**You are the salt of the earth...
...But if salt loses its taste, with what can it be seasoned?
It is no longer good for anything, but to be thrown out and trampled underfoot.”**

Are you feeling salty? Catholic Christians should be transforming the world rather than the other way around. Meals can be judged as too salty or bland or just right. The world is on the bland side after years of what is called “beige” Catholicism. We are neither hot nor cold, therefore we risk what Jesus said in Revelation, “So, because you are lukewarm, and neither cold nor hot, I am about to spit you out of my mouth.” (Rev 3:16)

Bl. Antonio Rosmini (1797 – 1855) comments on this reality in his Five Wounds of the Church,

...the gospel was intended to save all mankind...it needed to oversee human development according to a beneficial law of progressive improvement; it needed to relate with men and women and unfold itself as they developed. In this way, it would take its place in the societies they formed, regenerating and saving every human association – family, nation, mankind itself – after saving individuals.

Rosmini saw the Church crumbling and Her influence over European society devolving. Why was She so weak? How had She lost Her good effect upon peoples? He answers that question in the Five Wounds beginning with the Wound of ignorance of the Mass. “Their [the laity’s] separation from the Church at worship through lack of comprehension is the first of those gaping wounds dripping with blood in the mystical Body of Jesus Christ.” (This is caused by the Second Wound, “poorly educated priests.”)

If we don’t understand the Mass, we cannot derive the life-changing influence that God intends. If we are changed, transformed, then naturally we transform the society around us. Remember our parish vision “Sharing the Transforming Light of Christ.” If we are in communion with Christ, we become His beacons, His light, and His salt. Apparently, we don’t understand the Mass. A recent survey reported that 70% of Catholics don’t believe firmly in the True Presence of Christ in the Eucharist. No wonder we’re not evangelizing the culture.

With all this in mind, I’ve decided to do a teaching on the Mass during Mass. Beginning next week, February 11th and 12th, at all four Masses, I’ll introduce a teaching on the parts of the Mass, using Bishop Mueggenborg’s 7-part work entitled, Meaning of Mass. The new bishop of Reno lays down an important principle before starting:

A Liturgy is something that Christ does for us - the ultimate Liturgy of Jesus is His Death and Resurrection on the Cross. In the Mass, we celebrate this great work of Jesus done for our salvation, and we participate in it through the Eucharistic Sacrifice. The Liturgy of Jesus on Calvary is rendered present through the Liturgy of the Mass. We don't make the liturgy; the liturgy makes us.

Unfortunately, many approached the liturgical reforms of Vatican II as a chance for us to “remake” the liturgy in our own image. What doesn’t work with God also fails the liturgy. While we certainly have an effect in preparing and implementing a beautiful liturgy, it is God, working through the liturgy, that is working on us. In this exchange, the liturgy as written, should speak loudest. We should come away more transformed than the liturgy.

Finally, Bishop Mueggenborg reminds us of the goal of liturgical reform, “We must know what’s happening in every part of this conversation to participate fully and intentionally.” The primary goal of reform was that people “participate” in the Mass, “fully, actively, and consciously.” This is not mere external participation by mouthing the words or doing the gestures (sit down, stand up, fight, fight, fight!), but rather a relationship of love. We love God when we worship in spirit and in truth.

Please pray that we can enter more deeply into the Mass through authentic prayer.

O Jesus, I surrender myself to You, take care of everything!

Like you see that the walls are falling down. I stood beside it with two students, but I was afraid that it may fall on us. Pity those 420pupils who study from it inside. They are

guarded by poles. What needs to be done, is a new structure. The estimated cost is 20 million shillings. Thanks. We continue to pray for guidance and help." 
