

### Words from Fr. Ed



Trust Jesus. He not only speaks the truth, He IS the Truth. When Jesus says, "Come..." we ought to pay attention. It is an open invitation to all of us to come to Him, to follow Him, to rest in Him. In this case Jesus is inviting Andrew and the "other disciple" to come and see where He lives. This is a moment of departure from our comfort zone and all the coping mechanisms that we may have constructed to justify our actions.



Last week we saw the magi leave their homes in hope of finding the new king of Israel. They left their comfort zones and ventured into the Divine zone of discovery. They came and found where Jesus was living with Mary His mother. They found Him in His poverty and vulnerability. They found Him in simplicity and innocence. They found Him in the obscurity and humility of Bethlehem.

This week we see disciples of John the Baptist being redirected to Jesus the Lamb of God. They had followed John out into the wilderness and the periphery of Jewish civilization to receive a baptism of repentance. Now they are moving from the Purgative Stage of the spiritual life into the Illuminative Stage. (As I said in my homilies this weekend there are three classic stages from Purgative to Illuminative to the Unitive.) In this Illuminative Stage they are going to be able to sit with Jesus and learn from Him, to become enlightened by His truth.

In the Unitive Stage, we decide to stay with Jesus, to abide with Him and become united with Him. Love begets love. Love invites the other to relationship. Eternal love invites eternal relationship. Jesus invites us all to that eternal relationship of heaven already begun on earth. As He says, when we eat His body and drink His blood, we have eternal life within us. We are already abiding in Him and more importantly, He is abiding in us.

As we enter into this new year, are we committed to abiding with Jesus? Are we willing to come and see where He lives? It will change us. It will liberate us. It will fulfill us. May Jesus give us the grace to follow Him. Here I want to insert St Charles de Foucauld's prayer of abandonment as an act of trust in God's will:

#### Father.

I abandon myself into your hands; do with me what you will.

Whatever you may do, I thank you: I am ready for all, I accept all.

Let only your will be done in me, and in all your creatures 
I wish no more than this, O Lord.

Into your hands I commend my soul: I offer it to you with all the love of my heart,
for I love you, Lord, and so need to give myself, to surrender myself into your hands without reserve,
and with boundless confidence, for you are my Father.

#### Gospel: Jn 1:35-42

John was standing with two of his disciples, and as he watched Jesus walk by, he said, "Behold, the Lamb of God."

The two disciples heard what he said and followed Jesus. Jesus turned and saw them following him and said to them, "What are you looking for?"

They said to him, "Rabbi" — which translated means Teacher —, "where are you staying?" He said to them, "Come, and you will see." So they went and saw where Jesus was staying, and they stayed with him that day. It was about four in the afternoon. Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter, was one of the two who heard John and followed Jesus. He first found his own brother Simon and told him, "We have found the Messiah" — which is translated Christ —. Then he brought him to Jesus. Jesus looked at him and said, "You are Simon the son of John; you will be called Cephas" - which is translated Peter.
