## Words from Fr. Ed

## ...he is not God of the dead, but of the living

Jesus proclaims what we as Catholics call the "communion of the saints". Souls of the dead don't die. They live forever in one place or another, either heaven, purgatory (eventually heaven), or hell. We pray to go "up" to heaven in order to be happy forever.

The journey up begins here, especially through the Holy Eucharist. I was asking during my homily this past weekend three examen questions:

- 1) How have I sought the Lord this past week? (Like Zacchaeus who sought to see the Lord)
- 2) How am I seeking the Lord during this Holy Mass?
- 3) How do I plan to seek the Lord this coming week?

The second question relates immediately to my relationship with heaven, as Jesus said "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood <u>has</u> eternal life..." (John 6:54) I emphasize the "has" in this sentence because it is present tense, meaning that it is when we say "amen" to the Sacred Host coming into me, I'm receiving eternal life within me. Jesus is simultaneously in heaven and in me. That connects me directly with heaven. That eternal life principle endures forever. I remain in His presence, which Jesus also affirms a few verses later, "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him." At my bodily death, my body fades into dust while my soul remains in His presence, the God "of the living".

The practice of these three examen questions around seeking the Lord could be very helpful. I also gave in my homily three spiritual direction questions:

- 1) What am I thinking?
- 2) What am I feeling?
- 3) What am I desiring?

These three questions can give a very good indication of what the Holy Spirit is trying to tell us, especially, but not restricted to, our prayer life. Like Zacchaeus from last week's Gospel, we need to get in touch with the deepest desire of our hearts. Let us ask the Holy Spirit to reveal to us this desire. Knowing it, we are in a better position to follow it.

## **Amazon Synod**

People are asking my opinion of the Amazon Synod, as much confusion and concern is flying through Catholic circles. I'll say briefly, given a lack of time, the basics. If I get the chance, I'll write more.

The Holy Spirit is the guarantor of the Church. The gates of hell, no matter how much Peter is sifted, shall not prevail. No pope or bishop can change the essentials of our Catholic faith. One must also distinguish between doctrine and discipline. Doctrine can never change in its essence, though how we express it may develop and nuance over time. Discipline (ie. the marriage of priests) could change today if the bishops approved. I trust the Holy Spirit to guide and guard the Church of Jesus Christ.



**Legislative Advocacy** - Did you know Washington state laws allow a minor child to obtain an abortion without her parents' knowledge? The Catholic Bishops of Washington state strongly support and encourage gathering signatures for Initiative 1004 (I-1004). I-1004 is an initiative

to the Washington state legislature to institute a "parental notification" law that will require physicians to notify parents or guardians before performing abortions on minors. Only with enough verifiable signatures of registered voters, will Initiative 1004 will be added to November 2020 ballots. Voters of Washington state will then have opportunity to vote FOR or AGAINST a "parental notification" law. 
