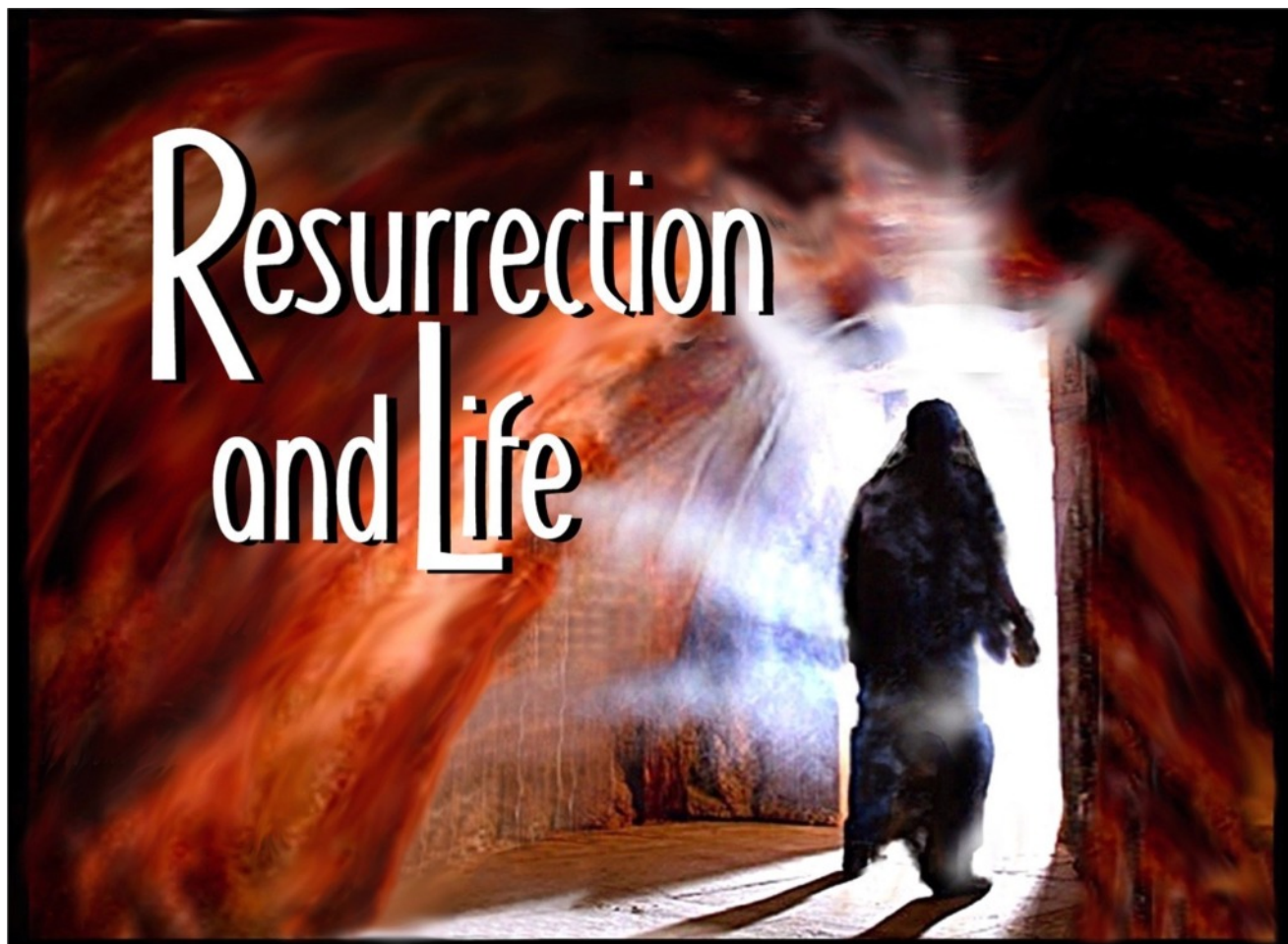

“Take away the stone.”

Gospel (Jn 11:1-45)

“Master, the one you love is ill.” How often have we prayed for healing, yet it doesn’t always happen. We wonder if our faith is not strong enough. We confess that God is powerful enough, but is it His will that one be healed? We can only pray as we ought to, seeking to do His will in all things, surrendering the outcome to the Lord.

“So, when He heard that he (Lazarus) was ill, He remained for two days in the place where He was.” Jesus was not in a hurry, even though we would say Lazarus’ dying was urgent. Jesus trusts the Father and His holy will. As we responded this past week with Psalm 23, “The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not want.” This includes all inspirations that I need today to fulfill God’s holy will. God wants us to do His will, therefore He promises to provide for that. We can trust Him as Jesus trusts Him.

“Lazarus has died. And I am glad for you that I was not there, that you may believe.” God seeks to grow our faith, hope, and love, so that we can live forever in heaven. All providence serves this ultimate purpose of life. We, on the other hand, often have earthly motives. I want to be healed so that I experience less pain, and yet, the pain may be causing more prayer, more introspection, more desire to prepare for death. God knows what is best: the healing or the illness. In Lazarus’ case, Jesus knew that he must die and then be resuscitated. That was what was best for all concerned.



“And Jesus wept.” Despite knowing that He was about to raise Lazarus from the dead, Jesus, in all His humanity, feels the emotion of love and loss. We grieve despite our belief in the afterlife. St. Augustine, in his account of Monica - his own mother - dying, writes,

And then little by little did I bring back my former thoughts of Your handmaid, her devout conversation towards You, her holy tenderness and attentiveness towards us, which was suddenly taken away from me; and it was pleasant to me to weep in Your sight, for her and for me, concerning her and concerning myself. And I set free the tears which before I repressed, that they might flow at their will, spreading them

beneath my heart; and it rested in them, for Your ears were near me — not those of man, who would have put a scornful interpretation on my weeping. But now in writing I confess it unto You, O Lord! Read it who will, and interpret how he will; and if he finds me to have sinned in weeping for my mother during so small a part of an hour — that mother who was for a while dead to my eyes, who had for many years wept for me, that I might live in Your eyes — let him not laugh at me, but rather, if he be a man of a noble charity, let him weep for my sins against You, the Father of all the brethren of Your Christ.

Jesus said, “Take away the stone.” Consider our hearts to be stones, or at least a bit stony in some parts. We have hardness of heart, resistance to grace, resistance to love. Again, we can trust Jesus, totally. “Perfect love casts out all fear”. Perfect love removes the stone of fear. We are set free to walk in the light of Christ. He calls us forth from the tomb of our indifference and the darkness of ignorance.

“Lazarus, come out!” Hear your name in this cry of Christ, who calls us by name and has identified Himself so totally with us that we are now God’s children. Jesus has won the adoption and the marvelous exchange of natures whereby we are now divinized by His humanity. We bring our poverty to Mass and receive His fullness. “O, Lord, I am not worthy...”

“Untie him and let him go.” How shall we use our freedom? Lazarus used his freedom to testify to Christ. Will we?

“Now many of the Jews who had come to Mary and seen what He had done began to believe in Him.”

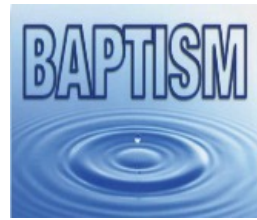

The Living Stations of the Cross, Good Friday, April 7, 8:00 PM

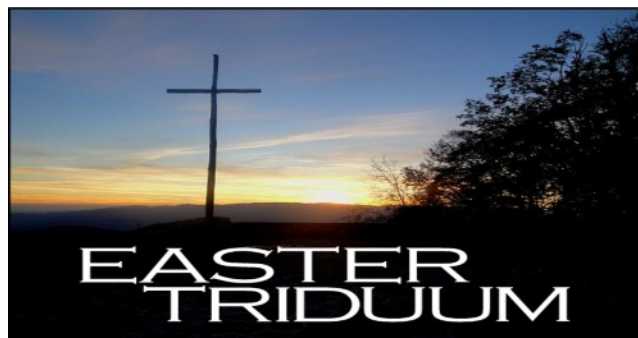

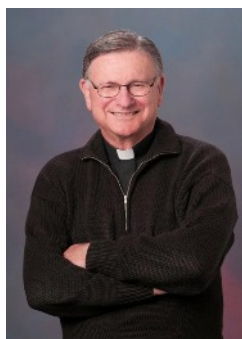
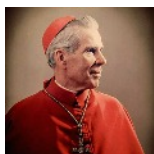

An Important Note from Fr. Tom Vandenberg

Many of you will not know me, but I feel close to you, the people of St. Stephan the Martyr Parish, because I frequently assisted Fr. Ed a few years back. What I share today does not give me joy, but I want you to know that I have been diagnosed with a stage 4 small cell carcinoma. I would not have known, had not something suspicious been detected when I had a Cat-scan to find a kidney stone. After a biopsy, a PET-scan revealed the cancer had spread to my bones. An MRI showed it had not gone to my brain. This didn't surprise me as nothing had ever been found there before. I am half-way through my chemo treatments, and am doing well. One negative side effect is that this compromises my immune system, so I need to avoid large crowds and be more careful around people. All I ask of you is your prayer that I remain strong in faith, hope and love during this time, and that you love the people in your life that need your love. Knowing you are doing that will give true joy to my heart. With my love, Father Tom
