Words from Fr. Ed

The stone that the builders rejected...

Jesus said to the chief priests and the elders of the people: "Hear another parable. There was a landowner who planted a vineyard, put a hedge around it, dug a wine press in it, and built a tower. Then he leased it to tenants and went on a journey. When vintage time drew near, he sent his servants to the tenants to obtain his produce. But the tenants seized the servants and one they beat, another they killed, and a third they stoned. Again he sent other servants, more numerous than the first ones, but they treated them in the same way. Finally, he sent his son to them, thinking, They will respect my son.'

But when the tenants saw the son, they said to one another, 'This is the heir. Come, let us kill him and acquire his inheritance.' They seized him, threw him out of the vineyard, and killed him. What will the owner of the vineyard do to those tenants when he comes?" They answered him, "He will put those wretched men to a wretched death and lease his vineyard to other tenants who will give him the produce at the proper times."

Jesus said to them, "Did you never read in the Scriptures:

The stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone; by the Lord has this been done, and it is wonderful in our eyes?

Therefore, I say to you, the kingdom of God will be taken away from you and given to a people that will produce its fruit." Gospel Reading: Mt 21:33-43

Rejecting Our Lord leads to the loss of the Kingdom. It is the same for Catholics who choose mortal sin; we lose the grace of God that is leading us to heaven. Jesus said, "Remain in My love." This presumes the reality that we can lose God's grace and are capable of NOT remaining in His love.

We all like to take security in the thought that we are good people, even good Catholics. This at least temporarily pacifies the concern that we are on the right track, the track towards heaven. But have we judged ourselves accurately? We might be biased. That's one more reason to go to monthly confession. Confession acts like practice for the final judgment. We call on the Holy Spirit to reveal to us any outstanding sinfulness that needs confession and repentance. Here is a good prayer before confession as part of an examination of conscience:

Come Holy Spirit into my soul,
Enlighten my mind that I may know the sins I ought to confess,
and grant me Your grace to confess them fully,
humbly, and with contrite heart.
Help me to firmly resolve not to commit them again.
O Blessed Virgin,
Mother of my Redeemer,
mirror of innocence and sanctity,
and refuge of penitent sinners,
intercede for me through the Passion of Your Son,
that I may obtain the grace to make a good confession.

All you blessed Angels and Saints of God, pray for me, a most miserable sinner, that I may repent from my evil ways, that my heart may henceforth be forever united with yours in eternal love.






