

Return to The Eucharist In-Person:
Diocese restores obligation to attend Sunday Mass starting 4/10

A Letter From Bishop Noonan

The Diocese of Orlando has restored the obligation to participate in the Eucharist in-person on Sundays, and other holy days of obligation, as of **Palm Sunday, April 10, 2022.**

"By participating in the Eucharist feast, we become what we receive. For, each time we receive, we come to life again. God offers Himself to us that we know our greatest dignity is through, with and in Him."

My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Pope St. John Paul II rightly taught, "To believe in Jesus is to accept what he says, even when it runs contrary to what others are saying. It means rejecting the lure of sin, however attractive it may be, in order to set out on a difficult path of Gospel virtues." Acceptance, rejection, suffering, betrayal, fear, reluctance, persecution, and painful, undeserved and unjust death are all played out in dramatic fashion today. Jesus spoke of God's unconditional love, mercy, and forgiveness. Who doesn't like hearing about love, especially God's? Jesus did not have backs turned on him, face intense suffering, and succumb to a horrific death because he spoke of God's love. All of those things occurred because of the implications of actually believing in God's love.

God's love comes with an intimate and equal bond with love of neighbor. This moves the believer outward to truly see their brothers and sisters as equals and compels them to work for a world that mirrors God's kingdom: a world based on justice, peace, mercy, and forgiveness. Sometimes, people want to keep God's love to themselves and use it solely for their own benefit. When they only want to use God's love to justify their own intentions and for their own projects, problems occur.

Sin makes something hurtful, destructive, and self-serving look very attractive and justifiable. The lure of sin creates friends who begin to believe the lie that the sin expounds. This is what happened on Calvary. When you begin actually doing what Jesus is saying and translate love into action, it inevitably will upset popular and longstanding conventions and structures. Many of these serve to protect status, foster personal gain and success, and further divide those who have from those who do not. Most people who hear the Gospel are attracted to what they hear, at first. When they realize that it means standing apart from popular opinion, even if that opinion is against the Gospel and sinful, they cower back in fear and join the throngs shouting, "Crucify him!" There is an ambivalence found in many believers as they struggle with whether their belief is strong enough "to set out on the difficult path of Gospel virtues."

It takes a lot of courage to admit that the system is broken. It takes even more courage to point out the sin. And it takes an unbreakable love of God to then accept the consequences of doing so.


Mis queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo,

El Papa San Juan Pablo II enseñó correctamente: "Creer en Jesús es aceptar lo que dice, incluso cuando va en contra de lo que dicen los demás. Significa rechazar el señuelo del pecado, por atractivo que sea, para emprender el difícil camino de las virtudes evangélicas". La aceptación, el rechazo, el sufrimiento, la traición, el miedo, la desganancia, la persecución y la muerte dolorosa, inmerecida e injusta se manifiestan hoy de manera dramática. Jesús habló del amor incondicional, la misericordia y el perdón de Dios. ¿A quién no le gusta oír hablar del amor, especialmente del de Dios? Jesús no le dio la espalda, enfrentó un sufrimiento intenso y sucumbió a una muerte horrible porque habló del amor de Dios. Todas esas cosas ocurrieron debido a las implicaciones de creer realmente en el amor de Dios.

El amor de Dios viene con un vínculo íntimo e igualitario con el amor al prójimo. Esto mueve al creyente a ver verdaderamente a sus hermanos y hermanas como iguales y lo impulsa a trabajar por un mundo que refleje el reino de Dios: un mundo basado en la justicia, la paz, la misericordia y el perdón. A veces, las personas quieren quedarse con el amor de Dios y usarlo únicamente para su propio beneficio. Cuando sólo quieren usar el amor de Dios para justificar sus propias intenciones y para sus propios proyectos, surgen problemas.

El pecado hace que algo hiriente, destructivo y egoísta parezca muy atractivo y justificable. El atractivo del pecado crea amigos que comienzan a creer la mentira que expone el pecado. Esto es lo que sucedió en el Calvario. Cuando comienzas a hacer realmente lo que Jesús dice y traduces el amor en acción, inevitablemente alterarás las convenciones y estructuras populares y de larga data. Muchos de estos sirven para proteger el estatus, fomentar la ganancia y el éxito personal y dividir aún más a los que tienen de los que no. La mayoría de las personas que escuchan el Evangelio se sienten atraídas por lo que escuchan, al principio. Cuando se dan cuenta de que significa apartarse de la opinión popular, incluso si esa opinión es contraria al Evangelio y pecaminosa, se encogen de miedo y se unen a la multitud que grita: "¡Crucifícalo!". Se encuentra una ambivalencia en muchos creyentes mientras luchan con si su creencia es lo suficientemente fuerte "para emprender el difícil camino de las virtudes del Evangelio".

Se necesita mucho coraje para admitir que el sistema está roto. Se necesita aún más coraje para señalar el pecado. Y se necesita un amor inquebrantable por Dios para luego aceptar las consecuencias de hacerlo.


All Souls Cemetery and Community

Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion



What Palm Sunday Means

There is both great joy and terrible sorrow associated with this day, the Sunday that begins Holy Week, the Sunday that portends the crucifixion of Our Lord.

It is a time of despair, perplexity and contradiction. The very people who applaud Christ's entrance into Jerusalem that morning, shouting out "Hosanna" and words of adoration will, within a week, be crying, "Crucify Him."

According to the Gospel of St. John, Jesus and many of his followers journeyed the less than

two miles from Bethany on that Sunday, arriving outside Jerusalem. Those arriving with and greeting Jesus were large in number as explained by John's Gospel: "When the great crowd ... heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem, they took palm branches and went out to meet him, and cried out: 'Hosanna! / Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord, [even] the king of Israel!'" (12:12-13).

Previously, Our Lord had deliberately avoided popular acclaim, even fled, but this, upon entering Jerusalem, He accepts. Instead of entering Jerusalem on a war horse or chariot, he enters on a donkey, a sign of peace; and not just any donkey, but one on which no one had ever sat, the prerogative of a king.

Riding on the borrowed donkey, Jesus made His humble entrance into the city while the crowds were scattering their garments before Him and waving their palm branches. Palms were symbols of life among the nomadic tribes, who, when crossing the desert, rejoiced at seeing the palm tree as it indicated an oasis with life-giving water was near. Palms have long been a sign of victory, success and glory.

On Palm Sunday, we still go out to meet Him, carry the blessed palms, joyfully sing out our hosanna and join in His triumphant entrance into Jerusalem. The palms we take home and put in a special place serve to remind us that Palm Sunday is not lost to the ages but that by Christ's victory we, too, can achieve everlasting life.

My Sisters and Brothers in Christ:

Grace and Peace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you this Lenten Season. During this Lenten Season, we are invited time and time again to celebrate our relationship with God. We are called, through prayer, fasting, and our acts of charity "to taste and see the goodness of the Lord", as the psalmist tell us - that we might be radiant with joy.

The Lenten Season is a time to draw near to God. In our conversations about how we can do that more fervently, the question of lifting the dispensation of the obligation to participate in the celebration of Mass on Sundays and other holy days of obligation established for the safety of people during the pandemic has been discussed.

We ache with longing to return to the Lord, both individually and as a community. As we ponder how to draw near to God, we cannot but think of the Gift of the Bread of Heaven. Our longing is most wonderfully fulfilled through our participation in the Eucharistic Feast on Sunday. For we know that participation in the communal celebration of the Sunday Eucharist is a testimony of belonging and being faithful to Christ and to His Church (CCC 2182).

In our time since the pandemic, we have experienced many changes in our world. Today, we find ourselves listening to headline news about war, human trafficking, and many other sins against God. But the Love of God is yesterday, today and forever. St. Paul tells us that our ministry is to imitate Christ; to bring forth Jesus' total self-giving love for all God's people. The Love of God is always inviting, always forgiving as Jesus reminds us in the parable of the Prodigal Son. The father welcomes the son and says, "let us celebrate with a feast."

It is time to offer ourselves selflessly and return to the Father, to celebrate with a feast. **Effective Palm Sunday, April 10, 2022, the obligation to participate in the Eucharist in person on Sundays and other holy days of obligation is restored.** During the pandemic, God gently prompts us of our care for each other by refraining from gathering when ill or in the care of someone who is ill. The Church has always excused those who are sick or care for infants or the elderly from this obligation. Those who deliberately fail in this obligation commit a grave sin. Mass times may have changed at your parish since you last participated in the celebration of Mass. Please be sure to check the parish website or call for Mass times.

By participating in the Eucharistic feast, we become what we receive. For, each time we receive, we come to life again. God offers Himself to us that we know our greatest dignity is through, with and in Him. Then, by this reception we are sent forth to bring Christ into the world. Yes, during the Lenten season and for ever. Our sisters and brothers living in the Ukraine are courageous examples for us. Even knowing the possibility of their death as they bear the fruit of their religious faith, they participate in the celebration of Mass because they understand their only source of life is through God. As we participate in the Eucharistic feast, we join in communion these sisters and brothers and so many others who are suffering.

At the sight of you entering God's house, we are filled with compassion at your return! Let us celebrate the new things to come.
