### *...I will draw everyone to myself.*

Jesus is drawing us to Himself. Are we cooperating with this draw, this Divine magnetism? Each and every day, really every moment, the Holy Spirit is attempting to lead us deeper into the Father's love. To surrender to such love, we need to be aware of the forces both within ourselves as well as outside of ourselves that would lead us away from the orbit of God.

Lent is a special time to assess the influence the flesh, the world, and the devil have on my life. Fr. Bill Watson's Examen Prayer is a perfect tool to help me grow in the habit of reading my spiritual life, both in its healthy and consoling aspects, as well as the destructive and desolating aspects. If we condensed his 40 Weeks program down to 5 words they would be:

### **CREATION - PRESENCE - MEMORY - MERCY - ETERNITY**

Fifteen minutes a day with these words and the spontaneous prayer they inspire will change your life. Please consider this prayer tool as we fast approach the Passion of Our Lord and Holy Week.

### **Vaccines?**

Bishop Mueggenborg has written a letter in the Northwest Catholic to clarify the Church's position on vaccines. I include some excerpts here:

*To expedite the return to normal life through so-called "herd immunity," we are encouraged to vaccinate. There are ethical, medical, and moral ramifications to both sides of that decision.*

#### **What are the ethical and moral concerns about vaccines?**

*Cells from two fetuses aborted more than 40 years ago have sometimes been used in the design, development, testing or production phases of various vaccines over the years. This is a morally repugnant and scientifically unnecessary practice. Every Catholic has the duty to protest this practice and request the ethical design, development, and production of vaccines.*

#### **Knowing all this, are vaccines morally acceptable for Catholics?**

*Yes. The Vatican's Congregation for the Doctrine of Faith has said that "when ethically irreproachable COVID-19 vaccines are not available ... it is morally acceptable to receive COVID-19 vaccines that have used cell lines from aborted fetuses in their research and production process." In the context of the grave danger posed by the pandemic, the CDF adds, "all vaccinations recognized as clinically safe and effective can be used in good conscience with the certain knowledge that the use of such vaccines does not constitute formal cooperation with the abortion from which the cells used in production of the vaccines derive."*

#### **Then is it a sin not to receive the vaccine?**

*Not necessarily. The Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith notes that vaccination must be voluntary. A Catholic can, in good conscience, elect not to receive a vaccine. At the same time, as I mentioned at the outset, there are a growing number of deaths from the COVID-19 pandemic, either directly from the virus or from associated consequences like reduced access to medical care, loss of work, suicide, and domestic violence.*

At the same time, note that Bishop Mueggenborg says that it is a **duty** to protest the ethical issue with these vaccines. Here is a sample letter from the National Catholic Bioethics Center with addresses following:

Dear

*I am (or We are) writing to thank you for the outstanding work \_\_\_\_\_ (company) has done in vaccine research and development. I, along with millions of Americans, appreciate and support your ongoing efforts to develop effective, safe and widely available vaccines against serious, potentially fatal, infectious diseases.*

*However, I — along with many Americans — must also strenuously object to the unethical and unnecessary use of tissue, cells, or cell lines derived from voluntary abortions or human embryos in vaccine design, development, or production.*

*While many will consent to receiving such morally tainted vaccines for the common good, we do so under duress due to their association with the exploitation of innocent human life, no matter how remote.*

*As a nation, we must all work to restore the fundamental principle that the dignity of every human life must be defended from its inception to natural death. This duty is particularly significant for the pharmaceutical industry, whose mission is to safeguard life and health without compromising fundamental ethical standards.*

*I implore you to work expeditiously toward the goal of developing safe and effective vaccines for the welfare of all without human exploitation, and thereby avoid placing anyone in the position of having to choose between being vaccinated against a serious disease or violating his or her conscience.*






