

Gospel Reflection

Freedom properly defined is freedom properly understood. The Cambridge Dictionary tells us that it is, *"the condition or right of being able or allowed to do, say, think, etc., whatever you want to, without being controlled or limited."* That same dictionary defines liberty as, *"the freedom to live, work, and travel as you want to."* Both definitions sound very similar. Is there a difference between freedom and liberty? Many are accustomed to believing that freedom and liberty are interchangeable and simply involve possessing rights and privileges. For the Christian, however, there is a big difference between the two.

St. John Chrysostom directs that *"the only person who is free is the one who lives for Christ."* There are many other inspirational people throughout history who see freedom as something far greater than liberty. True and properly understood freedom has little to do with entitlement or self-promotion. For the believer, it is a matter of the heart and soul. Freedom (and liberty, for that matter), seen only in terms of the world, can quickly be taken away. The freedom spoken of by St. John Chrysostom can only be lost by personal choice. When one lives for Christ, they live in pursuit of virtues that enlighten one's soul (faith, hope, and love) and strengthen one's character (justice, fortitude, temperance, and prudence). Rather than having the ability to acquire or do more things, true freedom asks us to be detached. Privileges, rights, and responsibilities are important, but they do not define us.

The world is not always open to listening to the truth. *"I am sending you like lambs among wolves,"* Jesus tells his disciples. The secular definitions of freedom and liberty are very attractive. They promise us a great deal. It is no wonder Jesus asks his disciples to travel with very little. The Gospel is not dependent upon things or anything those with worldly power or investment can say or do. When one chooses to live for Christ, they choose to live with peace. That's what true freedom will give us. If we do not want what Christ offers, we can close the door, and the messenger will walk away. Distracted by the lure of personal liberties, we risk losing our freedom. We will not have anything truly life-giving to share with others.


Reflexión del Evangelio

La libertad bien definida es la libertad bien entendida. El Diccionario de Cambridge nos dice que es, *"la condición o derecho de poder o permitir hacer, decir, pensar, etc., lo que se quiera, sin ser controlado ni limitado"*. Ese mismo diccionario define la libertad como *"la libertad de vivir, trabajar y viajar como quieras"*. Ambas definiciones suenan muy similares. ¿Hay alguna diferencia entre libertad y libertad? Muchos están acostumbrados a creer que la libertad y la libertad son intercambiables y simplemente implican poseer derechos y privilegios. Para el cristiano, sin embargo, hay una gran diferencia entre los dos.



San Juan Crisóstomo dirige que *"la única persona que es libre es la que vive para Cristo"*. Hay muchas otras personas inspiradoras a lo largo de la historia que ven la libertad como algo mucho más grande que la libertad. La libertad verdadera y correctamente entendida tiene poco que ver con el derecho o la autopromoción. Para el creyente, es un asunto del corazón y del alma. La libertad (y la libertad, para el caso), vista solo en términos del mundo, puede ser arrebatada rápidamente. La libertad de la que habla San Juan Crisóstomo sólo puede perderse por elección personal. Cuando se vive para Cristo, se vive en pos de las virtudes que iluminan el alma (fe, esperanza y amor) y fortalecen el carácter (justicia, fortaleza, templanza y prudencia). Más que tener la capacidad de adquirir o hacer más cosas, la verdadera libertad nos pide que nos desapeguemos. Los privilegios, derechos y responsabilidades son importantes, pero no nos definen.

El mundo no siempre está abierto a escuchar la verdad. *"Os envío como corderos en medio de lobos"*, dice Jesús a sus discípulos. Las definiciones seculares de libertad y libertad son muy atractivas. Nos prometen mucho. No es de extrañar que Jesús les pida a sus discípulos que viajen con muy poco. El Evangelio no depende de cosas ni de nada que puedan decir o hacer aquellos con poder o inversión mundanos. Cuando uno elige vivir para Cristo, elige vivir en paz. Eso es lo que nos dará la verdadera libertad. Si no queremos lo que Cristo ofrece, podemos cerrar la puerta y el mensajero se irá. Distráidos por el atractivo de las libertades personales, corremos el riesgo de perder nuestra libertad. No tendremos nada verdaderamente vivificante para compartir con los demás.

Celebrating All Souls Catholic Parish 135th Anniversary on July 4th!

It's hard to imagine, but All Souls Church has been around since July 4, 1887, when the cornerstone was first laid! Back in those days, horses were the main form of transportation, Grover Cleveland was president, and the first resident, Catholic priest of Orlando had only just arrived two years prior in 1885!

Originally, Fr. Felix Swembergh celebrated Mass in Doyle's Hall, which was near the wharf in Sanford. All Souls Church was later completed and dedicated on July 4, 1937. Much has changed since those

days, including the rebuilding of the original church after a fire in 1932. Today's "Historic Chapel" is the 1937 rebuilt church. Over the years, the parish added a rectory, convent, school, and cemetery. A new and larger church was built and celebrated its first Mass by 2008.

But, what really matters, what is at the heart of All Souls, is the people of the parish. All the dedicated parishioners, priests and nuns, who built the parish and God's kingdom on earth for so many decades. Their example is our inspiration for the next 100 years of building a faithful, loving community that perseveres, trusting in God's gracious providence.

We Welcome Fr. Jeremiah Payne to All Souls Parish!



Fr. Jeremiah Payne has been appointed pastor of All Souls Catholic Parish, and we welcome him with our hearts and prayers to lead our faith community. Fr. Jeremiah Payne hails from Forestville, NY, near Buffalo, and moved to Ocala, FL with his family in the early 1980s. While he was not raised in any religion, Fr. Jeremiah surrendered his life to Jesus Christ on his own as a teenager and found a

spiritual home in a local Pentecostal faith community. After discovering and assiduously studying the Early Church Fathers, however, he came to believe the obvious truth that the Catholic Church is the one true Church founded by Jesus Christ; consequently, he "came home" to the Catholic Church in 1998. Fr. Jeremiah transferred to Franciscan University in Steubenville, OH and, later, Ave Maria College in Ypsilanti, MI, after which he attended St. Vincent de Paul Regional Seminary in Boynton Beach.

In 2007, he was ordained to the sacred priesthood for the Diocese of Orlando. For two years, he served as parochial vicar at St. Margaret Mary in Winter Park and as chaplain of Bishop Moore Catholic High School in College Park. From 2009-2011, he was assigned to post-graduate studies in sacramental theology at the Pontifical University of St. Thomas Aquinas in Rome, after which he served for three years as an assistant professor of systematic theology at his alma mater, St. Vincent de Paul Regional Seminary. Following his teaching term, he served for two years as parochial vicar at Holy Name of Jesus in Indialantic. And, before being assigned as pastor of All Souls this summer, Fr. Jeremiah served as pastor of St. Joseph's in Palm Bay for six years where, similar to All Souls, he oversaw a parish church and historic chapel, a thriving parochial school, a growing Latin Mass community, and a parish cemetery. His interests and hobbies include theology, Ignatian spirituality, cinema, music, reading, travel, canoeing, aviation, craft beer, and a healthy dose of '80s nostalgia ("totally tubular, dude!").

How To Celebrate the Fourth of July, Catholic-Style

With a long Fourth of July weekend upon us, you may be wondering how to combine your celebration of Independence Day with your Catholic Faith. Here are three suggestions:



1 Honor the Catholic Contribution to the Declaration of Independence. You can learn of two such contributions in Brian Burch and Emily Stimson’s wonderful book, *The American Catholic Almanac*.

First, Thomas Jefferson’s phrase “*all men are created equal*” was inspired by an Italian Catholic named Philip Mazzei who wrote to Jefferson that “all men are by nature equally free and independent.” The U.S. Post Office honored Mazzei in 1980 with a stamp, but you can honor him with a glass of wine. How about a wine from Mazzei’s native Tuscany, or any wine you can find from Virginia, since it was Mazzei who “taught Virginia’s planters how to cultivate vineyards”? Quievremont wines, for example, are made in northern Virginia by the Guevremonts, a good Catholic family.

Or, you can honor Charles Carroll (1737–1832), the last surviving signer of the Declaration of Independence who also happened to be the only Catholic signatory. Carroll was not only the lone Catholic who signed the Declaration, he was also the wealthiest, which means that he had the most to lose in this risky political venture. There are twelve counties and two parishes in the U.S. that are named after Carroll.

2 Honor American Saints. Mother Cabrini, was the first U.S. citizen to be canonized. Or what about honoring the first native-born U.S. citizen to be canonized, St. Elizabeth Ann Seton. Lastly, you can honor the Jesuit North American Martyrs, the first to shed their blood for the Faith on these shores. “Black Robe” was a native American nickname for the Jesuits.

3 Honor the Holy Popes. Huh? Honor Popes on a day when everyone else is thinking of George Washington or Thomas Jefferson or John Adams? There just so happens to be an old optional feast that falls on July 4th known as the **Commemoration of All Holy Popes**. By our count, 80 out of the 266 Popes in history are canonized saints, which is not too bad. Pope St. John XXIII and Pope St. John Paul II are two recent examples. Raise a toast to the good leaders we have had as Americans and as Catholics, and pray to God for more. *(Excerpts from article in DWTS, July 2, 2015)*
