Words from Fr. Ed

Jesus came to a town of Samaria called Sychar, near the plot of land that Jacob had given to his son Joseph. Jacob's well was there. Jesus, tired from his journey, sat down there at the well. It was about noon. A woman of Samaria came to draw water. Jesus said to her, "Give me a drink." His disciples had gone into the town to buy food.

The Samaritan woman said to him, "How can you, a Jew, ask me, a Samaritan woman, for a drink?" —For Jews use nothing in common with Samaritans.—

Jesus answered and said to her, "If you knew the gift of God and who is saying to you, 'Give me a drink, 'you would have asked him and he would have given you living water."

The woman said to him, "Sir, you do not even have a bucket and the cistern is deep; where then can you get this living water? Are you greater than our father Jacob, who gave us this cistern and drank from it himself with his children and his flocks?"

Jesus answered and said to her, "Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again; but whoever drinks the water I shall give will never thirst; the water I shall give will become in him a spring of water welling up to eternal life."

The woman said to him, "Sir, give me this water, so that I may not be thirsty or have to keep coming here to draw water. "I can see that you are a prophet. Our ancestors worshiped on this mountain; but you people say that the place to worship is in Jerusalem."

Jesus said to her, "Believe me, woman, the hour is coming when you will worship the Father neither on this mountain nor in Jerusalem. You people worship what you do not understand; we worship what we understand, because salvation is from the Jews. But the hour is coming, and is now here, when true worshipers will worship the Father in Spirit and truth; and indeed the Father seeks such people to worship him. God is Spirit, and those who worship him must worship in Spirit and truth."


The woman said to him, "I know that the Messiah is coming, the one called the Christ; when he comes, he will tell us everything."

Jesus said to her, "I am he, the one who is speaking with you." Many of the Samaritans of that town began to believe in him. When the Samaritans came to him, they invited him to stay with them; and he stayed there two days. Many more began to believe in him because of his word, and they said to the woman,

"We no longer believe because of your word; for we have heard for ourselves, and we know that this is truly the savior of the world."

- Jn 4:5-15, 19b-26, 39a, 40-42

Jesus encounters the Samaritan woman and brings her from skepticism to faith to evangelization in a few minutes. It's an encounter that hopefully represents our own encounter with the Lord. Jesus meets us where we are at and elevates us to a better place and a more fervent faith. While this may be true of you individually, collectively we would have to admit that the Church is not at the evangelical stage, yet. The trajectory is there, but perhaps we have become content to sit at the well listening to Jesus. The Samaritan woman, however, obeyed our Lord, dropped her bucket, and went to evangelize her husband, neighbors, and friends. Let us pray for that grace through the power of God's Word. Our Responsorial Psalm says it succinctly:



R. If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts.
Oh, that today you would hear his voice:
"Harden not your hearts as at Meribah,
as in the day of Massah in the desert,
Where your fathers tempted me;
they tested me though they had seen my works."

DISPENSATION FOR SAINT PATRICK'S DAY

The 40 days of Lent are a preparation for the great celebration of the Triduum and the 50 days of Easter. During this penitential season we aim to join ourselves ever more closely to Christ who suffered and died for us to conquer sin and death. As part of our Lenten practice, Catholics are asked to abstain from meat on Fridays during Lent.

Whereas, the law of abstinence from meat binds those who have completed their fourteenth year (canon 1252); and

Whereas, this year, the March 17th Memorial of Saint Patrick falls on a Friday in Lent; and

Whereas, Saint Patrick's Day is traditionally commemorated with special celebrations.

Now, Therefore, I decree that on Friday, March 17, 2023, all Catholics of the Archdiocese of Seattle, no matter where they may be, and all other Catholics present here in the archdiocese on that day, are hereby dispensed from the obligation to abstain from meat.

I encourage all who make use of this dispensation to engage in another penitential or charitable act that day.




