**... do and observe all things whatsoever they tell you,
but do not follow their example.**

Jesus spoke to the crowds and to his disciples, saying, "The scribes and the Pharisees have taken their seat on the chair of Moses. Therefore, do and observe all things whatsoever they tell you, but do not follow their example. For they preach but they do not practice. They tie up heavy burdens hard to carry and lay them on people's shoulders, but they will not lift a finger to move them. All their works are performed to be seen. They widen their phylacteries and lengthen their tassels. They love places of honor at banquets, seats of honor in synagogues, greetings in marketplaces, and the salutation 'Rabbi.' As for you, do not be called 'Rabbi.' You have but one teacher, and you are all brothers. Call no one on earth your father; you have but one Father in heaven. Do not be called 'Master'; you have but one master, the Christ. The greatest among you must be your servant. Whoever exalts himself will be humbled; but whoever humbles himself will be exalted."

Mt 23:1-12

Authority is a part of human life. The word 'authority' comes from the same root as 'author'. The ultimate author is God. His creation of us comes with a sense of authority, beginning with an imperative command to Adam and Eve:

Be fruitful and multiply, and fill the earth and subdue it; and have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the air and over every living thing that moves upon the earth. (Gen. 1:38)

Notice that God shares His own authority by giving humans 'dominion' over creation.

One of the great tragedies in history is the detachment of humanity from this first command integral with our fertility and family life. Strangely, many married couples are following the example of celibates and bearing no children. Of course, there are exceptions to the rule, but the norm for marriage is to observe the natural law. The Church was very clear when She said through Pope Paul VI:

If therefore there are well-grounded reasons for spacing births, arising from the physical or psychological condition of husband or wife, or from external circumstances, the Church teaches that married people may then take advantage of the natural cycles immanent in the reproductive system and engage in marital intercourse only during those times that are infertile, thus controlling birth in a way which does not in the least offend the moral principles ...

The natural norm, however, is to be open to life. This is one of the intentions that we ask the couple before they make their vows in the Sacrament of Matrimony:

"(Name) and (name), have you come here to enter into Marriage without coercion, freely and wholeheartedly?"

"Are you prepared, as you follow the path of Marriage, to love and honor each other for as long as you both shall live?"

"Are you prepared to accept children lovingly from God and to bring them up according to the law of Christ and his Church?"

The confidence of a couple to make such intentions flows from the truth that:

Married love particularly reveals its true nature and nobility when we realize that it takes its origin from God, who "is love," the Father "from whom every family in heaven and on earth is named." Bearing children takes courage, but still, it is beneficial to the couple as they fulfill the potential of their gifts.

...[T]his love is fecund. It is not confined wholly to the loving interchange of husband and wife; it also contrives to go beyond this to bring new life into being. "Marriage and conjugal love are by their nature ordained toward the procreation and education of children. Children are really the supreme gift of marriage and contribute in the highest degree to their parents' welfare."

Let us pray for our courageous young couples that they follow Our Lord and the wisdom of the Church by bringing new life into our world.
