Gospel - Mt 22:15-21

The Pharisees went off and plotted how they might entrap Jesus in speech. (Foolish mistake, to think you can fool Jesus. This isn't going to go well for them). *They sent their disciples to him, with the Herodians, saying, "Teacher, we know that you are a truthful man* (Then why are you trying to trap Him?), *and that you teach the way of God in accordance with the truth.* (Then stop harassing Him!) *And you are not concerned with anyone's opinion* (especially ours), *for you do not regard a person's status. Tell us, then, what is your opinion* (The truth is not an opinion.): *Is it lawful to pay the census tax to Caesar or not?"* *Knowing their malice, Jesus said* (The entrapped closes the trap on His trappers), *"Why are you testing me, you hypocrites? Show me the coin that pays the census tax."* (Now they're done for.) *Then they handed him the Roman coin.* (By now they're probably realizing that something's up.) *He said to them, "Whose image is this and whose inscription?"* *They replied, "Caesar's."* *At that he said to them, "Then repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God."* (But what about our love for money?! Who will take care of us if we don't take care of ourselves?)

Let's revisit last week's Responsorial Psalm for a moment...

The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not want. (Oh yeah, I forgot about that part.)
In verdant pastures he gives me repose (Liturgy of the Word);
beside restful waters he leads me (Liturgy of the Eucharist, the banquet rejected by the first invited);
he refreshes my soul. (Real rest.)

Is the Lord your shepherd? Are you following Him, or is He following you? We often our own lead our lives by ourselves rather than turning them over to Jesus' good leadership. It's a matter of self-reliance versus God-reliance. It's at the crux of every Gospel and every disciple's decision. Are we going to let Jesus shepherd us or not?

Jesus promises great things if we but surrender to His love. As said above, surrender for a Catholic means to submit to Jesus leading us into verdant pastures. For me this is the Word of God, our daily food that nourishes our understanding and love for the truth. Our minds need such food. Too often we might turn to worthless worldly sources for our information. But information is also formative. Neutral to negative thoughts are unworthy of those traveling to heaven. We want more: more goodness, more love, more truth.

When I think of restful waters I think of the Holy Eucharist. Jesus, the living water, fills us to the brim, even to overflowing when we receive Him in the Holy Eucharist. Love begets love. Where Jesus goes, so goes the Holy Spirit. In fact, when we say the epiclesis at Mass, we call on the Holy Spirit to come down upon the gifts of bread and wine.

Make holy, therefore, these gifts, we pray, by sending down your Spirit upon them like the dew fall, so that they may become for us the Body + and Blood of our Lord, Jesus Christ.

All this leads to a refreshed soul, something that God desires for us each and every Sunday. Do we not desire such refreshment? We seek it in entertainment, in diversions, in addictions. Why not seek it from Someone who's promise is sure? Let us rest in Him, our Good Shepherd. Let us give that which belongs to God - our souls, to God.

O Jesus, I surrender myself to You, take care of everything.

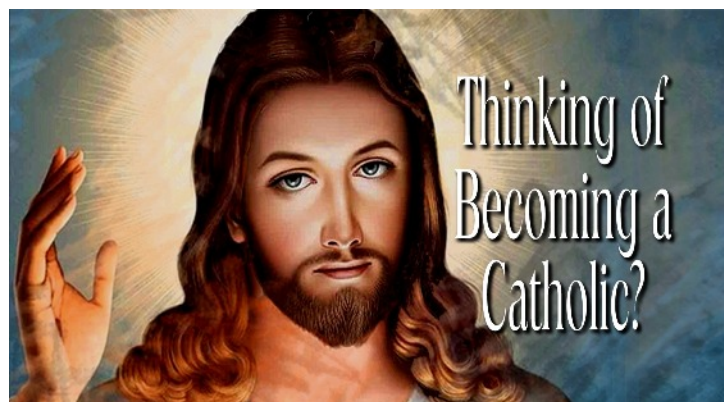

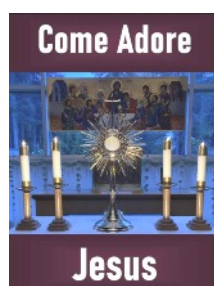

Children and Families (K-5th Grade)

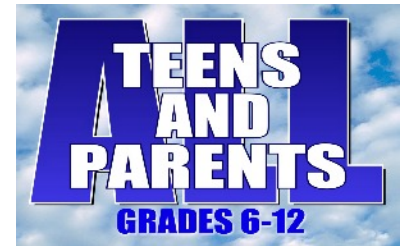

Dear brothers and sisters,

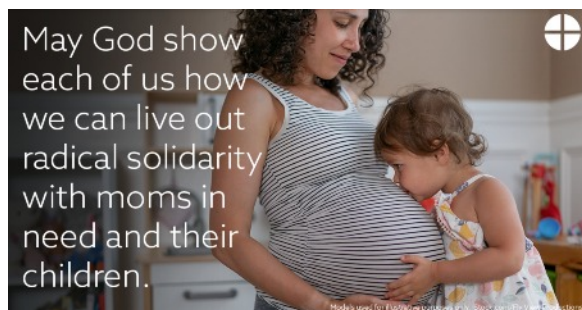

Respect Life - Fulfilling Christ's command to love one another takes shape in our practice of solidarity. Solidarity means putting our love for others into action and making the good of others our own. Solidarity "is not a feeling of vague compassion or shallow distress at the misfortunes of so many people... On the contrary, it is a firm and persevering determination to commit oneself to the common good...to the good of all and of each individual, because we are all really responsible for all" (Sollicitudo rei socialis 38). While some areas of the country now protect the child in the womb, others are doing all they can to increase access to abortion. Radical solidarity compels us to be at the side of vulnerable mothers in profound friendship, compassion, and support for both them and their children, born and pre-born. It requires us to address the fundamental challenges that lead an expectant mother to believe she is unable to welcome the child God has entrusted to her. This cannot be accomplished by laws or policy alone, but requires the continual transformation of our own hearts, so that we may recognize in every person the face of Christ and place their needs before our own. We each have our particular gifts, role, and obligation within the Body of Christ to help build a culture of life. May we work together to bring about a culture of life through radical, sacrificial, Christ-like love.
