Words from Fr. Ed

Presented here is Fr. Ed's Reflection on last week's Gospel. We are catching up on our new bulletin system and its deadlines. Your patience is appreciated.

"Send Lazarus to dip the tip of his finger in water and cool my tongue..."

No apology, no excuse, only concern for self. This is hell. As one person describes it, hell is the place for people who refuse to be healed, who refuse to love. Love, which carries us out of ourselves into concern for others, doesn't exist in hell. As described in "A Soul in Hell - the Story of Annette" (found on YouTube), souls cannot love in hell, they can only hate.

The rich man in our Gospel is suffering this hatred. While he wants to warn his brothers, Abraham reveals that the faith sufficient to go to heaven is already lacking. Charity, the purpose for which we are made, had grown cold in them. While the rich man knew the name of Lazarus, he ignored his obvious needs, present at his gate. Remember, the rich man did not have a driveway that he could use to avoid him. The rich man would have used the gate on a daily basis. The rich man, oblivious to another, goes nameless.

The namelessness of the rich man can indicate for us how we lose our identity as beloved sons or daughters when we ignore the needs of those around us. Jesus' primary commandment, "Love one another", has no sway. We've refused to become what he has commanded, lovers of neighbor, which equates with, in Jesus' eyes, love of God.

How do we recover from such blindness and cold-heartedness? Real participation in the Mass is the primary means of God forming us as intentional disciples. I say "real" participation because I see attendees who refuse to sing along or respond to the dialogue of the Mass. People come and go without any expression of joy. Some seem to avoid engagement in the ministries of the parish. Participation, internal and external, would change that.



The primary intention of Vatican II was to encourage participation in the Mass, both internal and external. I emphasize these two components because of the polarization that occurred in our Church post-Vatican II drew many Catholics into two erroneous camps, one representing the "externalites", who focused excessively on visuals and an entertainment attitude toward music and architecture, while the "internalites" over-emphasized personal (private) engagement in the Mass without any concern for community or charity.

We need internal intimate prayer as well as communal gestures and engagement. St. John Paul II summarizes this need when he writes, "It is useless to play off orthopraxis (right practice) against orthodoxy (right belief): Christianity is inseparably both. Firm and well-thought - out convictions lead to courageous and upright action, the endeavor to educate the faithful to live as disciples of Christ today calls for and facilitates a discovery in depth of the mystery of Christ in the history of salvation." (Apostolic Exhortation - *Catechesi Tradendae* - On Catechesis In Our Time)

The more we engage the liturgy, the more God can engage

us through it. He wants to speak to us, to bless us, to heal us, to form us, and commission us to spread His love and truth. Let us pray for the grace to embrace Christ in the liturgy. We will find Lazarus my neighbor in the Mass under the distressing disguise of the poor.




