Wedding

Jesus again in reply spoke to the chief priests and elders of the people in parables, saying, *The kingdom of heaven may be likened to a king who gave a wedding feast for his son. He dispatched his servants to summon the invited guests to the feast, but they refused to come. A second time he sent other servants, saying, "Tell those invited: "Behold, I have prepared my banquet, my calves and fattened cattle are killed, and everything is ready; come to the feast."*

Some ignored the invitation and went away, one to his farm, another to his business. The rest laid hold of his servants, mistreated them, and killed them. The king was enraged and sent his troops, destroyed those murderers, and burned their city. Then he said to his servants,

"The feast is ready, but those who were invited were not worthy to come. Go out, therefore, into the main roads and invite to the feast whomever you find."

The servants went out into the streets and gathered all they found, bad and good alike, and the hall was filled with guests. But when the king came in to meet the guests, he saw a man there not dressed in a wedding garment. The king said to him, "My friend, how is it that you came in here without a wedding garment?"

But he was reduced to silence. Then the king said to his attendants, "Bind his hands and feet, and cast him into the darkness outside, where there will be weeping and grinding of teeth."

Many are invited, but few are chosen."

Some had wedding garments, but never came. Some came to the feast but didn't have the proper garments. Jesus says that we must be born of water and the Spirit. Water represents Baptism where we are born again but awaiting the Spirit through Confirmation and cooperation with God's grace.

Here lies the problem: all are invited to partake in the Sacraments. Many have. The Catholic Church has over a billion members. Only around 17% actually practice by going regularly to Mass. 80% of our young people who are confirmed leave the Church by the age of 25. This is a fatal bleed out, my friends. We need first aid. Can someone please stop the bleeding?

All of us are responsible for the welfare of the Church and all the souls that are affected by Her presence here on earth. None of us can do it all, but we must do our best through prayer and good works to both stabilize and restore the Church to its maximum health. This comes one moment at a time, responding to the charisms that God has anointed us with at Confirmation. (If you are not confirmed, please apply ASAP. You are missing out, as is the Church and the world.)

The easy way to respond to God's grace is found in our second reading from last week, where St. Paul tells us to:

Have no anxiety at all, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, make your requests known to God.

Then the peace of God that surpasses all understanding will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus. (Phil. 4:6-7)

If we submit ourselves to the Lord through sincere prayer, He will use us according to our generosity. We can live in God's peace, knowing that we've done everything possible to love our neighbor. Let us start by praying,

Jesus, I surrender myself to You, take care of everything.

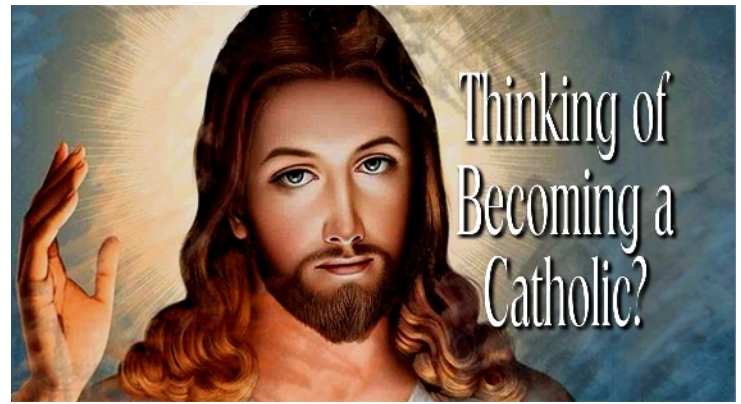

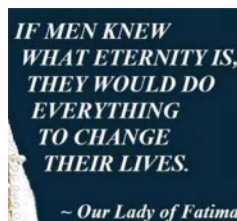
