### Words from Fr. Ed

#### "If you love me, you will keep my commandments."

Jesus said to his disciples:

"If you love me, you will keep my commandments. And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Advocate to be with you always, the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot accept, because it neither sees nor knows him.

But you know him, because he remains with you, and will be in you. I will not leave you orphans; I will come to you. In a little while the world will no longer see me, but you will see me, because I live and you will live. On that day you will realize that I am in my Father and you are in me and I in you. Whoever has my commandments and observes them is the one who loves me. And whoever loves me will be loved by my Father, and I will love him and reveal myself to him." (Jn 14:15-21)

We face another big "If" in today's Gospel that can help us examine where we are at in the most important relationship of our lives, the One that makes all the difference. Whether we love Jesus or not is the watershed of all human existence. This reality is nowhere more obvious than the Old City of Jerusalem where within a 3-block radius you have the center of Judaism, Christianity, and the Islamic Dome of the Rock which purports to be where Muhammad visited heaven on a mystical journey from Mecca to Jerusalem.

What happened in Jerusalem in these few blocks makes all the difference, not just in this world, but most especially in the next. If Jesus is Lord and God, then the Jewish Law is fulfilled and contained within our relationship of love with Jesus. If Jesus is Lord and God, then Islam falls short of the fullness of truth. (While Islam acknowledges Jesus as a prophet, it denies His Divinity.) Jesus is the Lord and we come to know this better through loving Him, as our Gospel says, "... whoever loves me will be loved by my Father, and I will love him and reveal myself to him." God is ready to make up for any lack of faith that we have.



How do we increase our faith? First, we should ask for it. As the man prayed in the Gospel, "Lord, I believe, help my unbelief." "Ask and you will receive." Second, we should immerse ourselves in Scripture every day for at least ten minutes. How much time do you spend hearing from the world about its news and beliefs? Shouldn't we spend that much more time hearing from God about what we ought to think about life? Third, we get to know people by spending time with them. Spending time with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament is an incredible gift to get to know Him. Would you consider spending an hour a week with Jesus? With your own private audience? He waits for you. Fourth, pray the Rosary. Our Lady knows Jesus and loves Jesus, more than anyone. She will help us grow in faith. Fifth, works of charity, time with the poor and those who are suffering, are a direct contact with Jesus according to His own words. He says that when we feed and clothe and help the poor, we do it to Him. He is present in the poor, and time in His presence increases our faith in who He is. Let us pray for an increase of faith in our parish and in our world.

#### Act of Faith

O my God, I firmly believe that you are one God in three divine Persons, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. I believe that your divine Son became man and died for our sins and that he will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe these and all the truths which the Holy Catholic Church teaches because you have revealed them who are eternal truth and wisdom, who can neither deceive nor be deceived. In this faith I intend to live and die. Amen.

#### **Prepare for Pentecost**

As of your reading this article (May 14th), we have two weeks left before Pentecost when our youth will be confirmed by the Holy Spirit in their faith as Catholic Christians. Our Novena to the Holy Spirit begins on Friday the 19th and continues for 9 days until Pentecost. This novena is the first novena, begun by the apostles and Mary as they awaited the power from on high, the promise of the Father, to come upon them. We all can renew our relationship with the Holy Spirit through this powerful novena.
