Words from Fr. Ed

...like a treasure

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

"The Kingdom of Heaven is like a treasure..." And so are you. Or shall we call ourselves Treasure Chests. We hold a treasure, as St. Paul says, in earthen vessels. Jesus gives us great dignity when He takes up residence in our souls. Through baptism we are immersed in God and God is immersed in us. This is what gives us our identity as beloved sons and daughters.



This treasure, as our Gospel proclaims, is worth selling all in order to obtain it. Have you purchased this treasure with all of your heart? The more we have sacrificed for it the more we will appreciate it. The more we value the treasure of Christ in our hearts the more we will cling to Him when challenges arise. Some of these challenges are being shared in our Archbishop's Pastoral Letter regarding the Partners in the Gospel process.

Partners in the Gospel

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

"I give thanks to my God at every remembrance of you, praying always with joy in my every prayer for all of you, because of your partnership for the gospel from the first day until now." (Philippians 1:3-5)

When St. Paul wrote his letter to the Philippians centuries ago, he began with a word of thanks. I wish to begin this letter with a word of thanks and an assurance of my prayers for all of you. As your Archbishop, I am endlessly amazed by — and profoundly grateful for — the witness you give to Jesus Christ in this beautiful part of God's creation. I am grateful for the lay leaders in our parishes, schools, Chancery offices and ministries, and Catholic Community Services and Catholic Housing Services for their dedicated service in the name of Christ. I am grateful to our deacons and religious for the many ways they have answered the call to serve God's people. And I am grateful to our priests, to whom I can only say: Thank you for all the ways you witness to Christ in the world and for the loving service you give to God's holy people. Thank you for your partnership in the Gospel. We are all partners in the Gospel. And why does this matter? The Gospel shares the life of Jesus and is the foundation of our faith and understanding of Jesus' teachings. In Matthew 28:19, Jesus speaks to us saying, "Go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." This is known as the Great Commission and is ultimately why the Church exists today. The proclamation of the Kingdom of God is not a task we do alone, nor is it a responsibility reserved to the ordained. All the baptized are called to do this holy work together, as one body — the Body of Christ — and whatever affects one, affects us all.

In these pages, I wish to reflect with you on some of the challenges we face today in our local Church, how we will meet these challenges together, and how, as partners in the Gospel, we can build up healthy and vibrant parish communities.

We'll be hearing more about Partners as the Archdiocese gradually prepares parish family scenarios for wider feedback. Parishioners should be able to see the current draft by the end of September when they will be able to give feedback on the proposal. Then in January 2024, the Archbishop will decide who is being united as parish families. In the spring he will choose pastors for those families. Please pray for this process to be inspired by the Holy Spirit of renewal in all of our lives. By the time you read this I'll be in Fatima, Portugal with our young adults on the way to World Youth Day. Our prayers will be with you. As the angel taught the children at Fatima (EW):

My God, I believe, I adore, I hope and I love Thee!
I ask pardon for those who do not believe, do not adore, do not hope and do not love Thee.


