Words from Fr. Ed

To anyone who has, more will be given, and he will grow rich...

Dear Reader of this word.

The Lord has given you faith to persevere to this point where you are reading a bulletin of our parish, St. Stephen the Martyr. He wants to give you more and make you rich, so keep reading. Read not just this little commentary but immerse yourself in God's Word. Let us pray for that grace. I include here the invocation that I prayed during my homily from last weekend (7.9.23):



Jesus, meek and humble of heart, make my heart like unto Thine

For this great gift to happen, the transformation of my heart, I must be receptive to the whole of God's Word which comes via the Sacraments, the Word of Scripture, my fellow Christians, and the life of prayer that God is calling me to. St. Faustina writes,

Thank You, O Lord, my Master, That You have transformed me entirely into Yourself, And accompany me through life's toils and labors; I fear nothing when I have You in my heart. (1001)

How does Our Lord do this? Our primary way of transformation comes through the Holy Eucharist. Faustina goes on in poetic verse:

The Lord's Supper is laid, Jesus sits down at table with His Apostles, His Being all transformed into love, For such was the Holy Trinity's counsel. With great desire, I desire to eat with you, Before I suffer death. About to leave you, love holds Me in your midst. He sheds His Blood, gives His life, for He loves immensely. Love hides beneath the appearance of Bread, Departing, He remains with us. Such self-abasement was not needed, Yet burning love hid Him under these species. (1002)

Jesus' Heart, burning with love for us, is given in the Holy Eucharist. Like radiation treatment that uses a seed planted within a tumor (Brachytherapy), so Jesus, the Holy Sower, plants the most glorious seed possible into our hearts.

Jesus, meek and humble of heart, make my heart like unto Thine.

This is a passive process that we might hardly be aware of. Through His presence within our souls, Jesus gradually transforms our thoughts, feelings, and desires. Are we willing? That is the one requirement: we have to submit to the movement of the Holy Spirit that does not force change on us. We must give permission each step of the way.

Jesus, meek and humble of heart, make my heart like unto Thine.



This is also where these little invocations make a difference. When we pray such a prayer sincerely, we exercise our free will by saying Yes to what God wants, which is to make our hearts "like unto" His. He does not do this out of an egotistical desire to conquer and control. No, He loves us and wants what is best for us. How many parents have struggled with children who don't recognize their parents' wisdom that knows what is best for a child?

Then, like that seed planted in a tumor to transform it from sickness to health, so the Body of Christ, both Eucharistic and Mystical (that's us!), is meant to transform hearts. Are we willing?

Jesus, meek and humble of heart, make my heart like unto Thine.

The Leaning Bell Tower of Pisa

As I described in my homily this past weekend, it was revealing to see how many thousands of people were flocking to see this leaning tower (better to build a foundation on rock, Someone said), while Jesus in the tabernacle lay a hundred feet behind me as I took this picture. I think there were 5 people in the sanctuary around the tabernacle.

Jesus, hidden seed of holiness, transform our hearts so that we can draw the world to you, the Rock of Ages. May we build our lives on You, so that when the storms come, we might endure and thrive in Your love.

Respect Life - In Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization, the Supreme Court overturned Roe v. Wade and returned the issue of abortion to the people's elected representatives at both the state and federal level. Despite this monumental legal victory, abortion policy is far from settled. Sadly, over the past year, several states have used this opportunity to not only keep abortion legal, but also to pursue even more extreme proabortion policies. Currently, abortion is legal in more states than not. Our dedicated efforts are desperately needed in the months and years to come to protect pre-born children and their mothers from the tragedy of abortion. In the Gospel, Jesus tells us that we are "the salt of the earth" and "the light of the world" (Mt. 5:13-14). As Catholics, we have a duty to pursue the common good and to work for the protection of the most vulnerable. Our faith,

formed by the teachings of the Church, should guide our engagement in civic life. Each of us is called to live out our faith publicly, witnessing to the Gospel. We cannot hide our faith under the "bushel basket."Rather, our "light must shine before others" (Mt. 5:15-16). Inspired by the Gospel, we must do what we can to end violence in the womb, to ensure that pre-born children are fully protected by our laws, and to support mothers and fathers in welcoming and nurturing their children. May we all faithfully embrace our shared Christian responsibility and be strengthened by God's grace when we encounter resistance or persecution. Together, may we help build a culture of life and civilization of love in our nation.
