Words from Fr. Ed



*Seek the LORD while he may be found, call him while he is near.
Let the scoundrel forsake his way, and the wicked his thoughts;
let him turn to the LORD for mercy; to our God, who is generous in forgiving.
For my thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways, says the LORD.
As high as the heavens are above the earth, so high are my ways above your ways
and my thoughts above your thoughts.
Is 55:6-9*

The Lord is near to all who call upon him. (18a)

I was recently at the Carmelite convent in Seattle and hoped to see one of our parishioners who has just been clothed as a novice. To speak with her I went to the “turn”, a large rotating cylinder built into the wall by which one can pass items into the sisters who are cloistered. At the turn, I was able to speak through the speaker box to a sister on the other side, who was given permission to let our little sister, Maria Carmela of Divine Mercy, out to the parlor to speak to me. What a privilege.



The turn represents the transformation that happens when we turn to God. He is rich in mercy and desires to sanctify us. Our readings encourage us to seek the Lord. Jesus promises that those who seek, find. It's really a simple move to turn and seek the Lord. He's right there. As our responsorial psalm affirms, “The Lord is near to all who call upon Him.” It's important for us to make a habit of turning to Him rather than the world, rather than to ourselves, rather than to deceptive habits and addictions that are inspired by the devil.

This habit of turning to God is developed through prayer. It may begin with formal prayers like the Our Father or the Rosary. It continues with spontaneous invocations throughout the day on any subject whatever. I like to use the Jesus Prayer, “Lord Jesus Christ, have mercy on me, a sinner.”

Structured prayer and spontaneous prayer form a habit of more and more constancy in turning to the Lord as our first reflex.

I was listening to some of the 9/11 stories on the anniversary of that tragic event. It was amazing to me both the blasphemous swearing that came out of people's mouths as well as the beautiful prayers. One woman who escaped the building cried out when all seemed lost, “I can't do this, Lord, you have to take over.” And He did. Another man, when rescued, exclaimed, “Alleluia!” Jesus said, “The good person out of the good treasure of the heart produces good, and the evil person out of evil treasure produces evil; for it is out of the abundance of the heart that the mouth speaks.”

What have we filled our hearts with, blasphemy or praise? Today is the day to fill our hearts with praise and gratitude. Don't wait for tomorrow.

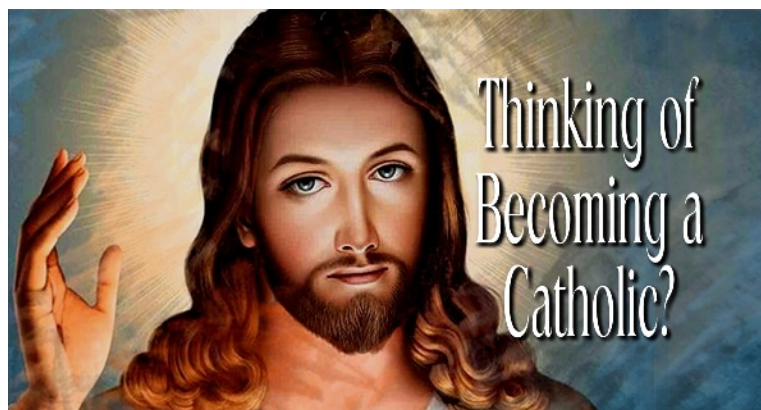

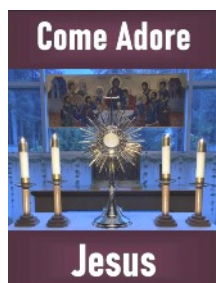
Join Us for Inquiry Sessions Tuesday Evenings 7:00-9:00 PM in Room 124

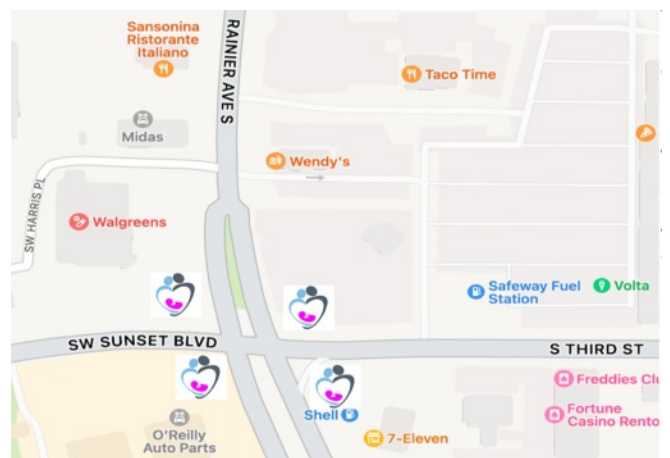

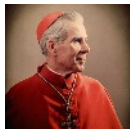

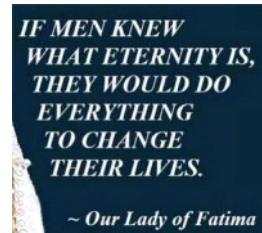
