Words from Fr. Ed

...wait for "the promise...

Jesus said to his disciples:

"Go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel to every creature.

Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved; whoever does not believe will be condemned.

These signs will accompany those who believe: in my name they will drive out demons, they will speak new languages. They will pick up serpents with their hands, and if they drink any deadly thing, it will not harm them. They will lay hands on the sick, and they will recover."

So then the Lord Jesus, after he spoke to them, was taken up into heaven and took his seat at the right hand of God.

But they went forth and preached everywhere, while the Lord worked with them and confirmed the word through accompanying signs.

Our Lord instructs His disciples to wait for "the promise of the Father" in the city of Jerusalem until the Holy Spirit came upon them and baptized them, immersing them in the gifts and charisms needed for the mission. Having received power from on high, now they were ready to "go into the whole world and proclaim the Gospel to every creature." These three movements are essential for Christian discipleship; wait, receive, and go. Waiting in the city is first of all an act of obedience. St. Luke writes in the Acts of the Apostles:

"While meeting with them, he enjoined them not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for "the promise of the Father about which you have heard me speak; for John baptized with water, but in a few days, you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit."

If we want the fullness of God's promises and blessings, we must be obedient and follow Our Lord who became "obedient even unto death." If we want to do God's works, we must surrender our self-reliance and become God-reliant. Our willfulness can retain the taint of egotism and lose its effectiveness.

This posture of waiting for the Lord is also seen in the story of Martha and Mary, where Mary is seen sitting, listening, "waiting" if you will, at Our Lord's feet. Jesus commends her for finding the "one thing necessary." We too, find the one thing necessary when we sit at Our Lord's feet and wait upon His word. [BTW, adoration hours are available!]

As we wait, we wait with "great expectation," hopeful that the Lord loves us and desires our good. He knows what we need more than we do. He knows His own needs as well and the needs of souls that we may be sent to minister to. This is a posture of receptivity. As I have taught in the "Pirate Prayer" or ARRR, we should first Acknowledge what is happening, Relate it to the Lord, Receive what He is telling us, and then we are in a position to Respond to any situation in our life.

This all assumes that we believe that Our Lord wants to speak to us and believe in His goodwill towards us. Sometimes this requires some inner healing where we doubt His love. We may have projected our own lack of love, or someone else's, onto the Lord. No, as we heard last week, God is love. It's who He is and how He relates with His creation. Let's pray for the gift to see ourselves as God sees us.

Now after we have received the good word of the Lord, we are ready to go and proclaim it. Here we must be generous and not stuck in fear. Let God's perfect love cast out all fear. [1 Jn 4:18] One can begin in simple ways, spontaneously sharing from your conscience and the inspiration of the Holy Spirit words that can encourage your neighbor. Words of love and affirmation should flow naturally (supernaturally) from a Christian's lips. Too often we allow our families and friends (even in a parish!) to get poisoned by gossip, backbiting, and resentments. Instead of speaking to the Lord, we are speaking with the devil. God forbid!

Let us listen to the Lord in preparation for Pentecost weekend and receive a new outpouring of the Holy Spirit. Come support our young people receiving the Holy Spirit in Confirmation, Saturday evening mass (May 11th at 5pm). Pray for and join us for Joseph Tapia-Beeman's ordination to the diaconate on May 18th at 10am. You will not regret it.

Come, Holy Spirit, Creator blest, and in our souls take up Thy rest; come with Thy grace and heavenly aid to fill the hearts which Thou hast made.




