“Come, have breakfast.”

Jesus, in His resurrected humanity, wants us to eat with Him. He invites our humanity to become one with Him in the fullness of His Divinity and humanity. We believe, by definition, that Jesus is fully human and Divine. At Chalcedon, 451, our articulation of the faith declared:

Following the holy Fathers, we unanimously teach and confess one and the same Son, our Lord Jesus Christ: the same perfect in divinity and perfect in humanity, the same truly God and truly man, composed of rational soul and body; consubstantial with the Father as to his divinity and consubstantial with us as to his humanity; “like us in all things but sin”. He was begotten from the Father before all ages as to his divinity and in these last days, for us and for our salvation, was born as to his humanity of the virgin Mary, the Mother of God.

We confess that one and the same Christ, Lord, and only-begotten Son, is to be acknowledged in two natures without confusion, change, division or separation. The distinction between the natures was never abolished by their union, but rather the character proper to each of the two natures was preserved as they came together in one person (prosopon) and one hypostasis.

All this initiative of God is meant to join us sacramentally to Himself; Father, Son and Holy Spirit. This is what we might call a third form of consubstantiality. “Consubstantial” is the more direct translation from the Latin of what we used to say, “one in being with”. It means to share the same nature. Jesus has the same Divine nature as the Father.

The Greek word used at Nicea to define this is homoousios. As said above, the second form of consubstantiality is Jesus sharing our human nature. This is the Incarnation where He became fully human. Let’s take that one step further, especially with our parish mission coming next week on “Living a Eucharistic Life”. Jesus, by giving us His total self, Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity in the Holy Eucharist, makes us one substance with Him and the Father in the Holy Spirit. This is what Eastern Christianity calls “divinization.”

This does not mean that we become fully divine in our nature, as if we lose our human nature, but we are joined to Jesus’ divinity by participation. We become one with God. Our humanity is being elevated, divinized, or as we say in the west, sanctified, made holy as God is holy. This can only be done by God’s grace and our free cooperation. Fr. Lane, our parish mission preacher, will be speaking to this miracle of love that transforms us into saints. After baptism, the Holy Eucharist is the main nourishment for those willing to be sanctified.

Beyond the Mass, we have a growing Adoration ministry here at St. Stephens. As of this writing, we have 131 of 156 available hours covered by committed adorers. (Of the 168 hours in a week, Mass is scheduled for 11 hours per week and we have one hour for cleaning.) I’m hoping to fill these remaining 25 hours by Corpus Christi (June 19th), so that we can have Perpetual Adoration here at St. Stephens. Wouldn’t you like an hour of just you and Jesus? Granted, others may come and go from the chapel, but when you commit to an hour, there is a special grace given to the adorer. Let us pray for this great grace for our parish. Here are a few quotes encouraging adoration of the Blessed Sacrament:

“The best the surest and the most effective way of establishing everlasting PEACE on the face of the earth is through the great power of Perpetual Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament.” (St. John Paul II)

“The best time you will spend on earth is the time you spend with your best Friend, Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament” (St. Teresa of Calcutta).

“At night, the prisoners would take turns for adoration. With His silent Presence, the Eucharistic Jesus helped us in unimaginable ways. Many Christians returned to a fervent faith-life . . . Even Buddhists and other non-Christians came to faith. The strength of Jesus’ love was irresistible” (Vietnamese Cardinal Francois-Xavier Nguyen Van Thuan, imprisoned for 13 years).

Join all the saints in adoring Our Lord Jesus Christ!!!




