Pentecost

The Pentecost is the moment when everything will change. Apostles will never be the same. The Catholic Church has so many beautiful saints who at some point of their life embraced God's love and radically converted their hearts.

It is no different today. Fr. Apostoli carefully analyzes the events that took place in Fatima and clears up questions and doubts about their meaning. He also challenges the reader to hear anew the call of Our Lady to prayer and sacrifice, for the world is ever in need of generous hearts willing to make reparation for those in danger of losing their way to God. The story has been around a long time, many of us have read it, but the reminder of the warnings are fresh in our mind. The two books discussed here, really go together well.
