MESSAGE FROM FR. DAVID

Our Foolish Pride - Part 2

The seventy missionaries Jesus sent became prideful. Jesus is points out to them the ultimate case of pride and what it can do. Satan was once Lucifer, the chief of the angels in Heaven. And what was the cause of his downfall? Pride. Lucifer began to adore himself and his great beauty and strength. He forgot that he was a creature of God and that all that he was had been given him by God. And Lucifer even went to so far as to covet God's position. Lucifer wanted that for himself. He felt he deserved it. And because of that, Lucifer was cast down out of heaven. Pride is that dangerous of a thing. Pride is the first and foremost of the seven deadly sins because the other six are actually rooted in pride and are various manifestations of it. The Seven Deadly Sins are: Pride, Envy, Avarice, Gluttony, Lust, Anger and Sloth. You can remember the Seven Deadly Sins, with the acronym, PEAGLAS.

But these sins are deadly. They will consume you. They will keep you out of heaven. And pride is the chief among them.

Jesus tells the seventy that he saw Satan fall from heaven like lightning. He has to teach His missionaries not to cultivate the pride that He sees welling up in them. They're proud of what they have done and they feel they deserve credit for it. Maybe they feel they have a claim on God now, and that God is in their debt because of their great acts. You cannot expect to enter heaven with such an attitude. Next to Almighty God, our greatest acts are as filthy rags. We are not on a performance basis here in this life. And it's a good thing, too. If our relationship to God and our preparedness for the life of the world to come were a matter of how well we've performed in our lives, the game would be over already. Because as the New Testament teaches, all have sinned and fallen short of the glory of God. Our relationship to God and our preparedness for entrance into heaven are a matter of grace and a matter of our submission to God, to do the work He gives us and equips us for.


Jesus tells the seventy missionaries not to rejoice in what they have done. Again, it was on Jesus' authority and power that they were able to do it in the first place, and it was His mission, He sent them. Jesus tells them to rejoice in the fact that their names are written in heaven. That's a powerful truth and a powerful reality.

Notice that Jesus tells them their names are written in Heaven. He doesn't say they will be written in heaven, He says they are. And who has written their names there? Jesus doesn't tell them to rejoice because *they* have written their names in heaven. The greatest glory any man, woman or child could ever know does not lie in what they have done, but what God has done for them.

It is pride that bars us from heaven. Humility is the passport to the presence of God. And humility means knowing and accepting the truth about ourselves. And what Jesus is telling us is that our greatest glory, our greatest cause for rejoicing is not in anything we've done, but what God has done for us.

Rejoice that your names are written in heaven. Amen


