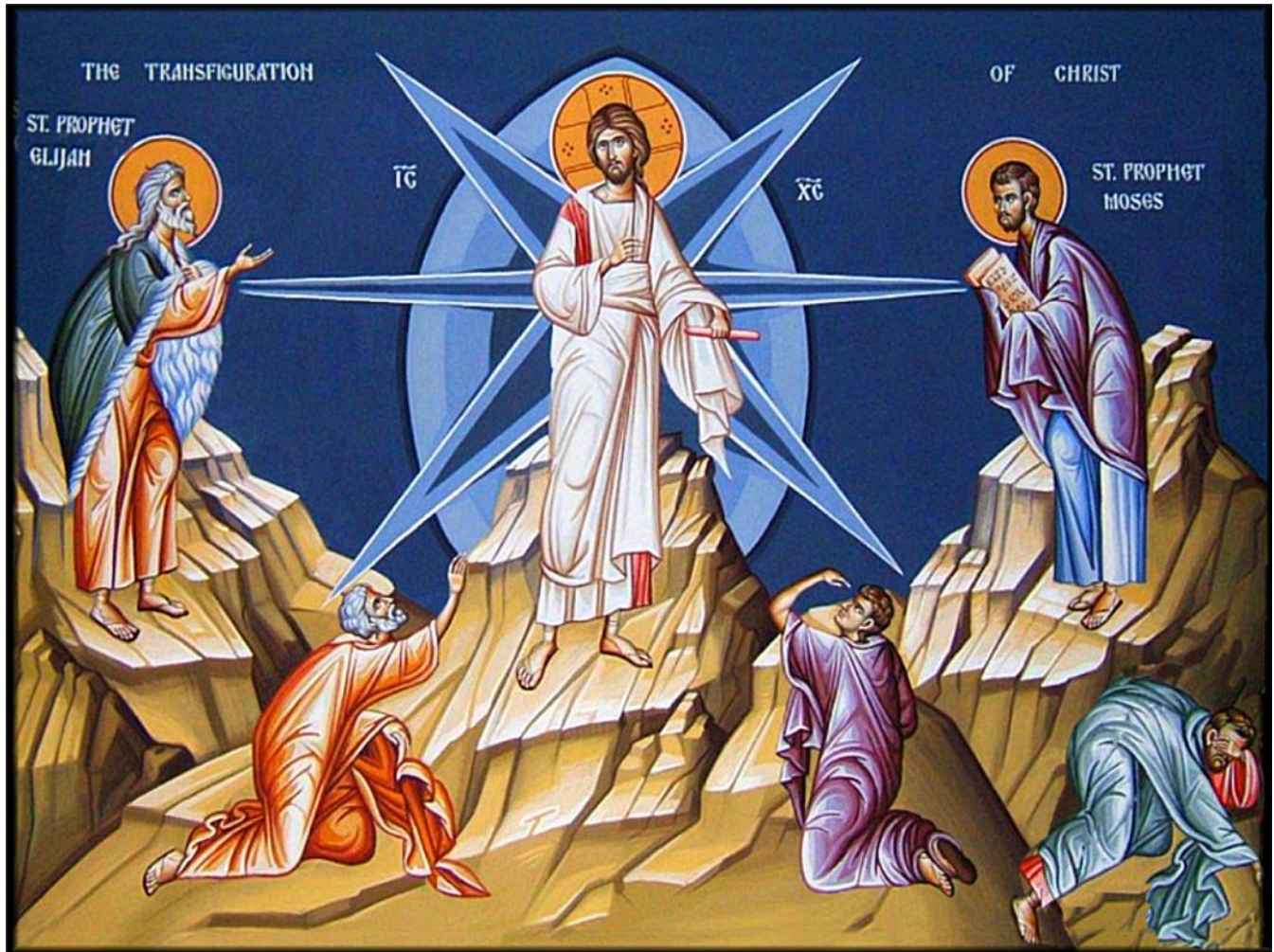

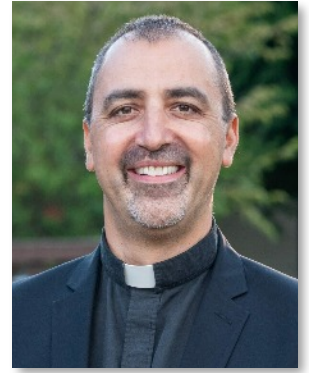

Confession

Lent is a time of repentance and striving to grow as a disciple. The sacrament of confession/reconciliation/penance is one of the means of seeking forgiveness from our sins and faults and moving forward freely as a disciple of Jesus.

The church teaches that Catholics should go to confession at least once a year unless there are other serious sins in their life. Your venial sins are forgiven every time we receive communion/the Eucharist (CCC#1416), take consolation in the ongoing way that Jesus heals you. Lent is often a good time of year to go to make an annual confession, and we offer six different times each week to go to confession in our parish family and will have two penance services in March with various priests available for individual confession (see parish media for details.)

The format for confession is simple. Do not worry if you don't remember various prayers, the priest will help you. Make an examination of conscience prior. Kneel or sit and make the sign of the cross and tell the priest roughly how long since your last confession and your state in life (married, single, parent, widow, etc.). Then confess any sins you can remember in a prayerful but efficient manner (others are waiting). The priest if they have time will offer some advice and then a penance. You can do the penance at home or in the church following. For the act of contrition, the only requirement is that the priest hears from you that you are sorry and desire with God's grace to change your ways. "Lord Jesus, have mercy on me a sinner" is enough. If you want to say a longer act of contrition you are welcome but not obligated. The priest will then give you absolution. Make the sign of the cross and leave the door open as you leave.

If you want to grow in your prayer life prior, some of penances I prefer to give are the sorrowful mysteries of the rosary, a chaplet of divine mercy, or entire chapters of the Bible such as Luke 6, Matthew 5, John 15, or Luke 15.

Lastly, for some the addictions or sinful habits formed and the availability of confession is not always the most helpful means as the cycle of sin is enabled by the presumption of forgiveness. If you find yourself going to confession more than once a month and always confessing the same sin, anointing of the sick might be better sacrament for you. Ask the priest briefly for advice.

Jesus forgives, ask him to help you forgive yourself and others and form new habits of virtue instead of vice.

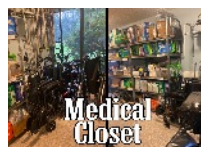
