He Is the Head of the Body, the Church

Jesus is coming. Will He find the Church ready when He comes? We don't know when this will occur, so there is a danger of putting off our preparations. When we have a date for an event, we can do providential planning with deadlines and goals. In the case of Christ's return, we should prepare to be ready today. Let's get ready.

God is love. This truth gives us a constant standard of evaluation as to whether we have truly made Christ the King over our lives. We believe He is "head of the body, the Church," which is true for that collection of Christians who allow themselves to be governed by the Holy Spirit. To some extent, however, we can be corrupted and compromised by sin. We have seen the disaster when priests and bishops go astray. They neither represent God nor the true and holy Church. They have abused their position, and caused great harm and scandal.

We must do penance to make reparations for such sins, as well as our own. God's grace is capable of healing the Church and all those souls affected by the sins of Her members. The more wholeheartedly we turn to Christ and turn over our lives to Him, the more we begin to shine with the light of His glory. We begin to accomplish our parish vision, "Sharing the Transforming Light of Christ."

I share in brief a little meeting method I have begun to use with staff and ministry groups. It's a method meant to turn over the parish to Christ for His governance. I call it the Bethany Method:

...only one thing is necessary

Listen *Share* *Resolve*

✦ Listen (Take 30 minutes in Church with Jesus)

Lord, teach us to pray...

I want to introduce to you a contemplative method of meeting together. The Vatican II document says, "The Church acts from her contemplation." This involves first listening to God before we act. Once we have listened, then we will share what we have heard. Finally, we'll attempt to make a resolution based on what we have heard.

Listening means sitting in God's Sacramental Presence in the Blessed Sacrament, silently without any agenda. We will read the Gospel for this coming Sunday which is very appropriate. (Lord, teach us to pray!) "Speak Lord, your servant is listening," vs. "Listen Lord, your servant is speaking."

Write: For our purpose of meeting together and moving forward together, please write down what you may have heard in prayer. Write down any thoughts that grabbed your attention. Did you notice any strong feelings? Did any desires arise within you? If you heard nothing, do not worry. Silence is enough.

Resting (Contemplation): If, at any time, you feel drawn to simply rest in the awareness of God's loving presence, let yourself do so. In this Contemplative prayer, remain in loving silence as long as you feel comfortable, perhaps using a simple word or phrase from the Scripture passage to help deepen your openness to rest in God. Contemplation is pure receptivity. You don't have to do anything. (Jesus, you take care of EVERYTHING!) This is a prayer of your heart that is dwelling in God's presence. The mind and lips are at rest as you simply gaze at God as your heart is becoming one with God. Imagine God lovingly looking at you and you lovingly looking at God, just as we in silence would look at our Beloved spouse, friend, or child, with no words being exchanged.

Sharing Time: As you sit in this quiet gaze, what feelings come up for you—love, healing, etc., or a sense of what God is calling you to in your ministry or mission in your life? Or use what you heard God telling you during your Meditation. Write down what you have reflected on, put it in the Notebook provided in Church. Again, if you heard nothing, that's OK, God leads us through the desert.

✦ Large Group Sharing Time (25-30 Minutes): We will discuss Staff's Reflections during Sharing and put them on a White Board.

Resolution Time: (25-30 Minutes): After the Large Group Sharing Time we will look and discern if there is a common thread(s) or pattern of words or phrases that points to what God is telling us as a Group we should pursue as a Resolution or two for our Ministry/Parish.


About Chris Hall
