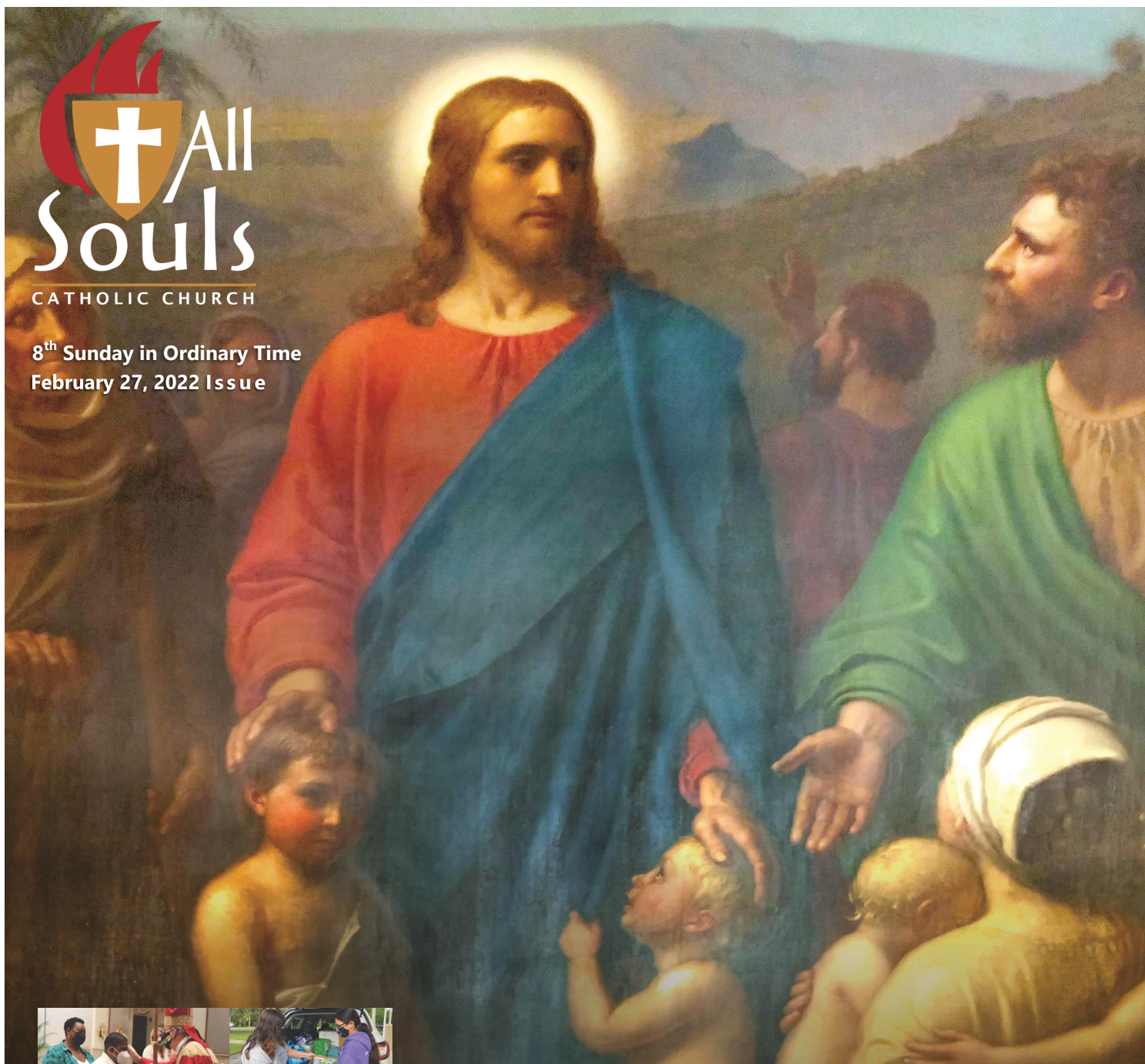

# THIS SUNDAY'S Gospel Reflection

My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Today's readings exhort us Christian disciples to form ourselves — mind and heart — in imitation of Christ so we can better reflect His goodness in our daily lives.

The first reading from Sirach offers timeless counsel: "the fruit of a tree shows the care it has had: so too does one's speech disclose the bent of one's mind. Praise no one before he speaks." Jesus uses the very same analogy in today's Gospel reading from Luke. "A good tree does not bear rotten fruit, nor does a rotten tree bear good fruit. For every tree is known by its own fruit." Jesus explains, "A good person out of the store of goodness in his heart produces good... for from the fullness of the heart the mouth speaks."

Everything we have is a gift from God to be used for His honor and glory. This includes the gift of speech and, even more broadly, all forms of modern-day communication — email, text, Twitter, Facebook and the rest. What comes forth from our mouths, or keyboard, or phone, is a reflection of what is in our minds and hearts. Our ability to communicate with each other is itself a gift that we must steward well.

In the same Gospel passage, Jesus reminds us, "No disciple is superior to the teacher; but when fully trained, every disciple will be like his teacher." We must therefore be trained by Jesus our teacher so that our minds and hearts will be aligned with His mind and heart, and our speech (and actions for that matter) will reflect His goodness.

How do we obtain this training? Thankfully, we have an abundance of supernatural "training materials" at our disposal. First and foremost, we can spend time with the Teacher, our Lord: we can study His life through reading the Scriptures, and we can listen and speak with Him in quiet, regular times of prayer. We can expand our faith knowledge through study of the Catechism of the Catholic Church. We can find healing and strength in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Amazingly, we can partake of His Body and Blood in the Eucharist.

The more intentionally and frequently we make use of these means, the more we will become like our Teacher and Lord. Then, all that we do and say (and tweet and post) will bring others closer to Him. This is the life's work of the Christian steward. It is privileged work indeed.

Mis queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo,

Las lecturas de hoy nos exhortan a los discípulos cristianos a formarnos —mente y corazón— en la imitación de Cristo para que podamos reflejar mejor su bondad en nuestra vida diaria.

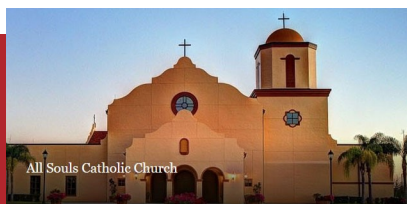
La primera lectura del Eclesiástico ofrece un consejo eterno: "el fruto de un árbol muestra el cuidado que ha tenido: así también el discurso de uno revela la inclinación de la mente. No alaben a nadie antes de que hable". Jesús usa la misma analogía en la lectura del Evangelio de hoy de Lucas. "Un buen árbol no da frutos podridos, ni un árbol podrido da frutos buenos. Porque cada árbol se conoce por su propio fruto." Jesús explica: "La persona buena, del caudal de bondad que hay en su corazón produce el bien... porque de la plenitud del corazón habla la boca".

Todo lo que tenemos es un regalo de Dios para ser usado para su honra y gloria. Esto incluye el don del habla y, aún más ampliamente, todas las formas de comunicación modernas: correo electrónico, mensajes de texto, Twitter, Facebook y el resto. Lo que sale de nuestra boca, teclado o teléfono es un reflejo de lo que hay en nuestra mente y corazón. Nuestra capacidad de comunicarnos entre nosotros es en sí misma un regalo que debemos administrar bien.

En el mismo pasaje del Evangelio, Jesús nos recuerda: "Ningún discípulo es superior al maestro; pero cuando esté completamente entrenado, cada discípulo será como su maestro." Por lo tanto, debemos ser entrenados por Jesús, nuestro maestro, para que nuestras mentes y corazones estén alineados con Su mente y corazón, y nuestro habla (y nuestras acciones) reflejen Su bondad.

¿Cómo obtenemos esta formación? Afortunadamente, tenemos una gran cantidad de "materiales de entrenamiento" sobrenaturales a nuestra disposición. Ante todo, podemos pasar tiempo con el Maestro, nuestro Señor: podemos estudiar Su vida a través de la lectura de las Escrituras, y podemos escucharlo y hablar con Él en momentos tranquilos y regulares de oración. Podemos ampliar nuestro conocimiento de la fe mediante el estudio del Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica. Podemos encontrar sanidad y fortaleza en el Sacramento de la Reconciliación. Sorprendentemente, podemos participar de Su Cuerpo y Sangre en la Eucaristía.

Cuanto más intencional y frecuentemente hagamos uso de estos medios, más seremos como nuestro Maestro y Señor. Entonces, todo lo que hacemos y decimos (y tuiteamos y publicamos) acercará a otros a Él. Esta es la obra de la vida del mayordomo cristiano. Es un trabajo privilegiado de hecho.

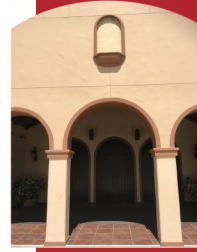

## Saint Maria Bertilla Boscardin

If anyone knew rejection, ridicule and disappointment, it was this saint. But such trials only brought Maria Bertilla Boscardin closer to God and more determined to serve him.

Born in Italy in 1888, the young girl lived in fear of her father, a violent man prone to jealousy and drunkenness. Her schooling was limited so that she could spend more time helping at home and working in the fields.



(October 6, 1888 – October 20, 1922)

In 1904, she joined the Sisters of Saint Dorothy and was assigned to work in the kitchen, bakery and laundry. After some time Maria received nurses' training and began working in a hospital with children suffering from diphtheria. There the young nun seemed to find her true vocation: nursing very ill and disturbed children. Later, when the hospital was taken over by the military in World War I, Sister Maria Bertilla fearlessly cared for patients amidst the threat of constant air raids and bombings.

She died in 1922 after suffering for many years from a painful tumor. Some of the patients she had nursed many years before were present at her canonization in 1961. This fairly recent saint knew the hardships of living in an abusive situation. Let us pray to her to help all those who are suffering from any form of spiritual, mental, or physical abuse.



## March 2nd Ash Wednesday

Ash Wednesday opens Lent, a season of fasting and prayer, which comes from the ancient Jewish tradition of penance and fasting. It includes receiving ashes on our forehead to symbolize the dust from which God made us. Join us for our Ash Wednesday Services:

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday (April 15th) are days of fast and abstinence. The Fridays of Lent are also days of abstinence.

**Fasting** is observed by all 18 years of age and older, who have not yet celebrated their 59th birthday. One full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and juices, are allowed.

**Abstinence** is observed by all 14 years of age and older. On days of abstinence no meat is allowed. Note that when health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. When in doubt concerning fast and abstinence, the parish priest should be consulted.

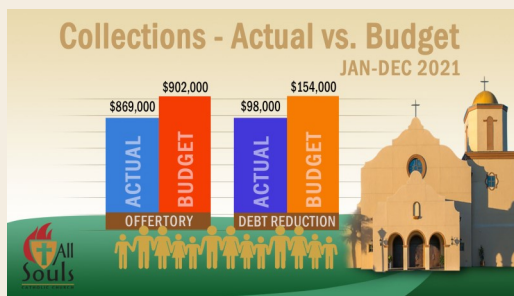

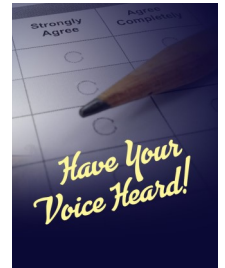
### Word of God: Scripture & Tradition

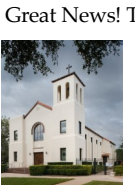
