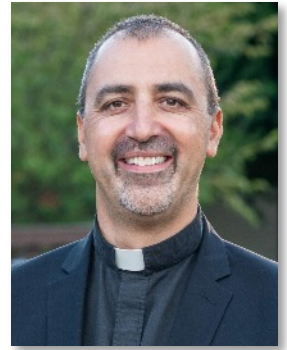

Dear parishioners of St. Anthony and St. Stephen the Martyr,

As we continue with our One Parish Plan, please review our current rough draft of our vision and initiatives. We will seek your input on these soon. Thank you to our Parish Family Advisory Council and Leadership Team.

Parish Family Vision: ***United in Sharing Christ's Love***

Initiatives:

1. **Youth and Young Adult Faith Engagement** - Establish coordinated youth and young adult ministries that provide regular opportunities for faith formation, service, leadership, and community building in both parishes and St. Anthony School.
2. **Sacraments and Liturgies** - Provide regular access to the sacraments with a priority on high quality liturgies for Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation, well trained liturgical ministers, and flourishing sacramental preparation programs.
3. **Catholic Social Teaching in Action** - Develop and sustain parish-wide service initiatives focusing on life, dignity, and the common good through local and global outreach especially for those experiencing poverty, hunger, mental health struggles, grief, divorce, family challenges, the homebound, and immigration concerns.
4. **Welcoming** - Create inclusive liturgical, educational, and social experiences that welcome all people, celebrate cultural diversity, and foster unity, including weekly Hispanic mass and ministry and semi-annual bilingual masses in other languages such as Vietnamese and Tagalog.
5. **Lifelong Catechetical and Spiritual Formation** - Offer regular, structured, age- appropriate faith formation opportunities for children, youth, and adults, including small faith groups, scripture study, prayer and devotional gatherings.
6. **Evangelization and Re-Engagement** - Be a community inspired by faith, hope, and love building trust through charity, as we warmly welcome non-practicing Catholics to return to the faith, and sharing the good news of Jesus Christ through hospitality, trust, charity, and prayerful witness, to those encountering the faith for the first time.
7. **Family and Intergenerational Support** - Develop ministries that support families, and individuals at all life stages, with particular attention to parents, the elderly, widows, single parents and those most in need.
8. **Stewardship of Facilities and Finances** - Create clear, long range capital improvement plans for both properties including regular teaching on stewardship.
9. **Unified Parish Communication** - Establish a cohesive parish communication strategy with consistent messaging, strengthening collaboration among parish staff and improved engagement across campuses and ministries.
10. **Vocations** - Promote all vocations in the church through prayer and education.

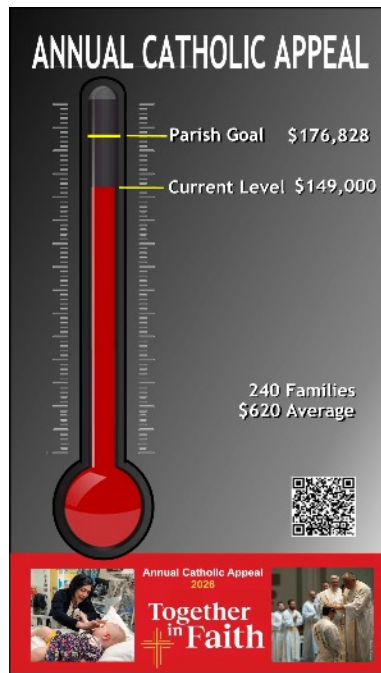

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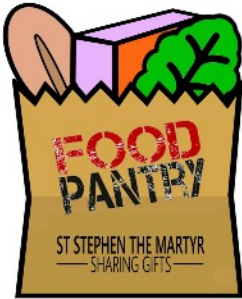

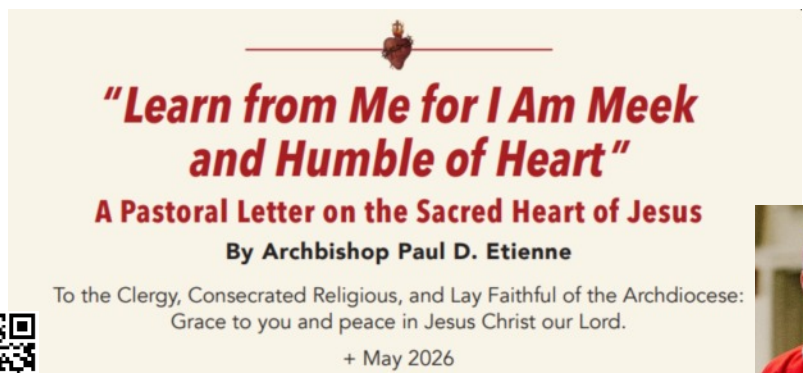
