

*We could use more Rosary leaders*, so if you would like join us and lead a Rosary, please call Veronica Fabro at 830.285.6492.





Is This All There Is? On Resurrection and Eternal Life, by Gerhard Lohfink is a veritable encyclopedia for Eastertide. In only 300 exhaustively documented pages, this German biblical scholar and theologian explores the finest modern Scriptural and theological scholarship on the Christian view of death.

In Part One, What People Think, there are lavish exhibits, from gravestones to the latest Hindu and Buddhist theology, which support what we read on the back cover, from Dale C. Allison Jr., of Princeton Theological Seminary. He calls the book "hugely informed, consistently provocative, conscientiously pastoral and – in the best sense of the word – imaginative."

# Part Two is, What Israel Learned.

**Part Three, What Entered the World in Jesus,** has scriptural citations, reaping the fruit of Lohfink's years as a Biblical scholar.

On page 131, the opening page of **Part Four, What Will Happen to Us?**, Lohfink says, "Now we begin the central part of this book, Everything I have said so far was only preparation, introduction, and a surveying of the terrain... From here on... we will be presenting a theological interpretation of our statements of faith." The dust jacket claims, "With his characteristically gentle but clear language, he reveals the power of Christian resurrection."

The final section is titled *Part Five*, *What We Can Do*. The theology challenges the intellect, but the final page contains these words; "We always want to be doing something. We want to criticize, intervene, change, improve, and shape. And rightly so! That is our duty. But in death, when we come to God, that all ceases. Then our existence will be pure astonishment, pure looking, pure praise, pure adoration – an imaginable and unnamable happiness." *Written by Deborah Harris*
