Words from Fr. Ed

"What are you doing, untying the colt?" At the Procession with Palms – Gospel Mk 11:1-10

When Jesus and his disciples drew near to Jerusalem, to Bethphage and Bethany at the Mount of Olives, he sent two of his disciples and said to them, "Go into the village opposite you, and immediately on entering it, you will find a colt tethered on which no one has ever sat. Until it and bring it here. If anyone should say to you.

'Why are you doing this?' Reply, 'The Master has need of it and will send it back here at once."

So they went off and found a colt tethered at a gate outside on the street, and they untied it. Some of the bystanders said to them,

"What are you doing, untying the colt?" They answered them just as Jesus had told them to, and they permitted them to do it. So they brought the colt to Jesus and put their cloaks over it. And he sat on it. Many people spread their cloaks on the road, and others spread leafy branches that they had cut from the fields. Those preceding him as well as those following kept crying out:

"Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Blessed is the kingdom of our father David that is to come! Hosanna in the highest!"

I have an icon in my office that is called The Extreme Humility. It is from Our Lord's Passion, where Christ is being mocked by the soldiers. He is wearing a scarlet robe and bearing a reed in his hand. It was in humility that the Son of God took on our humanity:



Let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus,

who, though he was in the form of God,
did not regard equality with God
as something to be exploited,
but emptied himself,
taking the form of a slave,
being born in human likeness.
And being found in human form,
he humbled himself
and became obedient to the point of death—
even death on a cross. (Phil. 2:5-8)

We can learn from this that in humbly embracing our crosses, we can now ascend into the heavenly realm. Jesus descended so that we might ascend. He shares our cross that we might share His. By embracing our cross, we, in fact, embrace Him who is Perfect Love.

Holy Week gives us another opportunity to walk as Jesus walked along the same liturgical Via Dolorosa. The liturgy connects us immediately with the original mystery. We are in Jerusalem when we celebrate Mass. Simultaneously, Christ is in Renton, or Kent, or wherever we are, because He is in His Body, the Church.

We will have a chance to humble ourselves this week by gaining a plenary indulgence. There are several opportunities during Holy Week:

Holy Thursday. "A plenary indulgence is granted to the faithful who piously recite the verses of the Tantum ergo after the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday during the solemn reposition of the Most Blessed Sacrament."

Good Friday brings two opportunities. "A plenary indulgence is granted to the faithful who:

Devoutly assist at the adoration of the Cross in the solemn liturgical action of Good Friday; or:

Personally make the pious Way of the Cross, or devoutly unite themselves to the Way of the Cross while it is being led by the Supreme Pontiff and broadcast live on television or radio. Most every parish conducts Stations of the Cross for parishioners on Good Friday."

On Holy Saturday, Easter Vigil brings another opportunity. "A plenary indulgence is granted to the faithful who, at the celebration of the Easter Vigil (or on the anniversary of their own Baptism), renew their baptismal vows in any legitimately approved formula."

In addition the above specific actions, in order to obtain a plenary indulgence, one must make a good confession, receive Holy Communion, and pray for the Pope's intentions to fulfill the plenary indulgence requirements within a week (either side of the action).

Consider joining yourself to the fullness of Christ through this year's Holy Week celebrations. We can come our resurrected through Jesus' humility.


