word at Mass? How can we be united in our faith in Christ?*

Queridos Hermanos y Hermanas en Cristo,

*¡La Palabra del Señor es espíritu y vida! ¡Gracias sea Dios!*

Nuestras lecturas de este Tercer Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario nos invitan a reflexionar profundamente sobre el papel de la Palabra de Dios en nuestras vidas. En un esfuerzo por reconstruir la nación después de su exilio, el sacerdote Esdras tuvo que comenzar por fortalecer los cimientos espirituales del pueblo de Israel. La gente se dio cuenta de que el sufrimiento por el que pasaban era el resultado de ignorar las leyes de Dios. El escuchar y obedecer la Palabra de Dios tenía que ser la primera prioridad. Así, en una asamblea desde el amanecer hasta el mediodía, Esdras leyó e interpretó el libro de la Ley al pueblo. Escucharon atentamente y se comprometieron en lo que hoy llamaríamos la "Liturgia de la Palabra".


¡Aunque inicialmente lloraron, Esdras y Nehemías ordenaron al pueblo que se regocijara y se alegrara! Eso nos dice que aun cuando estemos llenos de tristeza por no guardar las leyes de Dios, nuestra tristeza no debe exceder nuestra acción de gracias en el Señor, porque él es perdonador y misericordioso. Sin embargo, eso no significa que debemos seguir quebrantando sus leyes. Dios nos dio sus leyes para conducirnos a la felicidad y la vida eterna. Cuando elegimos ir por un camino diferente al que Dios quiere, traemos las consecuencias para nosotros mismos. **"Lámpara es a mis pies tu palabra, lumbrera a mi camino" (Sal 119, 105).** Cuando tratamos de vivir la vida sin la palabra de Dios, estamos caminando en la oscuridad. ¡Si nos caemos es porque no hemos encendido la luz!

En nuestra lectura del Evangelio, Jesús proclamó a la gente su identidad y misión como el *Christos*, el Ungido. Nosotros también hemos sido UNGIDOS en nuestro Bautismo; no olvidemos que también nosotros compartimos cada día la identidad y misión de Cristo. Jesús pasó a proclamar: **"Hoy se cumple este pasaje de las Escrituras en presencia de ustedes"**. ¡Esto debería recordarnos que "la palabra de Dios es viva y eficaz" (Hebreos 4:12) cada vez que la escuchamos! La palabra de Dios continúa cumpliéndose en nosotros HOY si tan solo la escucháramos con tanta sed como lo hizo la gente en el tiempo de Esdras.

Finalmente, San Pablo nos enseña, en la Segunda Lectura, que somos una comunidad de discípulos, el **Cuerpo de Cristo**. No podemos vivir una vida de fe solos; nos necesitamos unos a otros. Necesitamos compartir nuestra fe, incluso si es simplemente para orar juntos. Necesitamos la palabra de Dios para guiar nuestro camino, y también nos necesitamos unos a otros para atravesar esta vida de pruebas y dificultades, en preparación para la plenitud de la ALEGRÍA ETERNA en la Comunión de los Santos.

**Preguntas de reflexión:** *¿Cómo podemos hacer que escuchar la Palabra de Dios sea parte de nuestras rutinas diarias? ¿Cómo podemos prepararnos mejor para escuchar la Palabra de Dios en la Misa? ¿Cómo podemos estar unidos en nuestra fe en Cristo?*

## Saint Angela Merici



(March 21, 1474 – January 27, 1540)

Angela Merici has the double distinction of founding the first of what are now called “secular institutes” and the first teaching order of women in the Church.

Born in Desenzano, Italy, she was orphaned in her teens. As a young woman, with her heart centered on Christ, Angela joined the Third Order of St. Francis and embraced austerity. In a visionary experience, she felt called to found a “company” of women. Angela was invited to become a live-in companion for a widow in the nearby town of Brescia. There she became the spiritual advisor of a group of men and women with ideals of spiritual renewal and service to those in need. While on a pilgrimage to the Holy Land in 1524, Angela was struck with blindness. She proceeded to visit the sacred shrines, seeing them with her spirit. On the way back while praying before a crucifix, Angela’s sight was restored.

At age 60, Angela and 12 other women began the Company of St. Ursula, named for a patroness of medieval universities and venerated as a leader of women. This constituted a new way of life: single women consecrated to Christ and living in the world rather than in a monastery. With Angela as their “mother and mistress,” Company members did not live in community, wore no special clothing, and made no formal vows.

Angela Merici died in Brescia, Italy, in 1540. Clothed in the habit of a Franciscan tertiary, her body was interred in Brescia’s Church of Saint’ Afra. Four years later the Company’s Rule that Angela had composed, prescribing the practices of chastity, poverty and obedience, was approved by the pope.

In the early 1600s, Companies that had expanded into France were re-organized into the religious Order of St. Ursula, to teach girls. Angela’s words continue to inspire the Ursuline nuns’ mission of education, a mission that spread worldwide. The Company of St. Ursula also continued to exist and is federated worldwide today with members in 30 countries.

As with so many saints, history is mostly concerned with their activities. But deep Christian faith and love sustain one whose courage lasts a lifetime, and who can take bold new steps when human need demands.

May this New Year of 2022 be one of hope, joy and filled with many blessings!


