MESSAGE FROM FR. DAVID

Test Your Knowledge 2.0

A couple of years ago, I made an error in the Pastor's Notes. The mistake I made was that I used the wrong word. I wrote that David was Saul's son. I should have said *successor*. Jesse was David's father, not Saul. I think when we make mistakes, it's God's way of keeping us humble. We make corrections and move on.

I did this once before, but I thought what we could do it again. There are many errors in the following excerpts from the biblical narrative. See if you can spot them.

After they were expelled from the Garden of Eden, Adam and Eve had two sons, Cain and Abel. Each of these two sons brought offerings to God. God accepted Cain's offering of the fruit of the ground, but rejected Abel's gift. In his pride, Abel killed Cain to show that he was the dominant son.

Moses was a great leader of the Jews, and often spoke to God on their behalf and relayed to them what God had said. Although Moses was God's chosen one, God did not let Moses cross the Nile and enter into the promised land of Egypt.

When Moses was leading the people of God through the Sahara Desert, he stopped to ascend the Mount of Olives to receive the Ten Commandments from God. The people decided to make a platinum pony so they could worship it. When Moses came down from the mountain, he was very glad to see what they had made and joined in the festivities.

God said that King David was a man after His own heart. Under King David's leadership, the city of Galilee became the center of the Jewish world. Even after David had gravely sinned and committed tax evasion with his neighbor Bathsheba and had her husband deported, God forgave him. King David's son Jeroboam was also a great king in Israel.

Luke often quotes the prophet Jeremiah in his Gospel. Luke wants to emphasize that Jesus came mainly to heal all people of their diseases and injuries. Also, a detailed account of the birth of the Messiah is given in the Old Testament book Hezekiah.

The Three Wise Men came to visit Jesus on the night He was born in an inn in Nazareth. They brought gold, frankincense and myrrh. Myrrh was often used in ancient times as a cleansing ointment for newborn babies, which is why they brought it all the way from Russia.

Only in the Gospel of Mark do we find the account of the Wedding at Cana, which is mostly about Jesus' second sign, the changing of water into wine. The servers went to Jesus and told Him the wine had run out, but He told them to ask Mary about it.

Jesus chose His twelve disciples, each of whom were professional fishermen, to make them "fishers of men". In the Acts of the Apostles, we learn about how the Apostles sold their fishing businesses and donated the proceeds to the Church.

In the Gospels, Peter is quite vocal about being Jesus' right hand man. When Jesus was arrested, Peter and several others were warming themselves by a fire. Peter argued with a little girl who said that Peter was a foreigner and never even met Jesus.

From Your Librarians

Books to borrow from the Notre Dame Parish Library located in the Pastoral Center is open Monday & Wednesday from 10:00 AM - 12:00 Noon.

This week we have another book by author Scott Hahn, **Swear To God**. While Scott and his newly wed bride were in their second semester of graduate school, their friend George showed them a book on Calvin's Doctrine of the Word and Sacraments. Scott's reply was "Frankly George, sacraments bore me." His wife's reply was "Don't be surprised Scott, when you go before the Lord, if you discover that sacraments truly "bore" you – all the way to heaven!" Scott was a Protestant and only recognized the sacraments of baptism and the Lord's Supper.

He soon discovered that the Lord made covenants with His people and sealed them with an outward physical sign; with Noah, it was a rainbow, with Abraham, it was every male circumcised, with Moses, it was sprinkling of the blood of sacrificed animals. These words and signs of the Old Testament would come to fulfilment with the New Testament.

Jesus would speak of His saving work as a "new covenant in My blood" and He would announce this at the moment He established the sacrament of the Eucharist at the Lord's Supper. God makes His covenant with Catholic Christians as He did with Noah, Abraham, Moses and David using material signs: water and oil, bread and wine, a touch of the hands, an audible word of blessing.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church defines: Sacraments are 'powers that came forth' from the Body of Christ, which is ever-living and life-giving. They are actions of the Holy Spirit at work in His Body, the Church. They are 'the masterworks of God' in the new and everlasting covenant" (n. 1116).

Jesus established the Church on earth so that He could extend His incarnation through space and time. He commanded His priests to celebrate the sacraments with Him – through all time - on earth. He told the apostles to baptize all nations (Mt 28:19) and of the Eucharist, He said "do this in remembrance of Me" (1 Cor 11:24).

When they established the Church in a new place, they baptized, they gathered for the Eucharist, they ordained priests, and they anointed the sick.

"In the Catholic Church, I learned what sacraments really are and how Christ established them. I learned that at the heart of every biblical covenant there is a solemn and sacramental oath. I learned that these oaths contained real power to change lives and change history. And I learned that the sacraments still pack that power today." (Scott Hahn) Written by Deborah Harris
