Words from Fr. Ed

Have pity on me, Lord, Son of David!

Our Lord puts this woman off for a few tries until she humbly admits her adopted status as a non-Jew. Jesus knew what He would do, but He also wants to test people so that they know what He is doing. In this case, He is exhibiting the existence of faith and salvation outside of Israel. She is literally outside of traditional Jewish territory. Jesus reaches out and draws her in.



This good woman shows us how to persevere in prayer. She doesn't give up, neither at the discouragement of the disciples, nor the resistance of Jesus. She is bold.

We, too, need to be bold these days. Jesus is 'holding out on us' in various ways and forcing us to persevere and really own our intentions. Why has the Church not been able to heal and deliver humanity from the coronavirus? Perhaps, like the demons that the disciples could not exorcise, we need to fast. Perhaps God wants our full attention and the allegiance of our hearts. Whatever the case, we need to grow closer to Him in order to find out. As our culture collapses in sin, perhaps Our Lord wants to raise up a more deeply adherent Catholic Christian culture.

To do that, our Archbishop has called for a Year of the Eucharist from June 14th, 2020 until June 6th, 2021. Please see the bulletin flyer enclosed or online. Along with a number of ways and recommendations from our Archbishop on how to grow in our Eucharistic faith, I want to recommend the gift of time. Time spent with Our Eucharistic Lord is the best way outside of Mass to grow in union with Jesus' sacramental presence. We are re-opening up our adoration program as quickly as possible given all the COVID restrictions that we observe.

Time with Our Lord reveals His living presence. He is alive and especially close to us in the Blessed Sacrament, reserved in our tabernacles for three main reasons:

- 1) Viaticum Last Holy Communion for those who are dying
- 2) Homebound Ongoing Holy Communion for those who cannot come to Mass
- 3) Prayer and Devotion Time spent close to Jesus

You can check on how you, too, can spend more time with Jesus this coming year by calling our office and speaking with Betty. She will refer you to our All Saints Adoration Ministry.

Marymount Hermitage



I was able to spend a good week at Marymount Hermitage in Mesa, Idaho, along with overnights coming and going at Duchovny Dom Byzantine Monastery in Weston, Oregon. Both are glorious places of retreat and prayer. The high desert of Marymount calls one to purification by the Lord. As He says in Hosea 2:14,

Therefore, behold I will allure her, and will lead her into the wilderness:
And I will speak to her heart.

God leads us at times into a wilderness, both literally and through trials that we suffer. This is critical for the spiritual life to grow. Of course we want comfort, but always comfortable means never growing. In fact, it would mean stagnation and decline. Our society is suffering something like this. Prosperity eventually brings with it power, prestige, and corruption. The mortification of internal and external deserts can wake up the soul to new life and new dependence on God. Let us pray for such fulfillment.

Distribution of Holy Eucharist

Our registration process for attending Mass at St Stephen's has changed. Both weekend Masses and weekday Mass registration are conducted via a simple new, online form. St. Stephen the Martyr is Opening the Grounds

Our Church is closed most hours of the week in communion with the Archbishop's directives. We do have the Church OPEN for PRIVATE PRAYER on Wednesday from 7:30pm - 9pm. IMPORTANT NOTE: There is no longer an open prayer time on Sunday.

We are gradually reopening our adoration program one hour at a time. All this is being done with "best practices"; which means physical distance/handwashing/face masks. We ARE able to provide the Sacraments of Anointing, Confession and Holy Communion whenever possible. Call the office at 253-631-1940 ext 100 for information on how to access Sacraments.

Parish Offices are closed for now, but accepting phone calls 9:00 AM - 5:00 PM, Monday through Friday. We are available for you, so don't hesitate to call! Staff are working from home most of the week, but will be checking emails and phone calls left on their office phones. Distribution of Holy Eucharist following Masses - Communion is offered in the Church plaza (near front doors) one hour following the start time of weekday Masses. Monday – Thursday 6:30 PM Mass, distribution at 7:30 PM; Friday & Saturday 8:30 AM Mass, distribution at 9:30 AM. Sunday distribution at 12:30 PM.

Reconciliation and Anointing of the Sick will be available only through appointment. Contact the main office at 253-631-1940. If your loved one is in need of anointing, please call the St. Stephens parish office to make arrangements for Fr. Ed or Fr. Jockim to visit. If the person in need of anointing has or is suspected of having COVID-19, we will assist you in connecting with one of the dedicated Priests the Archdiocese has commissioned to administer sacraments to COVID-19 patients.




