Words from Fr. Ed

Have pity on me, Lord, Son of David!

The Canaanite woman in today's Gospel teaches us how to pray. A few ingredients that we can learn from her include the power of the Jesus Prayer. The Jesus Prayer is the ancient method of calling on the name of Jesus with a disposition of humility, asking for God's mercy. When we ask for pity, we acknowledge that we don't deserve His grace, but we desire it. Mercy, by definition, is undeserved love. Humility is truth. In humility we recognize the truth about ourselves.

When we ask for pity from Jesus, we are also acknowledging His authority to help and forgive us. The Canaanite woman knew who to ask for help. She believed that Jesus could and would help her. Our prayers must be appropriately targeted. Of course, all Christian prayer is towards God, but sometimes we mistake 'thinking' for 'praying'. We often say, "I need to figure this out," as if by my own thinking I can extricate myself from difficult situations. No, only God can help us.

Finally, the woman perseveres in her prayer despite Our Lord rebuffing her three times. The first time He simply ignores her. The second time He declares that because she is not Jewish, she is not an object of His mission. The third time He adds insult to injury by calling her a dog. She remains undeterred and humbles herself, accepting the title "dog" as a beneficiary of scraps falling from the Master's table. It pays to be bold with Our Lord. He sees whether our intention is sincere. We exercise our desire completely.

World Youth Day 2023

I shared last weekend a bit of the homily from our Holy Father Francis at the closing Mass in Lisbon. Here is that excerpt and a link to the full homily:

As young people, you have experienced these days of joy – I was about to say of glory, and indeed our encounters have been a kind of glory. You have great dreams, but often fear that they may not come true; sometimes you think that you are not up to the challenge, which is a kind of pessimism that can overcome us at times. As young people, you may be tempted at this time to lose heart, to think you fall short, or to disguise your pain with a smile. As young people, you want to change the world – and it is very good that you want to change the world – you want to work for justice and peace. You devote all your life's energy and creativity to this, but it still seems insufficient. Yet, the Church and the world need you, the young, as much as the earth needs rain. To all of you, dear young people, who are the present and the future, yes to all of you, Jesus now says: "Have no fear"-- "Do not be afraid!" Now, in a brief moment of silence, each of you repeat these words, in your own heart: "Do not be afraid!"

Dear young people, I would like to look into the eyes of each of you and say: Do not be afraid. I will tell you something else, also very beautiful: it is no longer I, but Jesus himself who is now looking at you. He knows each of your hearts, each of your lives; he knows your joys, your sorrows, your successes and failures. He knows your heart. Today, he says to you, here in Lisbon, at this World Youth Day: "Have no fear, take heart, do not be afraid!"





Respect Life - The Solemnity of the Assumption celebrates the Blessed Mother's entrance into heavenly glory. The Catechism explains that Mary "was taken up body and soul into the glory of heaven, where she already shares in the glory of her Son's Resurrection, anticipating the resurrection of all members of his Body" (CCC, 974). Mary's Assumption into heaven reminds us that life on earth is a pilgrimage to our ultimate destination. We prepare in hope for our own passage into eternal life by the choices we make today. When we choose to love and follow God in our daily lives, we strengthen our relationship with Him, and this relationship

is the true meaning of heaven: "To live in heaven is 'to be with Christ" (CCC, 1025 citing St. Ambrose, In Luc.,10,121:PL 15 1834A.). We can see how, throughout her life, the Blessed Mother continually chose to go deeper into her relationship with God. She modeled how to value and respect His precious gift of human life, from the moment of conception to its natural end. In the Annunciation, through her "yes," Mary witnessed to the undeniable humanity of unborn children as she conceived and carried the Christ child in her womb. After the Annunciation, having learned that her cousin Elizabeth was with child, she went in haste to her aid. Our Blessed Mother shows us how the way we live today can prepare us, in hope, to also enter into heavenly glory at the end of our lives. Are we open to God's precious gift of new life? How do we support pregnant mothers and parents of young children? Do we prioritize showing our love to those who are ill or aging? Do we care for them in a way that respects God's gift of life? Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death. Amen.


