Words from Fr. Ed

The Spirit drove Jesus out into the desert...

- Mk 1:12-15

The Spirit drove Jesus out into the desert, and he remained in the desert for forty days, tempted by Satan.

He was among wild beasts, and the angels ministered to him.

After John had been arrested, Jesus came to Galilee proclaiming the gospel of God: "This is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the gospel."



As part of the Great Remedy, Jesus had to suffer in various ways, including facing temptations. Evil exists. Sin exists. We can forget this in our naivete or innocence, but Jesus and the Holy Scriptures show us the full reality of life. Jesus inherited the fullness of our humanity and all of our experience, except sin. "For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but we have one who in every respect has been tested as we are, yet without sin." (Hebrews 4:15)

I write this from the desert, the high desert of central Idaho, from Marymount Hermitage on Monday, February 12th. (You can see great pictures here: http://www.marymount-hermitage.org/) We have to upload bulletin articles by noon on Mondays for the following weekend. I'll be back by Ash Wednesday with a full slate of Masses and Confessions. This Lenten Season gives a new chance to grow in the spirit of prayer that I've been encouraging, especially with the Partners process moving forward.

As you probably have heard, we are being united with St. Anthony's in downtown Renton as a canonical parish. This begins officially on July 1st. Pastors and priest vicars will be announced by mid-April. People ask about my own status, and I have to confess the truth, "I don't know." I await in the cloud of unknowing, which is again, a call to prayer. I pray for both me and the parish.

Jesus' temptation on the mount is another example of how every challenge is an opportunity. Every anxiety met with prayer strengthens our faith, our hope, and our love. We will be ministered to by angels, especially our own guardian angel, whom we too easily forget. As a reminder, I include the prayer here:

Angel of God, my guardian dear, to whom God's love commits me here, ever this day be at my side, to light, to guard, to rule, and to guide.

Our beloved angels are ready to help.

As I have encouraged us all to turn to prayer as our first response to the Partners in the Gospel changes, I used 1 Thess. 5:16-18 as a focus. This is where St. Paul tells us to "rejoice always, pray constantly, and to give thanks in all circumstances." While entering into my retreat here at Marymount (Feb. 3rd -13th), I thought about how to apply this scripture to my own prayers. Conveniently, or rather, providentially, there were 3 areas that I wanted to focus on anyway: the Rosary, the Jesus Prayer, and the Psalmody.

The Rosary has always been a source of peace for me. Peace is necessary for real joy, so it helps us to "rejoice always." The Jesus Prayer is a method of "praying constantly," so I've consciously tried to use it more often here in the desert. The Psalmody is a natural way of giving thanks, as in:

I will give to the Lord the thanks due to his righteousness, and I will sing praise to the name of the Lord, the Most High. - Psalm 7:17

Or

The Lord is my strength and my shield; in him my heart trusts, and I am helped; my heart exults, and with my song I give thanks to him.
- Psalm 28:7

Praising God puts our souls in the right place, the right attitude, an attitude of gratitude. May Jesus guide us and our whole Church, here in Seattle and around the world.
