Musings from a Short Home Visit

St. Augustine once said, “The world is a book, and those who do not travel read only one page.” I felt that with my recent travel back home, I got to read more pages of the book and gained more learning. It is as if I were seeing the world... and life for that matter from a new vantage point. The word that encapsulates my 3-week “stay-cation” is connectedness... February 3 when I left for the Philippines, I was nervous because of the series of air disasters that happened that week. My connectedness with you somehow eased those worries as I knew you prayed for my safety and I am thankful for that. I arrived in Manila midnight of February 4, after a long 16-hour flight. I was picked up from Ninoy Aquino International Airport by Fr. Jay Bonete. Fr. Jay used to serve as priest administrator of St. Theresa Parish at Federal Way. He brought me to a nearby restaurant before heading for my hotel and enjoyed a good catching up with one another over a hot noodle soup. I stayed in Manila for four days to adjust to the time zone and visit friends in the area.



On February 8, I flew to my home province in Capiz where I stayed for two weeks. I am one type of person who prefers to meet old acquaintances rather than go to places. If ever we went to places which we did at Campuestuhan Mountain Resort in Negros Island and Bucari in Leon, Iloilo, they were mostly to be with family and friends. It was a nice bonding moment, too, with my niece Genevieve who works as a nurse in Wales in the UK. She also spent home vacation after 13 years of working abroad. I had the chance too, of meeting my Archbishop Victor Bendico and the priests of the Archdiocese. There was a meaningful sharing of experiences with the seminary formators who used to be my students when they were seminarians. It gave a sense of pride on my part hearing about their present journeys in their priestly ministries and how they have matured in terms of dealing with real life challenges.

One fulfilling moment I had was when I said mass in my former place of assignment. It took us 45 minutes to ride on the pump-boat from mainland Roxas City to the island. Olotayan is a sole island barangay* with about 300 households. I served in that island as the first Mission Station priest back in 2021. The place is really poor as fishing is the only means of livelihood among the locals. Bad weather for them means no food to eat and no money to spend. I can recall before I left them to come here to the US, I facilitated the application of the college hopefuls of the island to one generous foundation that helps finance their studies. I felt called deep within to help these students. For soon, they will be professionals who will be of help to their respective families and hopefully, alleviate their poor living conditions...In coming to the Philippines, I carried with me two 50-pound luggage, stuff that I gathered from some generous parishioners here. Thanks to those who donated their slightly used clothing, shoes, personal accessories, toys and chocolates. It was a delight to witness the joy of the kids receiving something from “America.” There is nothing so fulfilling as to bring a smile on the faces of those who suffer and are in want.

Yes, connectedness is why we exist. The message of the song holds true when it says that no man is an island, no man stands alone, that each one’s joy is joy to us, and each one’s dream as our own...” I arrived on February 26 here in Renton, renewed and refreshed. The short time spent with family and loved ones corroborated that sense of meaning and joy to my priestly ministry and mission here in our Parish Family #23. I see now the wisdom of Jesus when He invited his disciples to “come away by yourselves to a desolate place and rest a while.” (Mark 6:31) Vacation or rest when seen from the perspective of the Lord is indeed, an act of faith. It is a rhythm of grace, designed by God that nourishes and strengthens my connectedness not only to my family, friends, and former parishioners but even more to Jesus, for whom “all things have been created through Him and for Him.” (Col. 1:16)

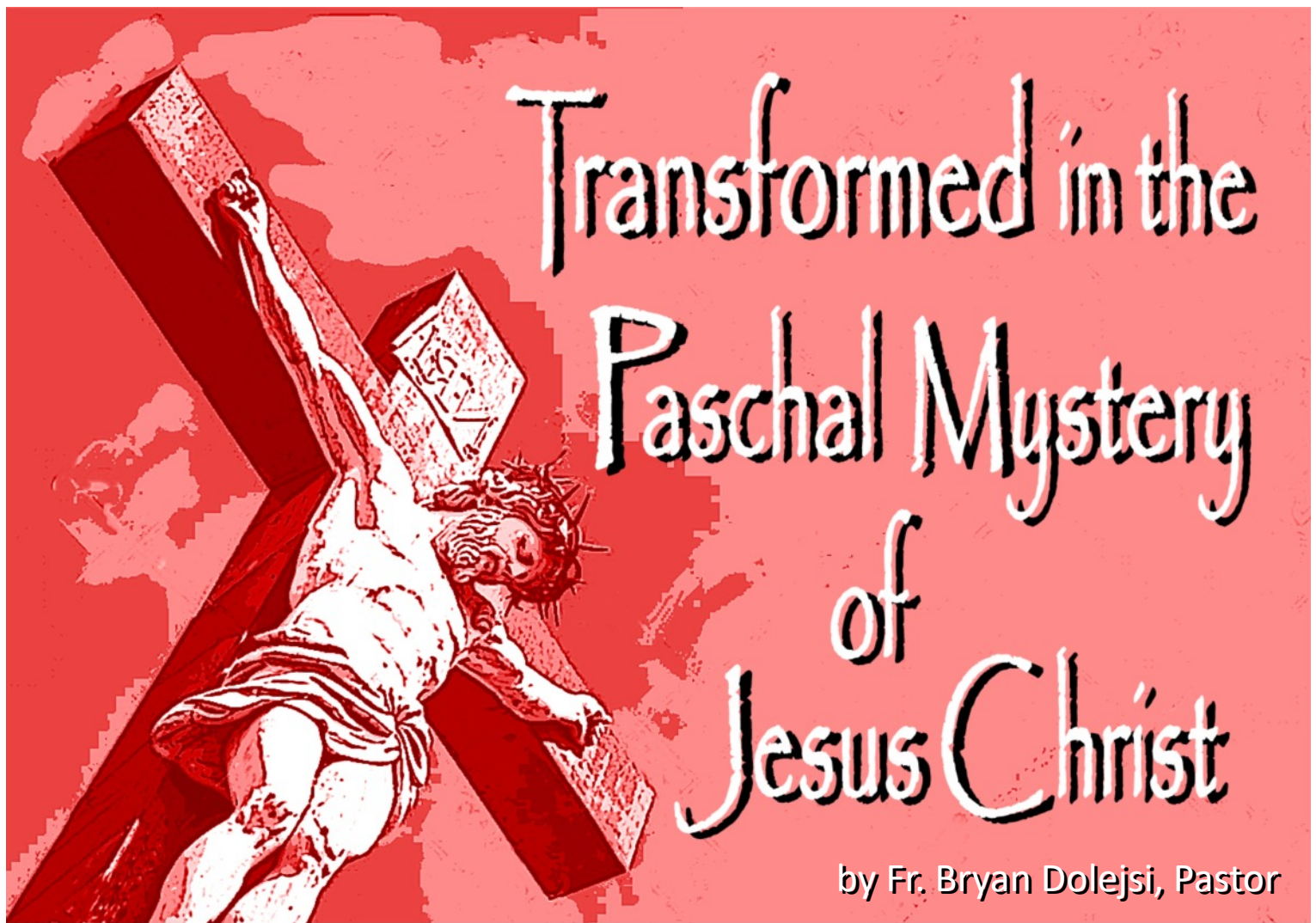

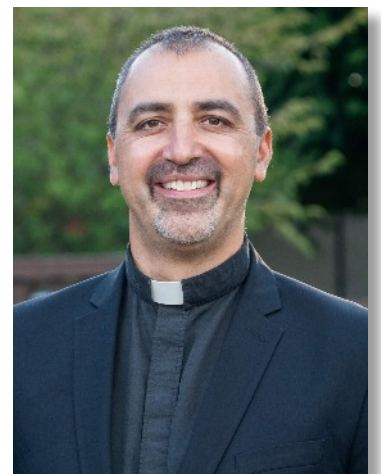
