Students who are currently enrolled at their school and either have a diagnosis of dyslexia or are recommended by the school administration due to struggles in reading can apply for Lab Services.

Qualifications needed:

- Valid Louisiana Teaching Certificate
- Experience with reading remediation and/or Academic Language Therapy
- Orton-Gillingham/dyslexia training preferred
- High school teaching experience preferred

Duties include:

- Carrying out the mission of the REACH Program - to provide superior services that address the unique and diverse needs of all students.
- Planning and implementing an individualized instructional program.
- Assessing and reporting student progress.
- Establishing and maintaining effective working relationships with colleagues.

Our Dyslexia Lab teachers must be able to work well with school administration, school counselors and families to develop the potential within each child.
